CATTLE CALL FOR REST OF TRAVEL SEASON

The Division 2 (lower intermediate) travel team plays on Tuesdays ... still remaining are 3/21, 4/4, 4/18, and 5/2. If you've already given me your expected availability, note that the original cattle call went only through 4/4 so PLEASE let me know about those final two dates. First-timers are encouraged to get on the "available" lists for any/all dates.

The Division 1 (upper intermediate) season is more than full through 4/6, but this is the call for the Thursday dates of 4/20 and 5/4. PLEASE let me know if you're available either or both of these dates. Again, I'll try to accommodate those who have played the least or not at all.

REACHING ME IS EASIER THAN SOME THINK

A popular question I get is, "What's your e-mail?" If you have the e-mail that delivered a newsletter, you have it. I send all multi-Pickler e-mails to myself, with the rest of you on the BCC line, to avoid compromising your privacy. That means you have it twice on that e-mail. Perhaps an even easier, and increasingly popular, way to reach me is through our website (it's the blue line under the logo above). Just look for the "Contact Us" tab.

IF IT ISN'T IN AN E-MAIL, IT'S AS IF IT NEVER HAPPENED. Even if you tell me you can play travel on a given date and I say that's great, you must e-mail me that you'll play, as there's a good chance I'll forget. Every time I leave the courts, I spend at least the next few hours on Pickler e-mails, travel rosters, photos, spreadsheets, phone calls, newsletter, texts, etc. So far in 2017 I've received or sent more than 1,200 e-mails. I'm usually so immersed that I rarely even think about conversations I had at the courts. However, I do immediately take the appropriate action for each e-mail I open.

TOURNAMENT SUCCESS



On Sunday, March 19th from 2:00 to 4:00 at the Wheeling Rec Center, 333 W Dundee Rd, First Serve Management will host a clinic for novice up to 3.5 intermediate players. Chuck and Dana will conduct this clinic. The \$30 fee should be paid at the Rec Center in advance of the clinic.

First Serve Management isn't just about tune-up clinics and assigning Falcon's courts on Mondays and Fridays. Find a partner, select 3.0, 3.5, or 4.0+ division, fill out a registration form (Chuck has them on the bench at Falcon), pay your \$25 fee per person for gender or mixed play (only \$5 to add the other), and prepare to have fun.

Whether you're a beginner or darn good player, you can get better with help. Chuck Feinstein of First Serve Management has been giving individual and group lessons to a number of Palatine Picklers (and some from "lesser" clubs too). They seem to keep coming back for more so he must be as good a coach as he is a player.

For a private, one-hour lesson, the fee is \$50. For two it's \$30 apiece. For three or more, it's \$20 each. Chuck schedules lessons at Falcon on Mondays and Fridays from 8:00 to 9:00 a.m. and from noon to 1:00 p.m. At Wheeling it's 8:00 to 9:00 on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Both Park Districts will accept credit cards.

INPUT WELCOME ON OUTDOOR PLAY

Next month's newsletter will outline the increased play times we'll have at Sycamore and Locust. Last summer started with everyone gathering at Sycamore on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday mornings at 9:00. After the crowd grew sufficiently, I'd send the more competitive half over to Locust. This worked well. Eventually, most everyone knew where they best fit and just reported there. That was fine LAST summer, when our club was half the size it is now.

Thursdays and Sundays at 4:00 were added to the schedule fairly early in the summer. Those times attracted slightly fewer so sometimes we used only Sycamore. Skilled Pickler chalk masters measured and lined the tennis courts so three games could be played at each location...and redid it after every rain. (BTW the Palatine Park District has virtually assured me they'll have those tennis courts lined for us this spring.)

THIS SUMMER I think we need to designate a LOT more playing times ... and have them more targeted. I'm thinking "women only," "newbie," "novice," "lower intermediate," "upper intermediate +," and, if warranted, "advanced (4.0+.")

The Mon-Wed-Fri mornings is worth keeping as is for now, as is the Thu & Sun afternoons (but moved to 3:00, instead of 4:00). What I need to know from you 80+ Palatinian Picklers and the rest of you who play on our outdoor courts is what, and when, would you like to see added to our schedule. More evenings and weekend times, for those still working? Novice with non-playing guidance from one of us who's reached intermediate status? Age group play? Whatever ... tell me. You have three weeks to send me your desires. E-mail me through PalatinePicklers.com. If you "don't vote," I hope

you won't "Why didn't you..." or "You should have..." me later. We have extremely inadequate facilities for the numbers we have, but we can make it work, if we can agree on how to maximize those courts we do have. I'll look forward to your e-mails. In three weeks I'll begin structuring our summer schedule to publish in the next newsletter.



PLAY A PRE-PURCHASE PROLITE PADDLE

On Mondays and Fridays Chuck, a Prolite distributor, has paddles available to demo. It is always preferable to try out a paddle, before shelling out \$60-\$120 for one. Not every paddle is appropriate for every style of play. **DO NOT** buy one of those paddles at a big box store that is good for nothing but bouncing a ball on a rubber band. Talk to Chuck ... or Peggy Whitlow. They will let you try their quality paddles before you make a decision.



WANT TO KNOW WHAT YOUR RATING REALLY IS?

You may know Seymour Rifkind as a local pickleball guru and frequent, tournament partner of Chuck. He's also certified to rate pickleball players. He'll do this at River Trails Tennis Club on Monday and Friday afternoons. Four to six players are required. The fee is \$25 for the 90-minute evaluation.
