#### **MEET PICKLER BRAD NAHRSTADT**

This profile I have to preface with a coincidental experience. Kathy and I went down to Monmouth College a couple years ago, for my Sig Ep (Sigma Phi Epsilon) chapter's 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary. There was an effervescent, engaging emcee named Brad. One of the speakers mentioned, "Well, Brad, we may not share your love of pickleball, but...." Well, I knew he was from the north suburbs of Chicago so I HAD to talk to him about pickleball. After all the speakers were finished, I stood in line to talk to Brad. I asked where he lived – Northbrook. Cool. I asked where he played. Wheeling and Buffalo Grove. I asked if he'd consider Palatine. He said he JUST joined the Palatine Pickleball Club. I asked, "Have I sent your welcome email yet?" "Are you Bear?" I smiled, and he hugged me. That's how I met Brad.

Brad was born October 21, 1967 (the day I got married) in Elmhurst, Illinois (where I was born). He attended Genoa-Kingston High School where he sacrificed sports for Student Council, JETS (Junior Engineering Technical Society) Team, served as Student Director of the school play, and was President of the National Honor Society.

He graduated from Monmouth College in 1980 with degrees in English Literature and Political Science. Then he graduated from the University of Illinois College of Law in 1992 with a *Juris Doctorate*.

From 1992 to 2012 Brad was a trial attorney with Williams Montgomery & John. Starting as an Associate Attorney, he was promoted to Income Partner and then Equity Partner. From 2012 to 2019 he was President and Managing Partner of Lipe Lyons Murphy Nahrstadt & Pontikis. As a founding partner, Brad helped grow the firm from 5 lawyers to 17. He continued to try high-stakes cases in state and federal courts, for corporate clients and insurance companies.



He met Debby the first week of law school. Place goof 25 married in 1992 and lived in Glenview. In 1993 they moved to Buffalo Grove where they lived until 2019. Then they moved to Ancient Tree in Northbrook. On the left, Deb & Brad enjoy a lake cruise in AZ.

From 2019 to 2021 he was Chief Operating Officer of

Donohue, Brown, Mathewson & Smith

a 40-lawyer litigation firm in Chicago. Brad retired in 2021.

Let's regress. They have two sons ... Benny, 30 and Josh, 28. Benny married Stephnie this year. Brad and Deb have an English Bulldog named Cora. In the photo at right Brad is with Deb, Josh's girlfriend Emily, and Josh at a George Strait concert.



Brad has a pretty rare hobby. He collects campaign buttons and posters. He has almost 2,000 political buttons from all the presidential eletions from 1896 to the present. His poster collection goes back to 1880.

Brad volunteers at the Illinois Holocaust Museum and Educational Center. He's served on the Monmouth College Board of Trustees since 2002. He's a member of the Executive Committee.



He erves as the Co-Chair of the Nominating Committee and as the Chair of the Student Affairs Committee. He's also volunteere with the Sig Ep fraternity for 32 years, and currently serves as the Grand President of Sigma Phi Epsilon.

In 2000 Brad was recognized as the Monmouth College Outstanding Young Alumnus. In 2006 he was recognized by the Law Bulletin Publishing Company as one of the 40 Illinois Attorneys Under 40 to watch. In 2008 he was elected to membership in the American Law Institute, an honor reserved for less than 1% of attorneys practicing in the U.S. In 2012 he was recognized as a Distinguished Alumnus by Sigma Phi Epsilon. FYI the headline is Sig Ep's red and purple.

In 2013 he was invited to become a Fellow in the Litigation Counsel of America. The LCA is a trial lawyer honorary society whose membvership is limite3d to less than one-half of one percent of American lawyers. There are approximately 93,000 practicing attorneys in Illinois, and only 161 are Fellows in the LCA.

In 2014 Brad received the Monmouth College Distinguished Alumnus Award. In October of 2015 he was one of three inaugural inductees into the Monmouth College Order of Omega Fraternity and Sorority Hall of Fame. Two years later he was inducted into the Genoa-Kingston High School Hall of Fame. In 2018 he received the Defense Research Institute Exceptional Performance Citation.



Pickleball entered Brad's life while wintering in AZ 2021-2022. Their Westbrook Village development has a large pickleball club. Its members taught him the game.

What Brad likes most about the Palatine Pickleball Club is


that everyone is so friendly and welcoming. Having so many good players at Hamilton makes mornings a real pleasure.

Pickleball and his Sig Ep responsibilities don't leave time for Brad to explore other sports, hobbies, clubs, etc.

He is the author or co-author of three books. His first, *Alton B. Parker: The Man Who Challenged Roosevelt*, was published by SUNY Press in January of 2024. His second was coauthored with his wife and titled *Pre-Trial Litigation:A Practitioner's Approach*. It was published by Amazon in July. His third, *The Democrats in Turmoil: The Bitter Fights to Select a Presidential Nominee, 1986-1924*. Is to be published by Bloomsbury Pres in June of 2025.

Now let's look at this past season. In early 2024 at Canlan, we served 85 Mentorees. On Wednesdays through the outdoor season, we served 101 students. No records of Thursday and Saturday walk-on sessions, but I'd guess we worked with about 60.

Mentoring is our most successful and popular program. Many Mentorees have expressed that they've gotten more out of one session with us than they did in weeks of paid lessons elsewhere. These sessions are, perhaps, the biggest reason our club has grown to an enormous size. There is no end line for mentoring. We are happy to have some in their third or fourth year.




We worked in teams of 6 or 7. It's always a lot of fun. Hope you'll join us next time.
