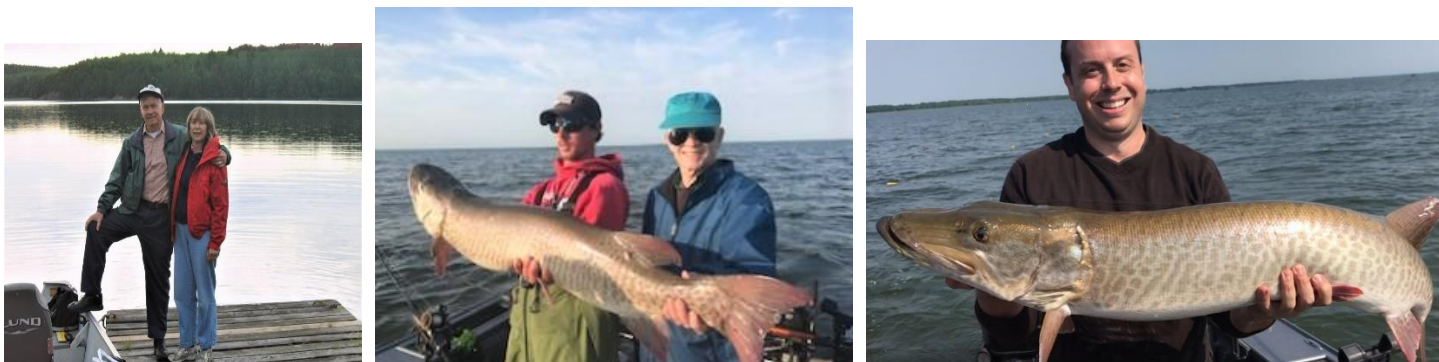

MEET PICKLER JIM SIMMONS

You may not know his name, but, if you play at Hamilton, Jim is the one who twirls his paddle and then contemplates the score before serving. He's been a regular for the life of the PPC.

Jim was born and raised in Akron, Ohio, along with a younger sister. He received a Bachelor's degree in Mathematics from Ohio State and an MBA from the University of Chicago. He and Ohio-bred Janet have lived in the Palatine area for 45 years. Their daughter Andrea and her husband Joe live in Naperville with their two children. Joe is in Information Technology, as was Jim, primarily managing software development. Janet taught music for 20 years. She is in three non-fiction book clubs now, while Jim is in two. Their son Jim is a physician in Wisconsin.

Throughout his life Jim has been drawn to physical exercise and American history. In 1968 he read "New Aerobics" by Dr. Kenneth Cooper. It inspired him to take up jogging. Over the next 34 years, he logged 200 to 300 miles a year running along roadsides, through neighborhoods, forest preserves, indoor tracks, etc. He's run many 10ks but never tried a marathon. 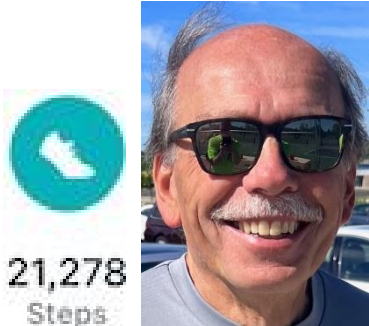
STEPPIN' OUT
