MENTORING MOVES OUTDOORS IN MAY

There is still time for newer players, and those intermediate Picklers wanting to hone their skills to participate in the Canlan Sportsplex mentoring sessions. We have two remaining sessions. Tuesday 4/8 and Tuesday 4/22. Sessions start at 9:00 and end at Noon. These are free from us, though Canlan charges a \$10 daily fee. Over the course of those three hours, you will share a court with Picklers of similar experience and ability and receive coaching from each of six Mentors. Just email me at aokbarry@yahoo.com to be put on one of those two Expect To Be Available lists. Then check your email over the weekend. I'll send initations for 4/8 on Sunday 4/6, and Kathy will invite students Saturday or Sunday 4/19 and/or 4/20.

TIME TO REGISTER FOR WEDNESDAY MENTORING AT SYCAMORE ... For those who have not participated, our primary outdoor mentoring consists of two, 90-minute sessions each Wednesday at Sycamore Park on Carpenter at Clark. You must email me at aokbarry@yahoo.com to be put on an Expect To Be Available (ETBA) list for any weeks you'd be interested in participating. We invite 12 students for he 9:00 to 10:30 session and 12 for the 10:30 to Noon session. You'll spend all 90 minutes sharing a court with three I believe to be of similar experience and ability. You'll have a new Mentor each 30 minutes. These sessions are totally free. Since summer mentoring started nine years ago, roughly 300 students have participated. I believe two of them didn't think it was for them. Your odds of loving your mornings with us are pretty good.

THEN THERE ARE SESSIONS NOT NEEDING AN INVITATION ... We have walk-on mentoring at Hamilton (Smith Road across from Sundling Jr High) on Thursdays from 3:00 to 5:00. Then, primarily for those who cannot attend either Wednesday or Thursday mentoring, we have a Saturday session at Hamilton from 3:00 to 5:00.

For beginners, I have loaner paddles. If buying your 1st, I strongly suggest NOT spending less than \$80, unless you buy a Friday paddle. (search Friday pickleball paddles). All are good.

SEEMS WE NEED TO REVIEW "STRIKES" AGAIN

At least every month I explain how anyone ... whether in mentoring, intramurals, or a tournament ... who has asked to be put on a given ETBA (Expect To Be Available) list, needs to email ME by noon three days before the event to take you off that ETBA list. If you put on you calendar "Maybe Canlan" each day you send me, it should be an easy reminder, in the event a conflict arises.

So how do you earn a strike? (1) You do not respond to an invitation by 10 a.m. the day after you receive it. (2) You reply saying you cannot make it. (3) In the event of mentoring, you contact (email, text, or call) Kathy with absolutely anything other than your acceptance of her invitation. (Everything else comes to me.) (4) You are a no-show. We frown, roll our eyes, and overlook your offense the first time. If you get a second strike, you are out of EVERYTHING for the next six months, even if your strikes were from different Palatine Pickler events.

I'm not shy about reviewing how strikes are eared, at the start of events. Yet, all too often, within two weeks, one of those hearing that yadda yadda yadda speech, earns a strike, sometimes a second. Strikes exist to keep Scheduler Kathy and me from wasting time seeking a replacement for you when you told me you'd be there. By then others may have other plans.



PLAN TO SPEND A PICKLERIFFIC WEEK IN MEXICO 18 of 20



John Schehl (at left) brought this resort to my attention. He's stayed here and loves it. He made a powerpoint presentation to a bunch of us after intramurals a couple months ago, and we loved it. He has gotten some input from me, but he's been on point so far. I hope to have more specifics in the May newsletter.

We'll fly to Cabo San Lucas on Wednesday, January 14th (2026), for fun week of pickleball at the awesome Palmas Pickleball Resort in Los Barriles. Most of us will fly home Tuesday, January 20th. The round trip from and to the airport will cost \$100 per person.

Take a look at what you'll find:

Let's look at lodging. Prices include taxes and fees:

At Palmas De Cortez ... 2 double beds, ocean view, 1 or 2 people ... \$264/day (8 available) 2-bedroom condo, ocean view, sleeps 5 ... \$624/day (7 available)

At Playa Del Sol ... 2 double beds, ocean view, 1 or 2 people ... \$252/day upstairs or down (6 available)

King bed, ocean view, 1 or 2 people ... \$276 upstairs or down (2 available) 2 double beds, poolside view, 1 or 2 people ... \$252/day ground floor (10 available) King bed, poolside view, 1 or 2 people ... \$276/day ground floor (2 available)

2 double beds, Garden Room, 1 or 2 people ... \$180/day (6 available)

The resort requires a 20% deposit, with the balance due upon arrival.

There are also Air B&B options within easy walking distances.

Let's look at pickleball:

We'll have 8 courts reserved from 9:00 to Noon all six days. For this the total cost is \$3600. If we have 40 Picklers each day, the individual cost is \$15. Of course, I'd be very surprised if we have 40 who want to play (32 at a time) every day for 3 hours. I'd originally wanted 2 hours each day. I think we may need to return to that idea. And John and I will have to play with how to charge/collect for the different numbers who want to play each day.

Then there is open play at a cost of \$13 per day, at least if all 40 of us want to play each day. Again, we've got more questions and more number-crunching to do, before I write the article for the May newsletter. In open play we can interact with other guests.

Let's look at food:

Resort breakfasts usually are \$10-12 courtside. Resort lunches will be about \$15. Dinners can run \$25 to \$60, with several restaurants within an easy walk.





Skills & Drills Clinic: \$50 for two, one-hour sessions. We'll find out if you can sign up for just one for \$25. Also, you can sign up for individual or small group lessons. We'll investigate those fees.





What to do in Los Barriles:

There are plenty of activities, including water sports, fishing, jet skiing, hiking, whale-watching, art walks, ATV rides, etc.





THAT'S A WRAP

Another active month. It's been interesting with the temps from day to day going from 28 to 79 to 34 to 63. It gave a lot of us both indoor and outdoor play time. Perhaps, you noticed a shortage of Newbies this month. Strange. Won't go through all the experimentation and investigation, but it's due to Yahoo totally screwing up their everything. Newer players can email me to get on an Expect To Be Available list for either the 9:00 to 10:30 and/or 10:30-Noon mentoring sessions at Sycamore Park, starting in May. Invitations will be sent on Mondays.

Intermediate level Picklers should send me the every other Tuesdays (next is 4/15) you expect to be available to play from 9 to noon in Canlan. When you email me, please include your MMDDYY date of birth. It's oldies against youngsters. All fun. Not serious. Then lunch.

FYI the last day of indoor pickleball at Falcon is Friday, May 30th. Birchwood's last day is Thursday, May 29th.
