

### **MEET PICKLER SHEILA O'GARA**

11 in their family of 12 children. They grew up in **Evanston** and

Shela played varsity badminton and was on the varsity diving team. She was also in the soccer club. She really wanted to be on the swim team, but didn't swim the required mile. The coach sent her to the diving coach. She proved a quick study, and he had her doing forward and backward 1½ somersaults and twists. All was great, until she hit her head on the board performing an inward 1 ½ somersault after her junior year. On the way to the hospital, the ambulance ran out of gas. She was put in the back of a squad car. Strange enough? Hardly. She shared that back seat with a bunch of plants. Why? Because the officer didn't have a partner and needed "someone" to talk to. Not done with strange yet. They managed to lose one of her new Adidas gym shoes for which she'd saved babysitting money for quite a while. (In a family

of 12 kids, brand new anything was a rarity so that really hurt.) Once at the hospital, Shadle 3 of 32 received 13 stitches. Fear of hitting the board again did impact the quality of her future dives.

Perhaps, her best sports memory was scoring a soccer hat trick (3 goals) in one of the few games her Mom got to see. Her Dad was "always" working, and her Mom had 11 other kids to nurture.

Sheila earned a Bachelor of Science in Physical Education at the University of Illinois. Her teaching career took off at McKenzie School in Wilmette and ended at Willow Grove in Buffalo

Grove. She retired two years ago. In between she taught PeeWee sports to 4-5 year olds in 10 different Park Districts and taught 3-4 yr old preschool in Wilmette, was Director for Tiny Tots Day Camp and the Ajer School Program for the Wilmette Park District. She was also Tennis Instructor for Kelly's Day Camp.

In 1981 Houlihan's Restaurant and Bar. She and Terry O'Gara noticed they were each wearing the same Irish Claddagh ring. They married four

years later. They raised kids and lived a happy life, until Terry passed from cancer in 2017.

In 2019 she was set up on a blind date with Mike Huber, and they've been together ever since. His wife had died 3 months after Terry passed so they had an immediate bond. Their first date was at the County Line Tavern in Buffalo Grove. They talked for over three hours, until the restaurant closed. Then COVID came calling, and they were each other's "safe" friend. 
Then she taught seniors that lesson the rest of the day. They have an annual family tournament at Cog



LET'S CELEBRATE 10 YEARS OF THE PALATINE PICKLERS

This will be fun for me but also embarrassing. I am not a one-man band. In July's ne Ralget 40 of 32 identified all those who have helped make the Palatine Pickleball Club the fantastic group we are. Still, I can't ignore that I'm the engine that powers the fun and growth. Other than writing my resumes, this may be the first time I've patted myself on the back in print. Sorry, but some of you may enjoy seeing everything YOUR club has accomplished in its first decade.

#### 2015

In February the Park District asked me to start a pickleball club. They were well aware I was already their first and second most involved volunteer, for my work with hockey and baseball. I said, "OK." That month I spent time on my drawing board creating our logo and recruiting our first 12 members, including a Board of Directors of six. That worked for about six months, until they left and I was a left as monarch. It was then that I began lobbying the Palatine Park District for lining the two tennis courts at Sycamore and Locust to accommodate pickleball. They were receptive and did just that. I began writing my monthly newsletters. It was a few months later that I recruited Neal Harris to help me mentor brand new Picklers. Fast forward, we now have 4 mentoring sessions each week in the outdoor season, serving as many as 140 Picklers each year and 24 every other Tuesday for three hours during which each will spend half an hour with a different Mentor in the indoor season. I liked an idea from Debbie Paneral so decreed that, inside or out, the North side serves first in Palatine.

The summer of 2015 Al Zaman (member of both HE and Pal) and I arranged a travel team match in which we got blown away. Then I arranged for us to go to Libertyville to play them, after they got blown away by Hoffman too. This time we did the blowing away. Also that first summer, we lost our first Pickler, Emily "Tucky" Marchica. She was also a member of Hoffman so I got Hoffman to secure Fabbrini for a Saturday and launched the Tucky Tournament. It raised more than \$1200 for her charity. I calligraphed and framed our "medals."

