CONGRESSIONALLY DIRECTED SPENDING ALLOCATED TO SUPPORT THE FUMH!

The Friends of the Union Meeting are honored to be selected by Senator Patrick Leahy to receive a matching grant in the amount of \$250,000 to support rehabilitation projects at the Union Meeting Hall. Funding was obtained by Senator Leahy as one of his Congressionally Directed Spending requests in the fiscal year 2022 Omnibus Appropriations bill. Senator Leahy secured more than \$167 million in funding for specific projects across Vermont in the bill.







2022 Events

In 2022 we hosted a number of events for our community including our annual three-day "Taste of Summer" event, with vendors graciously donating a portion of their proceeds to our efforts and a UMH history lesson and popsicle treat with Ferrisburgh Central School students. We also hosted Ferrisburgh Day celebrations supporting local artists and guest organizations, including the Bixby Library and the Ferrisburgh Trails Committee. The FUMH also teamed up with the FCS PTO to host their annual trick-or-treat event "Monster Mash" as well as their "Make and Take" craft event for FCS students and their families. SECOND EXIT, WINDOW WORK AND FUTURE PROJECTS

Fall 2022 kicked off with two major rehabilitation projects at the Union Meeting Hall. The first is the addition of a permanent ADA compliant second exit/entrance. Although the Town has installed a temporary ADA ramp, entry through the historic front doors is challenging as they are not wide enough for a wheelchair, which limits our ability to provide inclusive community programming. The addition of the new second entrance/exit will also allow us to increase the capacity of the building while also enabling the FUMH to host larger events, serving even more members of the community. In addition to private philanthropic support this project is supported in part by the Vermont Arts Council and the State of Vermont as well as the Walter Cerf Community Fund of the Vermont Community Foundation

The second project is the removal and restorations of the original 181-year-old windows. In addition, any rot on the exterior trim will be removed and painted and any damaged interior window stops will be repaired. Once the windows are replaced customer storm windows will be ordered and installed to protect the windows from the elements. This project was supported in part by the MK Taylor Foundation, The Millstone Foundation and private philanthropic support

Before any new rehabilitation projects begin, they must go through a review process with the National Park Service to ensure adherence to historic rehabilitation standards, which can take 4 months or more. 2023 projects will include structural repair of the rotted roof trusses, replacement of the failing metal snowbelt, repointing the historic chimneys and replacing any compromised slate roof tiles.

DESCENDANT OUTREACH

When the Union Meeting Society was originally formed in 1837, nineteen families came together and pooled their resources in order to build a shared worshipping space. Today, Friends of the Union Meeting Hall volunteer Clark Hinsdale is working to identity and make contact with living descendants of the original founders. Clark, a descendant of a founder, has been doing research through historical archival documents and genealogy databases. Founding members included:
