WE CAN SERVE A LOT MORE MENTOREES

Yes, this is a déjà vu.That's because I need to hammer this opportunity home. We can serve 50 students every other Tuesday. Let me know if you can attend one or either of the sessions – 9:00 to 10:30 and/or 10:30 to Noon. Then you can join for lunch a mile away. Email me at aokbarry@yahoo.com your availability. Then check your email Sunday afternoons, to see if you receive an invitation for that week. Of course, if you give me a date that becomes a conflict, email me to take you off that Expect To Be Available list. You WILL spend a half hour with different Mentors. We have served several hundreds of students over the years, and almost all praise our program. Many say they learned more in 90 minutes with us than they did in weeks of lessons for which they paid. You do not have to be a new player to apply for mentoring. We have been happy to serve Picklers for multiple years. Maybe some participate because they have 90 minutes of guaranteed court time. No paddling up and waiting. That's fine. Send me your availability. We want to help you improve your skill and enjoyment of the game.

For our first, indoor mentoring on November 21st, we had two mentors for every court. We can serve 50 students per week, but only 17 had signed up for this date. Yeah, the holidays create conflicts, but please sign up to be on the Expect To Be Available lists for the early 2024 dates. Last year we ran 3-hour sessions on six courts, and had more who wanted to participate. I felt we could serve more with our more traditional 90-minute sessions. If I don't get a LOT of you signing up, I'll revert to 3-hour sessions.

Numbers of players will be limited so try to show up early.






