HAMILTON POLICIES

- Competitive play in North (left) cage & Rec play in South ... Go where you think appropriate. If you lose three in a row on competitive courts, please move to rec side. If you win three on rec, consider moving.
- When a court clears, everyone moves east to the farthest open court.
- After your game, put your paddle in the Winners or Losers rack, in the "IN" side.
- When taking 4 paddles from the "OUT" side of the rack with the clip, move the clip to the other rack.
- No chairs with metal or wood legs are allowed inside the cages.
- If you are the last to leave courts, please pick up whatever (chair, paddle, sunglasses, etc.) has been left & give it to me (Bear) when you see me. I maintain our lost & found.

WEDNESDAY MORNING HAMILTON POLICY

We have seven days to play at five pickleball venues in Palatine. Wednesday mornings are the most crowded. Because mentoring is using all three courts at Sycamore and the elite players are using two courts at Hamilton, there are only four Hamilton courts and three Locust courts available for everyone else. At Hamilton, for Wednesday mornings only, let's designate the eastern "rec" court for competitive players, leaving the two rec courts closest to the door for the rec players. If there were two doors on the east fence, the elite players could use the two eastern courts, but that's not the case so it makes sense to share to remaining courts, with the least disturbance to our rec players.

Hamilton is available for play from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. That means there are 98 hours of court time available to us each week. It's the goal of this club to serve ALL our members. Let's not get too upset that two to three of those 98 hours are being shared with the top of our talent spectrum and mentorees. Thank you.

LOWER INTERMEDIATE TRAVEL TEAM INVITATION

From October 8th through mid-May, we compete against the MidBar team. That team is made up of players from Midtown Club and Barrington (Canlan). Participants are to be of a skill level from 3.0 to 3.5. Matches take place every other Tuesday morning at Canlan Sportsplex in Lake Barrington. Our roster will change each week. I want everyone who would like to experience travel team play, and is of the apporpriate skill level, to have that chance. Email me of your interest at <u>aokbarry@yahoo.com</u>. Once I set the schedule, I'll ask you to tell me each of the dates you EXPECT to be available. About a week before each match, I'll notify those of you I've selected for that day. Just let me know, if your plans changed and you can't make it. Then a day before the match I'll email the four men and four ladies who make up the roster to confirm that they're still good to go.

Unless it's gone up, you'll pay an \$8 fee at Canlan's front desk. You'll play one game to 13 with each of your teammates. Total games won determines the winning club that day. In the event of a tie, total points scored breaks it. If it's still a tie, then Palatine wins, because I did all the work. Just kidding. If it's still a tie, it deserves to stay a tie. We keep track of wins over the course of the Sept-Dec season, to declare the season's winning club. Then we start again in January with the winter-spring season for which there will be a new "cattle call" in the December newsletter.

Our Pickilers wear their Palatine Picklers shirts, if they have one. Games start at 9:30 and go to about 12:30 at which time those of us who can head south on Pepper Road a couple hundred yards for lunch at Onion Pub.

If you do not know if you're of the appropriate ability, ask me or almost anyone playing in the competitive cage at Hamilton to give you an honest evaluation.
