I'll still publicize tournaments run by any Palatine Pickler, no matter where they are. I'll still take and edit pics of Newbies to send to Mary Werling to put on pages I'll put in each newsletter. I'll still take and edit action shots and send them to Jonny Storm for to add names and send back for me for the newsletters. I'll still send any medalists that are mistakenly sent to me to Stephanie Douglas and incorporate her work in the newsletters. I'll still welcome each Newbie I either sign up in person or am sent by Shiela Lullo who receives them from our website. I'll still put in newsletters the participants photo and the winners for each fun tournament Bob runs. I'll still lobby for our growing needs with the Park District. I'll still play "Pickleball Police" for problems at courts. I'll still promote Feed My Starving Children. I'll still

settle rules disputes. I'll still plan our annual Photo Day. I'll still write my closing editorials. I'm just trying to get down to 25 hours a week on the laptop for the Palatine Picklers. I'll still select 10 of our volunteers to enjoy the PPD's annual Volunteer Recognition Luncheon and write a nomination for our Volunteer of the Year. This is NOT retiring. I couldn't (yet) do that to you. However, if any of you would like to do all this stuff, I will be more than happy to actually retire. Again, I'd like to finish my book – Guide for the Newly Widowed. NOW HOW 'BOUT SOMEONE TO MANAGE THURSDAY & SATURDAY MENTORING?

This would be one of the easiest jobs I'd like to pass on to another Pickler. I can give you email addresses and phone numbers of all who have mentored either indoors our out. You'll just try to schedule 3-5 Mentors for each of these 3:00 to 5:00 mentoring sessions. These have had 3 to 5 courts of students all summer. They will continue only until the first, measurable snowfall. You can make any announcements, maybe have everyone do the ball bouncing drill we do every week (without moving feet, bounce a ball 10 times on the forehand side of your paddle, 10 times on the backhand, and then alternate forehand to backhand 10 times). Then assign everyone to courts which seem appropriate. Mentors you schedule will help with that. I will give you the balls you need.

1st PICKLR TOURNAMENT WAS A WINNER

Last month I ran the largest tournament we've ever had. We had 32 Palatine Picklers invade the Mt Prospect Picklr for this. I'd prepared 32 clipboards and attached to each a scoresheet participants would take with them. Every 15 minutes I blew my whistle. Play stops (games had no end only time restraints). Winners moved to the next higher numbered court. Losers moved to the next lowest numbered court. They noted if their first name was first or second in the alphabet with their former partner and paired with that same ordered Pickler of the two they met on their new court. We played eight games with a bunch of different partners. It was as awesome as the Picklr facility itself. Here's our group of Palatine Picklers who competed:

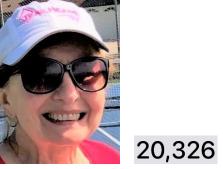