#### 2016

I called for our first Photo Day for those in PPC shirts. It's been an almost annual event ever since. I asked PPD to get colored balls for Birchwood, as their white ones were hard to see.

They got them right away. I requested Sycamore and Locust tennis courts be lined for adjustifusef 32 (done in spring 2017)

I was emailing newsletters in groups of 24 to our members.

Meanwhile, our needs had expanded so I asked the PPD to give us actual pickleball courts. They did. They gave us two purely pickleball courts along with the one lined tennis court at both Sycamore and Locust. I expanded our shirts to include wicking, and eventually sweatshirts ... then, after COVID with help of Carol Hawes and John Guilfoil, we started offering caps.

Requested the Community Center's tennis courts be replaced by 6 pb courts (No) ... Captains of four clubs started the 3.5-4.0 league at Canlan. Each of us Captains seeded his gender and mixed teams. I reported Div 1 and Div 2 match results each newsletter ... 2 more ½ court ladders ... 155 shirts ordered ... June 1<sup>st</sup> picnic at Sycamore ... May hit 500 mbrs ... added V-neck & wicking shirts ... June 50s King of Court ... July pb shirt collection contest (Lynne Weisbart had 64) ... July introduced "win 3 in a row rec move up, lose 3 in a row competitive moved down" policy ... Aug introduced Pickleballcentral discount ... Our club covered in a Multi-family design magazine article ... Birchwood rec & competitive policy for evenings ... final ladder ended in Sept ... introduced all newsletters in library on website ... October King & Queen tournaments run simultaneously ... Introduced the Glare court policy for Falcon... Tue & Thu lower travel matches began ... 10/23 73 Picklers at Falcon signed Chuck's sign-in sheet) with 30-60 min wait between games so I asked the PPD for more playing times. Birchwood was the appreciated answer. Oct membership hit 600 ... fun shirts featured in Dec ... 16 played for lower & 29 played for upper travel team in Canlan ... ping pong tournament.



That really saved me time. ... I continued to put all newsletters in a binder at the Falcon desk, for anyone interested or without email ... King & Queen tournaments for those 63-72 ... raised shirt options to current level ... April Photo Day ... Olive Garden lunch ... another skinny singles tournament ... Suggested to PPD a contrasting color for Hamilton kitchens ... May's newsletter included my poem about the US Open & a ton of license plates there ... 50+ Queen of Court tournament ... Any age King tournament ... May lunch at Lamplighter ... June 721 members ... King 65+ tourney ... July 50-59 K & Q tournaments ... Famous Pinehurst Resort in NC traded me for 4 PPC shirts ... Bought Locust lockbox and filled with balls ... Began sending Picklers to Locust, when Sycamore got too crowded ... 

Tuesday 70 Picklers and Wednesday 61 Picklers came. I hit 1<sup>st</sup> serve on the new courts, bought 72 donuts, and gave away 44 large Crown Royal bags (photo of attendees above) ... Lefties tournament ... Mentorees Tournament ... 55-65 ladies' tournament ... sweatshirts added ... Baimbridge bricks purchased and engraved at birthplace of pickleball ... Twin Lakes picnic ...

70+ King ... Bionic Bodies tourney for those with replacement hip, knee, or shoulder Pale 4 of 32 Pong tournament. Created Hamilton policies ... Somehow became the Pickleball Police for those not following our sensible policies. About the same time somehow became the unofficial rules official. Rained the top end of talent range to 4.25 for 4-club league. Stared the lower intermediate travel league with matches against both Midtown and Barrington. That sort of worked for a year, though I frequently had to supply Palatine Picklers to fill their rosters (One such replacement required me to try 56 ladies, before I found one.) Website updated. Kept supplying Hamilton, Sycamore, and Locust with balls in locked boxes, with Picklers given the combination (same for all). Added logo patches to what we sold. 60s Queen tournament. Held our 2<sup>nd</sup> 2019 Mentoree tournament, for the outdoor students. Tried in vain to start a mixed doubles, Sunday afternoon league. Added more discounts to the newsletters. Introduced separate newsletter section for Newbies. I kicked tires of three potential ping pong venues, since our first went out of business. None were affordable. In September I introduced the "Glare Court" policy at Falcon. Gave away a lot more Crown Royal bags. Held our first Untall Ladies tournament. Created 5 different dry-erase scoreboards for various tournaments. 549 shirts sold.



