CALLING ALL INTERMEDIATE PICKLERS

Our Intermediate Intramural matches began in 2022 and have been contested every other Tuesday, except during the holidays, ever since. They are so much fun that I'd really like to see more Palatine Picklers get in on these fun mornings. You'll surely play with different teammates each time you hit the Canlan courts. Picklers arrive by 8:45 to pay their \$10 fee and warm up a bit. I get things going at 9:00. Your team will have four men and four ladies. You will partner with each of your teammates for one game. We'll finish about 11:45 at which time all whose

schedule allows gather a mile away at Kelsey Road House for lunch. (Great food, great service, reasonable prices, and separate checks.)

The target talent range is 3.0 to 3.5. That includes at least half of our membership. If you wonder if you fall within that range, ask any Pickler you think is a bit better than you. If you still don't know if you are appropriate, I'll roster you once and see if you fit or are a bit above or below our idea of intermediate.

Each Sunday I arrange all those on the "Expect To Be Available" list for Tuesday in order of their dates of birth. I then indicate in which, if any, of the last three matches each has played.

I try to balance participation as much as is possible, while still keeping matches competitive. It's worked out well. As I write this, the Wise Ones (older half) have a 33-31 lead over the Whippersnappers (younger half) in the 3-year series.

For those of you who are shy about playing in a tournament, this is not that. These are purely for fun events. You get more playing time than you do at open play, and almost all your games will be more evenly matched which adds to your fun.

NOW LET'S RECRUIT MORE MENTOREES

Mentoring has, for nine years, been THE big draw for the Palatine Pickleball Club. Even more than our popular intramurals or the dozen, ever-changing, fun tournaments we enjoy each year. Over the years we've improved the play of roughly one thousand students ... all at no charge. In the outdoor season, we have two Wednesday sessions by invitation and both Thursday and Saturday walk-on sessions.

Our indoor season (November through April) is actually our most beneficial. Our every other Tuesday morning sessions are from 9:00 to Noon in the Lake Barrington Canlan Sportsplex. They charge a \$10 daily fee. During your morning, you will spend 30 minutes with each of six Mentors, while sharing a court with three Picklers of, I expect to be of similar ability.





BECAUSE WE'VE HAD TOO MANY BENCHED FOR SIX MONTHS

Not my favorite topic, but it seems we need to review "strikes." If you ask to be put on an Expect **To Be A**vailable (ETBA) list, we actually expect you to be available. When you make that request, PLEASE put "Maybe Canlan" or something on your calendar to remind you to email me to take you off that ETBA list, should a conflict arise. Here are the ways you can "earn" a strike:

- 1) Not respond to a Sunday afternoon invitation to participate in mentoring or intramurals before 10:00 a.m. Monday.
- 2) Respond saying you cannot attend after all.
- 3) Contacting Kathy (our Mentoree Scheduler) with ANYTHING other than "I"ll be there." Everything else has to come to me at <u>aokbarry@yahoo.com</u>.

I won't say we forgive a strike, but we will overlook one. If you earn a second strike, you are banned from mentoring or intramurals for six months. We REALLY don't like wasting time replacing you. When 6:00 p.m. Sunday comes, those not invited to participate on Tuesday are free to make other plans. Sometimes it takes several attempts to replace a striker. NOT fun.

I'm reiterating this policy, because I've had to bench a couple offenders for six months last month. I hate doing that, but we do believe we have earned some common courtesy. Brand new policy ... if someone gets benched for six months twice, they're banned for life from that event.


GLARE COURT POLICY

Most who have bought a bunch of Falcon passes before the price HIKE are familiar with this. For newer Palatine Picklers, let's review it. I designated the Falcon court nearest the lobby as the "Glare Court." There is a distinct advantage to be on the lobby side, when playing on this court. Consequently, it makes sense to share that advantage. So … when you "migrate" to that court, note your score. Subtract the leading score from 11. Then divide it by two, rounding up. Add it to the top score. When the leading score reaches THAT score, you change sides. For example, you arrive at the Glare Court with a a score of 6-4. 11-6=5. Half of 5 rounded up is 3. Add 3 to 6 and, bingo, you change sides when one team reaches 9. Easy peasy and fair for all.

FUN FACTS TO START THE NEW YEAR

The Sport and Fitness Industry Association (SFIA) and Pickleheads have published their annual pickleball participation report. For the third consecutive year, pickleball has grown in the US by at least 223%. There are now 13.6 million players here. That trails number 1 soccer which boasts 14.1 million players. Pickleball will certainly be number 1 by the end of 2025. Male picklers outnumber females 59% to 31%. The average age of the American pickler is 46. 67% of the courts in the US are outdoors, while 33% are inside.

Locally, the Palatine Pickleball Club added 560 new members in the last twelve months.


