

MEET PICKLER BILL BUESING

Bill thinks most Picklers know him not as "Bill" but as "Jenny's husband." Depending on his "level of error," you may hear him call himself Billy, Billy Bob, William or, on worst day, William Robert.

Bill was born 60 years ago in Wauwatosa, WI, by far the youngest and smallest of four brothers who were born 7, 9, and 11 years earlier. All hit heights of 6'3" to 6'5" and 230 to 300 pounds. Sadly, his oldest brother, Tom, passed away in 2013 from a heart attack. Bill literally and figuratively looked up to his brothers and followed in their path of school sports ... football, basketball, and track.

Growing up during the Packers' five world championships in the '60s, Bill became, and remains, a Green Bay fan. However, when not playing the Packers, he's a Bears fan.

Bill earned a BA in Mathematics/Computer Science from Augustana College in Rock Island. The summer before their senior year, Bill and Jenny were married. She coached the women's tennis team, while Bill served as squeegee boy and gopher. In August they'll have been married 40 years.

Bill and Jenny have four kids ... Dave (34) married to Sarah, Carolyn (30) married to Mike, Matt (28) married to Bridget, and Philip (23). They have four grandkids ... Parker (5), Ben (2), Andy (9 mo) and Callie (6 mo). They also enjoy two grandpups. Growing up his family had a Toy Poodle. His brothers wanted a big dog so their parents let them name the dog Hercules. When they learned it was a girl, she went by Herky. In 2007 Jenny and the kids visited a pet store, and a Yorkie puppy joined the Buesing family. The kids named him Herbie the Love Dog. That rhymed with Herky and recalled Herbie the Love Bug, one of Bill's favorite Disney movies. Bill and Jenny had to have their pal put to sleep last March. They still expect him to greet them at the door, when they come home from pickleball.

Bill's first job after college was at Continental Illinois National Bank downtown, now part of Bank of America. The main bank building at 231 LaSalle was used in Kevin Kostner's "The Untouchables." He had a four-month training program in finance and information technology. Then returned to his focus on computer science and took a job as an application developer in the commercial lending department. He remained with Continental 7 years, moving up to systems analyst. His final projects were designing AI and PC-based systems, leading edge stuff back then.

Then the family moved from the city to Hoffman Estates, and Bill went to work as Senior Developer for an Al software product at Hewitt Associates in Lincolnshire where he enjoyed the unique culture, as well as the free lunches and snacks. He stayed with them through several name changes, until retiring in January after 31 years. He stayed in technology development, leading groups developing benefits and HR solutions with focus on call centers, data warehouses, and analytics. He finished his career as a Vice President.

He took up pickleball three years ago, with Jenny as his mentor. She'd been playing for six months and shared tips picked up from Marv, Bear, and others. They played some in their driveway, before moving up to a tennis court. Once he felt confident, he began playing with more experienced players. His early games were at Harper, until weather allowed moving to Hamilton. He found pickleball enthusiasts to be welcoming and friendly. He really loves being able to play with Jenny. He also enjoys the diverse and friendly members of the Palatine Picklers that make each outing fun and competitive. He also finds our "polar pickling" throughout the winters at Hamilton fun and invigorating. He doesn't know how they'd have survived the pandemic, without their Palatine Pickler friends who weren't bothered by 30 degree temperatures. Learning pickleball has allowed Bill and Jenny to enjoy it across the country at family gatherings and with other, welcoming groups in such states as Virginia, Ohio, and Florida.

Bill's other hobbies include most sports, fishing, card/board games, comic books, piano, and carrying Jenny's pickleball gear. Bucket list items realized include taking Jenny to the US Open tennis tournament for their 30th anniversary and taking a family trip to Hawaii for 25th. Looking forward he'd like to keep alive the tradition of taking the entire family to a resort in northern Wisconsin for a summer vacation, taking Jenny to the Wimbledon tennis tournament, writing a book, and volunteering more.

