#### **INDOOR & OUTDOOR PICKLEBALL**

Hamilton, Sycamore, and Locust will remain open with nets up all winter long, but when snow-covered, the courts will be locked. Last winter there were only about a dozen days we did not play at Hamilton. That's a "cool" option for all who would rather play in fresh air. We're still starting by 7:00 or 8:00, but as it gets cold, we'll start at 9:00.

Falcon has open pickleball on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 8:30 to Noon. Birchwood has open play Monday through Thursday. I had the results of my initial inquiry printed here, but the real schedule is too lengthy to plug in here. Please check page 17 for Birchwood's open play.

Harper College takes the first 50 to arrive on Monday, for open play 6:00 to 9:00. There are 3 competitive and 3 rec courts. Enter from Algonquin Road and aim for the first building on the left.

All indoor pickleball in Palatine is \$5. Residents can buy a 10-play pass for additional savings at Falcon and Birchwood.

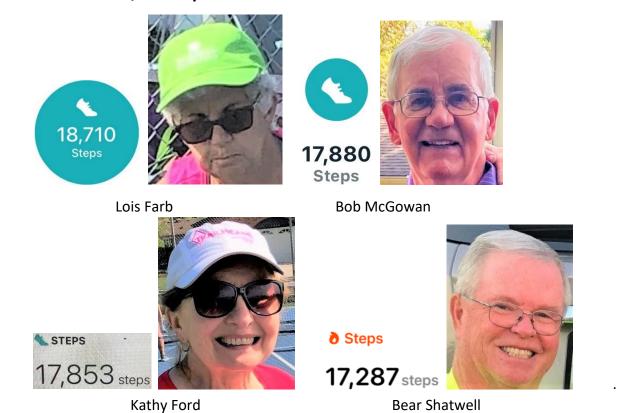

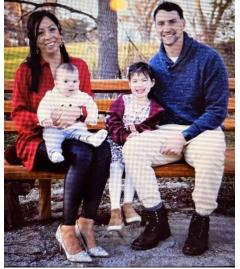