#### 2020

Managed both Tuesday and Thursday travel leagues. Held first Tree Toppers tournament for men at least 6' tall. We had our first Feed My Starving Children afternoon. Created the competitive and rec cages and the "lose 3 in a row in competitive or win 3 in a row in rec, paddle up in the other cage policy." Had 2<sup>nd</sup> Photo Day. In May we lost Dennis Girandi to COVID and participated in a house drive-by with decorated cars. Hosted our first Pajama Party Tournament. 10 Pickler Volunteers attended our first, PPD Volunteer Recognition Luncheon. Held 1<sup>st</sup> Widow Tournament. Paid \$75 to register us for the 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade. Due to COVID it never happened so I donated the fee to the JCs. Made Seymour Rifkind's book available to borrow (Hall of Famer who is beyond an overachiever – still have it for you.) Staged our first Wrong hand tournament. 30 Picklers attended Feed My Starving Children. For COVID I made policies (touch only your ball, put balls back to owner (Jaime raised bottoms of nets), mask

properly, don't bunch up at paddle troughs, touch only your paddle). We survived thage 15 of 32 pandemic pretty well, losing only one Pickler to COVID. June featured our COVID quarantine pastimes. 70+ King tournament. Ignored PPD's order to have me stop taking pics and signing up members on PPD property. Ping Pong tournament. (two of several reasons I decline their request to have our club affiliate). Held a semi-impromptu Subway lunch. Revised mentoring again, to accommodate COVID. Had 75 Newbies in June. Widow tournament & dinner. In August I posted a COVID risk table. In August, hele "Set your own time" skinny singles tournament. In September I handed the scheduling of Menorees over to Robin Dubin. Held Wrong Hand tournament at Neal Harris's court. Held "Kyle Yates Challenge for bouncing ball on edge of paddle. (our usual action shots layout editor Jonny Storm won with 192). We were up to 549 shirts sold. Over 1700 members. Held 94th birthday drive-by for George Cridland ... Of course, I held summer Mentoree tournament 1st week of November. In December I bean writing Pickler profiles. (I have now written 61 of them.) Showed 30 Picklers at 30 degrees at Hamilton. That started the name Polar Picklers who are now playing in much colder temps.

Profiled four more Picklers. Promoted getting vaccinated. Showed 30 of us playing at Hamilton when it was 30 degrees. Our magazine article prompted 30,000 page views. Had another movie and ad quotes quiz. Began promoting 12/23 Jamaica pickleball week. Challenged Picklers to beat my best day steps (ongoing newsletter section). Wrote Darrell Rutter eulogy. Membership topped 1800. Movie quotes volume 2. Created another movie quote & commercial quote quiz. Wrote eulogy for Darrell Rutter. Membership hit 1800. Pushed for Jamaica participation 12/23. More than 525 Palatine members. Gave Elke 2 NE Hamilton courts on Monday mornings for 4.5+ players. (Later successfully argued that this was only 2.3% of pb court availability ... until 3 lady Picklers pestered them enough to have me kick them out). Men's closest to 60 tournament. Ladies 8 closest to 60 tournament. Summer skinny singles tournament. Made a new, lower intermediate league. Movie quotes volume 3. Introduced walk-on, Thursday mentoring at Hamilton. Hit 2,000 members. Summarized my 60 tournaments to date. I did an interview podcast for the Park District on pickleball in general and our club in particular. Oldest men tourney. Youngest Ladies tourney. Lower and upper

intermediate updates. Pickler shirts folded competition. (Yeah, Lynne Weisbart held Page of 6 of 32 2<sup>nd</sup>.) Profiled Tracy Weslager, our happiest Pickler yet. Held Ugly Holiday Sweater judging & tournament. Annual Untall Ladies tournament. Started Canlan indoor season mentoring.

