1st PALATINE PICKLERS PICKLR TOURNAMENT OCTOBER 1st

We have enjoyed two "Changing Courts" tournaments at Pickle Haus in Algonquin and loved them... and lunch afterward. This year they wanted to increase our individual fee %59%, from \$22 to \$35 for 2 hours. No thank you. So I asked Picklr. Oh, yes! Did I mention they LOVE Palatine Picklers? We will have five courts (20 Picklers) from 10:00 to Noon on Wednesday, October 1st for \$20 apiece. You don't even have to be a member. I'll have to research where we'd like to have lunch afterward, but that's "small potatoes." So, unless Picklr wants it another way, email me your desire to play. I'll give the list of the first 20 to the Picklr.

Here's how it will work again. I'll assign courts based on the alpha order of your first name. Every 20 minutes I'll blow a whistle. At that point you record all your scores on a clipboard I'll have at your court. Winners move up a court number, and losers move down. You change partners and start another game. At this point I don't know if you will pay Picklr when you arrive or should pay me and I make one payment for all, as we did at Pickle Haus.

I expect to run three or four four of these Picklr tournaments a year. Except for no restaurant and no unused cabana courts, Picklr is Pickle Haus on steroids. Another word is "awesome."

WE NEED BEGINNERS ... AND WE NEED INTERMEDIATES

MENTORING Our Wednesday morning mentoring can serve 24 students, 12 at 9:00, and 12 more at 10:30. Sessions have been full for our first ten years. However, since the 2nd of July we have fallen short of 24 Mentorees each week. We don't understand this. Virtually every week I welcome at least six Beginners to the Palatine Pickleball Club. Why are they not emailing me at aokbarry@yahoo.com with the Wednesday mornings they expect to be available? Yes, many are still in the work force so come to Hamilton Saturday afternoon. However, many are retired or control their own time. In just 90 minutes of sharing courts with three Picklers of similar ability and/or experience, they receive a half hour of instruction and guidance from three different Mentors. It is fairly frequent that we hear a Mentoree has learned more in one free day with us than he/she did in 3 weeks of paid instruction elsewhere.

INTRAMURALS I started this program for intermediate Picklers (3.0-3.5) more than 3 years ago. It's every other Tuesday morning year round. Participants partner with their 3 gender teammates for 3 games, before playing four games with their mixed teammates. Then we go to lunch. Each match has a different roster. Each match has the younger half against the older half ... Whippersnappers vs Wise Ones. After all this time, the teams are only a couple matches apart. Are you appropriate for intramurals? Well, 50% of our membership is. Email me at aokbarry@yahoo.com and I'll give you a try. If you seem a bit too good or not quite ready, I'll let you know, but you'll still have a lot of fun. It's not that serious. I don't do serious; I do fun things for Picklers. For the first time ever, I had to cancel 8/19 intramurals, due to too few participants. This, as with mentoring, is absolutely nuts. A glitch wiped out participants from my intramural spreadsheet. I mentioned everyone has to email me a new list of available dates. Apparently, many didn't read that. EVERYONE who didn't play in August should email me your availability, because I do not have it, even if you sent it months ago. Recently welcomed members should give it a try so email me. I'll beat this drum more on another page.