His favorite celebrity encounter was when he was a boy. One Saturday morning in the early 1970s, he went with his dad to the office in Milwaukee. As they drove home, a light rain started. His dad noticed a man and woman caught in the rain without an umbrella outside a hotel. He pulled over and offered them a ride. The next thing Bill knew, Packer Hall of Famer Ray Nitschke and his wife Jackie were sitting in the back seat. Bill was a bit star struck so his dad carried on the conversation. Though intimidating on the football field, Ray was extremely friendly and kind in person. Ray kept tossing a bag of coins back and forth between his hands. As they exited the car, they thanked Bill's dad and then reached over the seat, saying, "Here you go, Billy," as he handed Bill the sack of coins. "It was nice meeting you. Save these to watch them grow into more." Bill still has those coins wrapped in the original tissue and plastic box he put them in when he got home.

In 1981 his dad attended the Wisconsin Athletic Hall of Fame ceremony, as his college coach was being inducted. Ray was also inducted that evening. Bill's dad spoke to him and shared that Bill still had those coins. Ray autographed a program with, "To Bill. Keep Saving. Friend Always, Ray Nitschke."

When asked about accomplishments in which he takes pride, Bill responded with, "Enjoyhing God's blessing of our marriage for 40 years and counting, raising four, unique kids with three joyful spouses and now grandkids, and helping with our church and various charities.

As for volunteering most has involved youth sports. He's been coaching for more than 25 years. He's coached baseball, softball, and basketball for several organizations, age groups, and both genders. Until the pandemic most of the last decade found him coaching 7th & 8th grade boys basketball. He hopes he'll be returning to the sidelines soon. "To me there's not much more fulfilling than seeing a kid's smile with a hint of new-found confidence, when he/she and the team score a baskets or turn a double play or strike out the first batter. Most of these kids won't play on their school teams so I love giving them their 'shining moment' that they can take into their future and apply to other pursuits in which they get involved."

As for a quote or motivational phrase he likes, Bill had two. "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourself." (Paul, Philippians 2:3-4) ... and ... "So, if you think your life is complete confusion because you never wih the game, just remember thjat it's a grand illusion, and deep inside we're all the same." (Dennis DeYoung from Styx, *The Grand Illusion*).







Oh, I should add that my records are PRETTY accurate but not perfect, particularly for long-time Picklers. SUMMER PICKLEBALL IN PALATINE

Every day we are at Hamilton by 9:00, usually by 8:00. All are welcome (don't be shy). Just get your name upside down on both sides of your paddle, where the handle meets the blade. Then stand it on its head in one of the paddle troughs on the south fence, (Hamilton is on Smith N of 14 & S of 68.) You will play with different partners every game. When enough Picklers are there, we segregate the competitive players to the north cage, while rec players stay in the south cage. We're happy to help you with your game, if you're a newbie.

MENTORING SUMMARY

We have three days of mentnoring. Our biggest is Wednesday morning at Sycamore Park (Carpenter & Clark). We serve 12 Mentorees at 9:00 and 12 more at 10:15. This is by invitation only. Just email me (aokbarry@yahoo.com) with the Wednesdays you THINK you'd be available to participate. I'll put you on the appropriate ETBA (Expect To Be Available) lists. If you HAVE to be assigned to the early or late session, mention that. Then check your email on the Monday afternoon before a desired Wednesday. IF you get an invitation, accept it right away. You have until 10:00 a.m. to do so, before you are replaced and "earn a strike." Strikes are earned by (A) not responding to an invitation, (B) saying you can't attend – should have emailed me by Friday to take you off that ETBA list, or (C) being a no-show. We forgive one strike. A second will remove you from all summer ETBA lists.

Then we have 3:00 p.m. Thursday mentoring at Hamilton (Smith Road N of 14, S of 68). These sessions are open – no reservations required.

Saturdays at 3:00 at Hamilton, we conduct mentoring exclusively for those who, due to work or whatever, are not able to attend Wednesday and/or Thursday sessions. These, also, are walk-on, no reservations needed.

All mentoring sessions are free. I have several loaner paddles. We supply the balls. Just bring water.
