Eduardo Delgado's appearances have spread across four continents Europe, South America, Asia, and North America. He has appeared as soloist with symphonies and in recitals in Germany, Columbia, Mexico, Spain, Italy, Canada, Korea, Taiwan, Brazil, and Venezuela, among others.

Born in Rosario, Argentina, Eduardo Delgado began his early training with his mother, followed by studies with Arminda Canteros in Rosario, Sergio Lorenzi in Venice, Marisa Maranca and Vicente Scaramuzza in Buenos Aires, Dora Zaslavsky of the Manhattan School of Music, and Rosina Lhevinne of the Juilliard School in New York.

Delgado has been the recipient of many awards including the Vladimir Horowitz Award, grants from the Mozarteum Argentino and Martha Baird Rockefeller, and prizes at international competitions such as the Montevideo International Competition, the Pro Cultura Musical, Amigos del Arte of Argentina, and the Concert Artists Guild, among others.

Eduardo Delgado has participated on such competition juries as the William Kapell and Gina Bachauer International Competitions in the U.S. and the Vega Competition in Japan. He has been on the artist faculties of USC and the Community School of Performing Arts in Los Angeles and, more recently, Senzoku Gakuen in Tokyo. He is currently teaching at CSU, Fullerton, and is much in demand for piano master classes and workshops internationally.

ABOUT THE PERFORMERS

Native of South Korea, **JULIANE SONG LEE** began her piano studies at the age of 5. Shortly after entering prestigious SunHwa School of Arts, her family immigrated to USA where she continued her studies with pianist Lee R. Frick (formal pupil of Leon Fleischer and Arturo Benedetti Michelangeli) and entered Crossroads School of Arts & Science, Santa Monica and USC with full scholarships with Mr. John Perry. She pursued MM and DMA at USC with Professor Nancy Bricard and minored in KCA with Professor Alan Smith. She taught at the California Baptist University, Riverside for 10 years and teaches privately as well. She enjoys playing vocal and instrumental collaboration as well as solo and is currently pianist at the Korean Chamber Choir Society and All Nations Church, Sunland.

Born and raised in Tokyo, Japan, **TOMIKO HAMADA TAYLOR** studied music and group psychotherapy, leading her to write case studies about acute schizophrenic patients and their relationship through improvisational music. After moving to California, she graduated from Cal State Northridge, majoring in Music Therapy as well as enjoying performances in chamber music, especially 20th century music. She has annually produced the First Classic Concert for Children and Families since 2001. As producer, she has invited professional artists, accompanying many of the guest performers. She furthers music education to children and their families with her guests through conversations, performances, and audience participation. This unique, free concert is designed for all children. In 2011 she joined the artistic team of Los Robles Children's Choir, assisting the Apprentice Choir and teaching solfege to the children. Peace In Concert is her latest project. As a therapist and a musician, she hopes, with the help of musician friends, to create that moment of connection and peace through music.... throughout the world!

RAYA SADIGURSKY studied piano at Kishinev Conservatory in the former Soviet Union. In addition to solo performing, she enjoys instrumental and vocal accompaniment and chamber music. Raya also performs piano duo with Ornela Ervin. She teaches at her private studio in Westlake Village.
