Covid-19 Vaccines for the Underserved

The Central South District has partnered with Texas Methodist Hospital in soliciting individuals to receive Covid-19 vaccinations. It is truly an honor for Houston Methodist to serve as one of the state's COVID-19 vaccine hubs. To date, Houston Methodist has administered more than 86,000 doses to members of our community who are the most vulnerable. As part of their vaccine plan, they are committed to also vaccinate those who live in underserved, hardest hit communities.

The Central South District of Texas Annual Conference is overjoyed to have been able to assist in getting this life-saving vaccine to the people who need it the most. It is our privilege to work with the congregants so we can help stop the spread together.

I am very grateful for every effort that was made to solicit persons within our district for possible Covid vaccination. As a quick update, Houston Methodist will be sending out a text message to those who signed up during the Sign Up effort. They will have options made available to them to self-schedule their vaccine using the link in the message. The message will also include a phone number for them to call if they need assistance with scheduling as we understand everyone is not tech savvy. Please note, we had 799 express interest in getting the vaccine from your effort, only 739 were eligible based on age (i.e. 65 and older). I will keep you posted on how the scheduling effort goes.

The Pastor's Moving....Now What?

A change of pastors is part of the rhythm of life for every United Methodist Church. It happens at some point for every church. Once a change has been announced, the goal of every pastor and church is to make that transition well. Saying goodbye and hello well takes planning and careful thought. That is particularly true in a season when we cannot do so much of what we normally do because of restrictions due to the pandemic.

Toward that end, the Office of Clergy Excellence is offering three identical zoom events called "The Pastor's Moving...Now What?". The three main topics that will be covered in the events are: Saying Goodbye and Hello Well; the 90 Day Action Plan (this covers what the pastor will do in the first 90 days of his or her new appointment); and the Logistics of a Move (move policy and benefits updates). Each event will last no more than 90 minutes and will include time for Q&A.

Presenters for these events include: Rev. Morris Matthis, Director of Clergy Excellence; Rev. Deborah Hawboldt, Associate Director of Clergy Excellence; Rev. Brenda Porter, Move Coordinator; and Barbara Kilby, TAC Group Health and Pension Benefits Manager.

Those who should attend are: all pastors going to new appointments; SPR members and other appropriate leaders from churches with outgoing and/or incoming pastors as well as staff or volunteers who manage the finances of the church.

All three of these events are identical. Pastors and leaders are encouraged to attend the first event after the appointment is announced. The sooner you attend, the more this information can help you.
