Born in Chicago in 1949, Fred Phillips grew up in Rodgers Park, graduated from Sullivan HS ('67) and Bradley

University ('71) with a BS in Business and Marketing, after meeting Bev. They married in 1972 in Chicago. Rather than go into the family jewelry business, Fred used those connections to land a job as a Sales Rep for Speidel, the watch band company. Then he moved to Seiko, the watch company. For consistently making his sales quotas, he was made a President's Club Member. As the Midwest's #1 Salesman, Seiko sent Fred and Bev to the 1992 Summer Olympics in Barcelona. After 29 years as a commission salesman, Fred took early retirement in 2000.



Bev and Fred had a small starter home in Arlington Heights, but with a growing family, they had a home build in Long Grove on a large lot with horses behind it. Both the Phillips and the horses are still there. However, in 2006, Bev and Fred bought a mountain home near Scottsdale in an area called McDowell Mountain

Two years after Fred and Bev moved to Long Grove, he was asked to become a member of the Village Plan Commission. He liked the idea of giving back to their new community. This, as all Village Government positions is strictly volunteer. Once Fred was retired from Seiko, he was promoted to Chairman of the Long Grove Plan Commission and Zoning Board of Appeals (PCZBA). 40 years later he was the longest-serving Village Official in Long Grove's history. The Village Trustees named a street after him. Since retiring from public service, Fred and Bev spend 4-5 winter months in their AZ home.

Fred has always enjoyed being athletic. He was Captain of his HS volleyball team. He also played ice hockey until he was 26. Thinking that was old enough for that sport, he swapped his skates for skis. He started, as we all did, at Wilmont. Then moved up to Alpine Valley and, eventually, Utah and Colorado. Skied almost every mountain in those

states and meet Bev for lunch and dinner. He checked off a bucket list item by skiing in Switzerland, while Bev enjoyed the more grounded activities. They did tour much of the country while there. Fred still enjoys Vail one or two weeks a year. He checked off another bucket list item, by skiing a Double Black Diamond Run in 2018.

Pickleball entered Fred's life at Midtown Athletic Club. He was walking to his tennis courts, when he saw/heard this strange game being played. He asked, "What's pickleball?" (sound familiar?) Pickleball immediately became his daily passion. Tennis got demoted to once a week. He joined the Palatine Picklers to meet new Picklers, make friends, and have more playing options. He's enjoyed meeting a ton of nice Picklers. While everyone loves to win, Fred is more about playing well than winning. Three years ago, Fred showed Hayden how to play and took him to Canlan. As a team they went 3-3. Then earned the same result at Wheeling. Hayden will be joining the Palatine Pickleball Club, making Fred a proud Grandpa.





In closing Tracey wants you to know she is truly inspired by her kids.


GAME PLAN CHANGE FOR 2024 INDOOR MENTORING






























































































































LOOKING FORWARD TO A PICKLERIFFIC NEW YEAR

We're moving into our third year of intermediate intramural competition. It's been a great program for so many Picklers. This lets intermediate Picklers play seven games in less than three hours, with virtually no waiting. AND the post-match lunches have been loved by all. It's so much fun to get to know one another off the courts.

We're now offering 3-hour mentoring sessions to 24-26 Mentorees every other week. They'll get tips from up to six Mentors. It's free, apart from Canlan's \$10 daily charge. Lunch follows.

We can only hope the Palatine Park District turns Sycamore into 4-6 pickleball courts. That would let us serve more Mentorees throughout the outdoor season. We have more than 1100 Palatine residents in the Palatine Pickleball Club, and there are many others in the Palatine Park District but who live in Rolling Meadows or Inverness, etc. Of course, there are also surely many local players who have yet to join our club.

Glad to return to profiling Picklers. Please ask me for my profile prompter questions, and let me profile you too. We'd really like to get to know you. ALL Picklers are worth knowing.

Last summer we served 140+ Mentorees, most hoping to be among the 24 we could serve on two courts and a multi-lined tennis court each week at Sycamore. Meanwhile there are six, beautiful, new tennis courts at the golf course that often went unused. Add tje tennis court at Locust and the ton tennis courts at Palatine High School and Harper College, and it's pretty obvious there are far more tennis courts in town than pickleball courts, although there seems to be far more pickleball players than tennis players. I have emailed the Palatine Park District Board of Directors about the need for more pickleball courts. I think they think I'm the only one in town who advocates for more pickleball courts. The workers at Sycamore told me they were done working there until spring so there's still time for what certainly seems a more sensible plan to be implemented. Let's hope.

Untall ladies, you may still have time to get into our January 11th tournament. Just email me your desire. And please don't think you're not good enough. It's not that kind of tournament. It's a round robin. You'll partner with each of the participants for one game so you can't jeopardize anyone's chances of finishing in the top three. It's all for fun.