#### 2022

2<sup>nd</sup> Tree Toppers tournament for 6'+ guys ... Singles tournament. ... COVID update ... Started 3.0-3.5 intramural every other week matches for Whippersnappers vs Wise Ones (based on age each match) ... Singles tournament. ... Introduced car window decals. Skinny singles







tournament run by Alberto (I was out of own). 70+ Men's



tournament. 70+ Ladies tournament. 65+ Ladies tourney. Crosstown Pickler Cup tournament by PPD ... I worked hard to fill all events with our best pairs (lots of playoffs), but it never happened. Dennis and I helped AH Sr Center get their first fund-raiser tournament off the ground ... 60s+ Ladies tournament. Hosted RUSH's first pickleball-oriented workshop. 2<sup>nd</sup> Widdowriffic tournament and sharing lunch.

Palatine Scarecrow building contest ... built in our garage & trucked to downtown Palatine. (When an elderly judge looked at our Pickler wearing his PPC shirt holding paddle and ball, with knee support, headband, gym shoes, tendonitis band, etc. and asked if there was a theme to this scarecrow. Really? I vowed never again. IMHO we absolutely should have been in the top 3. At any rate it was a great, collective effort, worth sacrificing my green shirt.

I turned the job of ordering, picking up, bagging & tagging, and delivering shirts to Linda O'Connor. I compiled an ongoing list of Palatine residents who became Palatine Picklers. Introduced "strikes" to combat the disrespect of Picklers in tournaments, intramurals, or mentoring who ask to be put on an Expect To Be Available list and then aren't available. 1st strike not forgiven but overlooked. 2nd strike earns a 6 month ban from that event. Suggested to PPD that pb courts could be installed at Eagle Park where they'd be far enough away from homes not to be much of a nuisance. (Nope) Showed pics to reinforce our Mentors' preaching of never run backwards. Pics showed blood on court and victim being tuned into a mummy and taken away on paramedics' stretcher. How I determine who participates in intramurals and mentoring is simple though tirege 20 of 32 consuming. I have my Expect To Be Available spreadsheets. For intramurals I write in a notebook the names of each man and lady who signed up for the upcoming date. Beside each name I mark three figures, either an X or an O, to indicate if they participated in any of the last three matches. Most selections are based on frequency and recency of their playing. For indoor mentoring, I send the ETBA spreadsheet to Scheduler Kathy. On Monday she sends me the names of 24 Mentorees (selected mostly on basis of frequency and recencey). I then do a lot of research based on past sessions court assignments (with my notes indicating where thy should be if not ideal) and membership applications for 1<sup>st</sup> timers. I then assign each to whichever of six courts I feel appropriate, based on what I think is their skill and experience.

Over the ten years, I've published 121 newsletters, shared \_\_\_\_ pics (98% taken by me) over \_\_\_\_ pages. I've welcomed more than 4200 members, more than 1300 Palatinians. We had more than 20,000 website visits in 2024.





### **OUR FIRST DECADE IS A DONE DEAL**

In our first ten years, I have written 121 newsletters. They consumed 2194 pages. I began the Palatine Pickleball Club as a continuing effort to "pay my dues" for all with which this life has blessed me. So many of you have rewarded me with your thanks and appreciation. In turn I thank all who have volunteered to help with the tasks needed to keep us what has to be a contender for the best pickleball club on Earth.

I really would like to finish my "Guide for the Newly Widowed" book. I'd also like to give Kathy more of what

she thought she was signing up for when she married me. So, one of these days in the not too distant future, I'll seek someone to run intramurals, someone to run mentoring, someone to create/run fun tournaments, someone to gather walker stats, and someone to send even a photoless, monthly newsletter. This could well be a committee.
