PEACE

Advent is a season of waiting and preparation. As we move through the calendar year, the church has divided the year into “festival” time and “ordinary time.” In festival time we remember the life of Jesus. In ordinary time we consider what Jesus taught about how to live our lives with each other.

In Advent, we are remembering the time before Jesus came to earth, when the world was waiting for the Savior that had been promised to Adam and Eve. Despite the pain and violence and wielding of power in harmful ways in this imperfect world, Advent is a time when we realize that all along God has only wanted us to live in peace.

This peace is not the peace of avoiding conflict at all costs. It is not the peace of gun-wielding military “peacekeepers.” This is the peace of faith. The peace that comes from being certain that the God who sent Jesus to live, and to die, and to be resurrected is constantly working to bring us wholeness that comes when *everyone* has their needs met and is loved.

This year for Advent we invite you to puzzle through with us. Each week we will add another piece to the puzzle until we find, on Christmas, the announcement of the hope that we consider this week.

Decorate the puzzle piece on the next page with your image of that kind of peace – the peace of wholeness. Use colors or construction paper, feathers or small rocks or sticks. Make it your piece of hope. For best results, cut out the piece on the outside of the outline to finish your piece of the puzzle.
