We have only four more, indoor mentoring sessions. Apart from Canlan's \$10 fee, these are free. They run from 8:45 to Noon, during which time you'll spend half an hour with each of six Mentors. You'll be assigned to what I try to make a compatible foursome. Then, if you have the time, you can join us for lunch a mile away. Our remaining dates are 3/12 3/26 4/9 4/23. In May we'll have two Wednesday sessions by invitation plus walk-ons Thursday and Saturday.

WHAT THE HECK IS OUR INTRAMURAL PROGRAM ?

I get this question a lot. It's a fun, almost three-hour (7 games) morning at Canlan Sportsplex in Lake Barrington every other Tuesday year-round. It's for intermediate level players. If I know you are obviously above or below the 3.0-3.5 intended level, I'll let you know. Otherwise, give it a try. If it's a match for you, great. If not, I won't invite you back. No problem. It is SO not serious. I pit the older half of those playing each match against the younger half. We play and then we go to lunch, if your schedule allows. We've been doing this every other Tuesday

morning for more than two years. Each week I roster different Picklers. Just email me at aokbarry@yahoo.com the Tuesday mornings you think you'll be available. For the near future those Tuesdays are 3/5 3/19 4/2 4/16 4/30 5/14 5/28. I'll put the next few month's dates in a future newsletter. Once I put you on an Expect To Be Available list, you need to check your email on the Sunday afternoons before those dates, to see if you're invited that week. Of course, if a conflict arises, email me to take you off that ETBA list. When a Pickler proves to be too strong or not strong enough for our intended skill range, I stop inviting them. No big deal. This is a no-pressure experience. You will partner with each of your seven teammates for one game. Win them all or lose them all, it doesn't matter. It may keep you from participating again, but it's still fun. I can't tell you how many times I've heard, "I didn't think I was good enough, but this was really fun." Every match finds different rosters. You'll enjoy playing with and against a lot of fun Picklers. (I don't invite those who I don't think would be fun.) Come on - stop thinking about it and just email me. It's a morning of no 15 minute waits between games and with other Picklers who are of at least somewhat compatible skill. And lunch is always good, affordable, and with excellent service and conversation. So email me, about the Tuesday mornings you think you are available. We've been competing for more than two years, and it's always been fun for all.

OUTDOOR MENTORING OPTIONS

Our 9th season of Wednesday morning mentoring will begin May 1st. While traditionally at Sycamore, it's doubtful the work there will be done. If it's not, we'll meet at Locust Park on Morris, as we did last fall. There will be two, 90-minute sessions, from 9:00 to 10:30 and from 10:30 to Noon. These are weekly but by invitation only. If you'd like to participate, email me at aokbarry@yahoo.com with the dates (through June for now) you think you could participate if chosen. If you absolutely HAVE TO have either the early or late session, let me know that.

Then you have to check your email on the Sunday afternoons before your desired dates, to see if you receive an invitation that week. If you do you must accept that invitation right away. You actually have until 10:00 a.m. Monday, before I give you a dreaded "strike." (see below) I suggest you put on your calendar something such as "Maybe mentoring" on every date you give me. Then, if a conflict comes up, you'll be reminded to email me to remove you from that ETBA (Expect To Be Available) list.

WALK-ON MENTORING SESSIONS

We offer walk-on mentoring (no invitation or reservation needed) on Thursday at Hamilton, from 3:00 to 5:00, beginning April 18th. I admit this has me concerned. We've added more than 700 members in the last year, and even the number of non-members has grown. This time is the least used at Hamilton, but even last year we started a few sessions with only a couple courts for a couple dozen Mentorees. It always worked out. Our sheer number of Mentorees staring at players on the courts usually worked to shoo them away. Some newer players even joined the club and joined our sessions right away. But ... this could be one of those times the need for more courts in town becomes really obvious.

Page 12 of 29 THE EASILY AVOIDED "STRIKE"

Here's the deal... We volunteers invest a LOT of time trying to enhance your pickleball experience. We REALLY hate you wasting our time. We'll overlook (I didn't say "forgive") your first strike, but if you get a second, you will be out of mentoring for the rest of the outdoor season. Here are the four ways you can earn a strike:

- 1) Fail to reply to an invitation to participate by 10:00 a.m. Monday.
- 2) Reply that you cannot participate. (11th hour emergencies excluded)
- 3) Be a no-show (again, 11th hour emergencies forgiven)
- Contacting Mentoree Scheduler Kathy with ANY message other than acceptance of her invitation. EVERYTHING else about mentoring should come to me at <u>aokbarry@yahoo.com</u>.

I will add that, anyone with a strike is likely to be selected to participate less often than those who play by the rules. I really hate to have to preach about common courtesy, but history has proven it's necessary.

NOW FOR THOSE WHO WORK, BABYSIT, GOLF, ETC.

For all potential Mentorees who are unable to attend EITHER a Wednesday or Thursday sessions, I created Saturday 3:00 to 5:00 mentoring sessions. These, too, are walk-on at Hamilton. They will begin April 20th. Again, let's hope enough courts are available for us. Also these sessions are walk-on. Just come. No invitation needed. You DO have to be a member of the Palatine Pickleball Club to participate so, if you're not a member, go to PalatinePicklers.com and click HOW TO JOIN. I will have loaner paddles for all newbies who have yet to get a "real" (\$80+ or Friday) paddle.

before being transnferred to Chicago as Divisional VP. After 16 years


with one company and 8 with another, he started Signs By Tomorrow, a signs and graphics company in Arlington Heights. After college both Alexandra and




