

I will follow up with emails and Facebook posts after the October newsletter is out.






# 3rd YEA FOR BEAR PICNIC WAS WONDERFUL

That's great. Maybe potential Mentorees see me play and know I'm a Mentor. Yes, I am terrible these days, but I really can teach better than I play.

We are so grateful that Bob McGowan has stepped up, to take over our fun tournaments. I hope Nancy is OK with the bunch of scoreboards I'll be giving him. If no one volunteers to take over intramurals the balls I give him will empty my my trunk. If someone does want to see intramurals continue into 2026, I will be very happy to secure more balls for that program ... and it has only one scoreboard.

Other towns are building courts, seemingly, at breakneck speed. We're now worst of 17, not 15. Again, think of the irony. The Palatine Pickleball Club is one of the largest in the country. Yet its hometown is the worst for supplying courts. In one move the Park District could put Palatine back atop the NW suburbs for pickleball. You can still let your voice be heard. Email Ben at brea@palatineparks.org. After 100+ emails, he certainly gets that we have too few courts in town. Just let him know you think that 14 & 68 property is ideal for a truly classy pickleball facility. An indoor swimming pool is the only other reasonable option, but the property is large enough for a class pickleball facility AND a pool. I fought tooth and nail for lined tennis courts, then separate pb courts, and finally Hamilton, and then kitchens of another color. Now I'm fighting for a pickleball facility that will put Palatine back on the suburban pickleball map. It would be great to run tournaments that could actually generate revenue for the PPD.

Rapidly approaching is the 10/23 Halloween Costume Tournament. We judge costumes. Then we play (headwear and footwear may be removed). Then we have lunch in a very Vampire environment a mile away. Email me you'd like to join this fun.
