



NEED TO REVIEW MENTORING POLICIES

Because we're growing at light speed, let's review how mentoring works. Our primary, and most beneficial, mentoring program is our Wednesday morning at Sycamore Park. We have two sessions ... 9:00 to 10:30 and 10:30 to Noon. We schedule 15 picklers (5 per court) who will spend half an hour with each of the three Mentors. This is by invitation only. Email me aokbarry@yahoo.com the Wednesdays you expect to be available. Be sure to tell me if only one of those sessions would work for you. I'll put you on the ETBA (Expect To Be Available) list for each date you give me. Every Sunday afternoon I send the current ETBA list to Kathy Ford, our Mentoree Scheduler. She'll check who's been participating how often and how recently and invite 30 students to that Wednesday's sessions on Monday afternoon.

Warning: Do NOT not respond to an invitation, give an excuse which you knew in advance (should have emailed me), or be a no-show. Those result in a "strike." For us two strikes eliminates you for the summer.

NO INVITATION NEEDED

We have 3-5, walk-on mentoring every Thursday at Hamilton (across from Sundling Jr High). This is for members of the Palatine Pickleball Club who cannot make either Wednesday or Thursday sessions. Some days we have only 15 students. Some days we have more than 40. Let me know if I have yet to take your photo and get you into the Newbies section of a newsletter. I supply the balls and have loaner paddles available. If you're new to the sport and want to buy your own paddle, DO NOT spend less than \$75.

SATURDAY SESSIONS

We also offer Saturday, walk-on sessions, but these are reserved for those Palatine Picklers who are unable to attend either the Wednesday or Thursday sessions, due to work, babysitting, golf, favorite TV shows, etc. These sessions are also 3-5. All you need is water and a willingness to listen and learn.

REVIEW OF HAMILTON POLICIES, FOR NEWBIES

First policy: Get your name upside down on both sides of your paddle where the hand meets the blade. Then, when you stand it on it's head in one of the PVC paddle troughs on the south fence, we can call you by name, rather then "blue paddle." When you leave a court, the upper tough marked "W" is for the two who won your game. The lower through marked "L" is for the two who lost. When justified, we'll have competitive paddle up in the north cage, leaving the south cage for rec players. Newbies, identify yourselves and ask for help. Wthematical.hen numbers justify, we'll call for competitive to paddle up in the north cage. Then logic prevails.






CHECK YOUR PHONE (LITTLE RED HEART) & JOIN US HERE

PROMISING FUTURE FOR INTRAMURALS & MENTORING

REVIEW OF SUMMER MENTOREING


Our primary mentoring program is comprised of two sessions each Wednesday morning at Sycamore (Carpenter & Clark). The early session is from 9:00 to 10:30. The second session runs 10:30 to Noon. These are by invitation only. Email me (aokbarry@yahoo.com) with the dates you think you'd be available. Then put "Maybe mentoring" in your phone for that date. I'll put you on the Expect To Be Available lists you indicate. Each Sunday I send Mentoree Scheduler Kathy Ford the ETBA spreadsheet. She'll make her selections and invite 30 students to that Wednesday's sessions.

If a conflict arises, email me (same email) to take you off whichever ETBA list is affected. If you don't and you turn down an invitation or don't respond to it or are a no-show, you earn a dreaded "strike." Two strikes and you're out of mentoring for the summer season. Lame excuses such as doctor appointment, out of town, or house guests (not likely set in last 24 hours) definitely earn a strike. In case I mumbled in my writing, we are volunteers and REALLY don't like being disrespected and wasting our time due to your negligence. A last minute emergency, air quality concern, etc. are marked Emergency and do not earn strikes.
