WE TURN 7 THIS MONTH

As I write this, I have welcomed 2,248 Picklers to this club, including 829 in the last year. 629 of our members reside within the Palatine Park District. Our 73, monthly newsletters have had 1,348 pages which contained 11,167 photos.. We've now sold 634 Palatine Picklers shirts.

In the last year we enjoyed 9 of our 45, fun tournaments. New ones in 2021 were Ugly Holiday Sweater tournament & judging ... Oldest Picklemen ... Oldest Pickleladies ... Youngest Pickleladies ... Men Closest to 60 ... and Ladies Closest to 60. Also, 29 of our 34 Pickler profiles have appeared in the last year. We started recognizing our Worthy Walkers (15,000 steps in a day) and our Super Steppers (20,000 steps in a day). In 2021 a number of us purchased bricks engraved as desired for placement at the home of pickleball on Baimbridge Island in WA.

We debuted a new, improved, and expanded Facebook presence last fall, and a new, improved and expanded website last month. Bear was interviewed for 38 minutes about pickleball and the Palatine Pickleball Club on a Palatine Park District podcast.

This past year, while our usual indoor facilities were closed, Neal Harris got a closed, Lake Zurich warehouse to let him and other Picklers line courts and open play to masked Picklers. Thanks, Neal.

John Kirschner captioned our 3.5-4.0 travel team off to a winning start against Hoffman, DuPage, and LibertyRidge, before handing off the clipboard to Bob Bregenzer. It remains a competitive, Thursday league at Canlan Sportsplex.

A highlight of our 2021 year was our soldiers mentoring. I was asked by Sgt Dan to secure six, free courts near Ft Sheridan, get six Mentors, 24+ paddles and a lot of balls, to run a mentoring session for 24+ soldiers who didn't know a pickleball from a formal ball at 7:00 a.m. on Sunday, October24th. No problem, right? We made it happen, thanks to the Highland Park District, Bob Goldstein, Dennis Bourgoin, Neal Harris, Melody Woodsum, Thea Froehling, and me, we gave them an awesome morning for which they were truly thankful.

Last fall we also participated in a drive-by, 95th birthday celebration for George Cridland, a familiar WWII Navy honoree who accompanies wife Elvira to Falcon for pickleball.







In the last year we provided mentoring to more Picklers than ever before. Over the summer, Dennis Bourgoin, Marv Zwass, Neal Harris, Bob Goldstein, and I helped 133 students on Wednesday mornings. Dennis and I served up to 37 Thursday afternoons. In the fall Neal, Dennis, and I mentored 69 students indoors at Canlan. We'll continue to serve them every other Tuesday morning through April 5th.







WE REALLY NEED TO COMMUNICATE

These newsletters invite you to participate in tournaments, leagues, and mentoring. If you accept an invitation, PLEASE email me at aokbarry@yahoo.com, if you find you'd have a conflict. Two days before any event I email participants asking for their final confirmation that they'll be there. This is NOT the time to tell me you can't make it after all.. This is particularly true of our mentoring programs. There is an "Expect To Be Available" list of Mentorees. I review a session's list on Saturday and do my best to put together three groups of eight who are of compatible experience and abilities. Then on Sunday afternoon I email those 24 invitations, assuming they'll be accepted. Why wouldn't they be? If someone had a conflict come up since asking to be on that's session's ETBA list, they'd surely email me to take them off, right? That would be the courteous and respectful thing to do. Getting subs takes time and lessens the chance of my being able to put together as compatible groups on my required, 11th hour attempt.

In January I started a two-strike policy. A strike is earned by (a) not answering an invitation by 10 a.m. Monday, (b) saying you can't attend after all (last minute emergencies excluded), or (c) being a no-show. After a second strike, you will be removed from all remaining ETBA lists. Strikes will start anew for the outdoor season. We've had only two, 2022 mentoring sessions, and seven Mentorees have earned a strike. Let's try to communicate in a more timely fashion, from now on. I really prefer praising and congratulating our Palatine Picklers. Admonishing them is far from fun. Please don't prompt me to keep doing it. Thanks.

Nicole's favorite quote is, "I'll make the most of it. I'm an extraordinary machine," from Fiona Apple.








