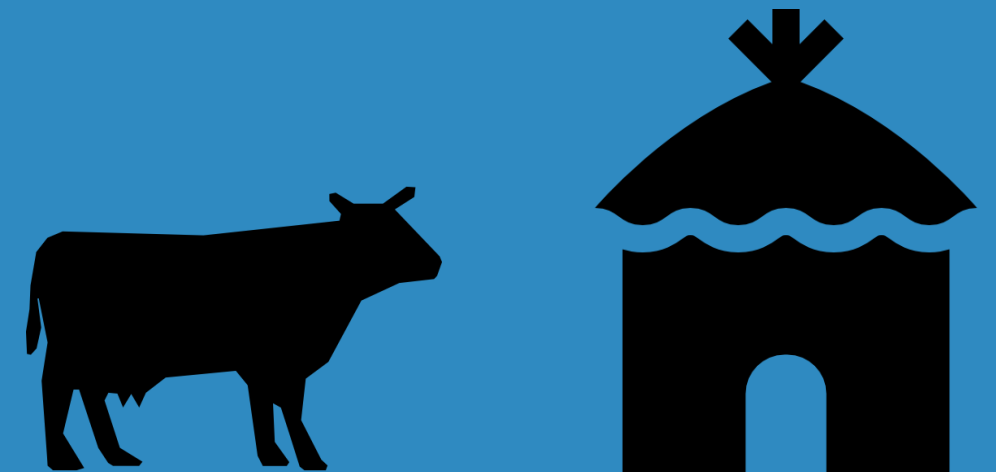
Jack and his Mother

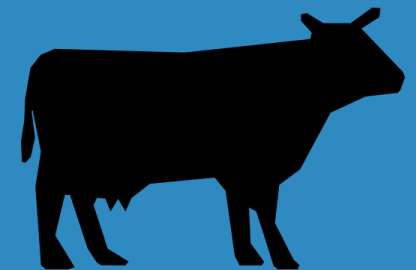

The Magic Beans

Call to Adventure

Jack's mother sends him to sell their cow at the market to buy food.

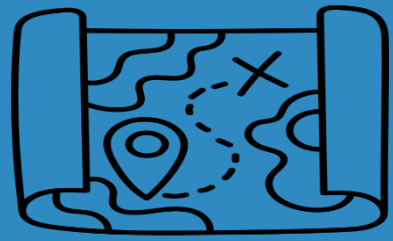
Instead, Jack is offered magical beans by a stranger and, intrigued, accepts them.

When Jack returns home with the beans instead of money, his mother is furious and throws them out of the window.

At this point, Jack looks like he's made a big mistake.

But the beans were no ordinary beans – they were magical!

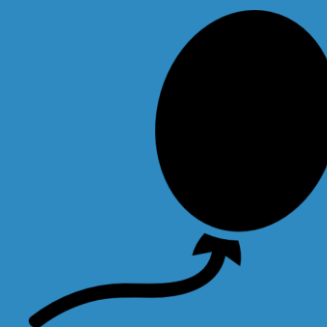
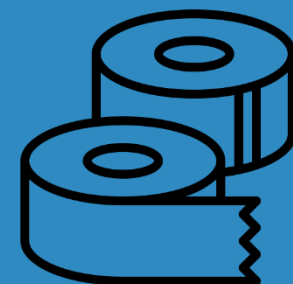
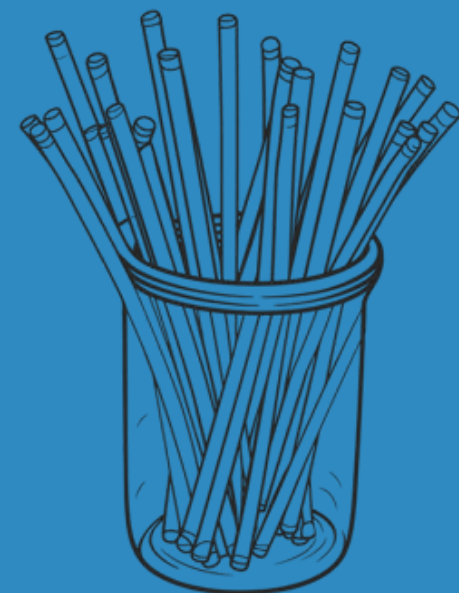


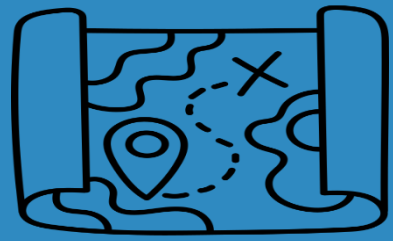
Building your Beanstalk

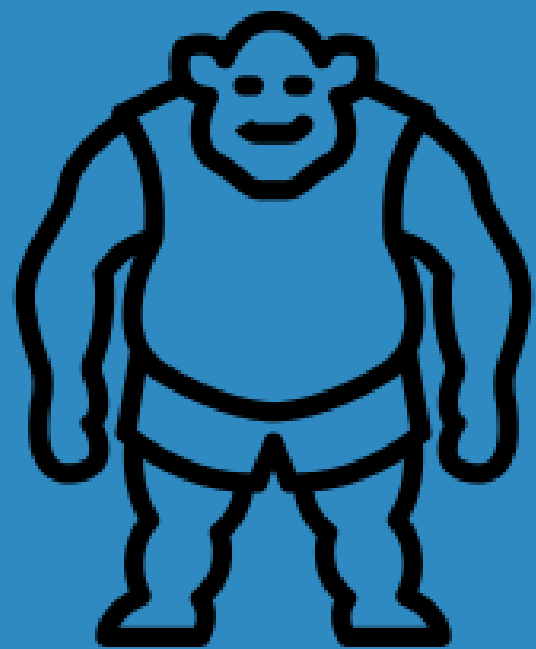


The Giant

The Ordeal

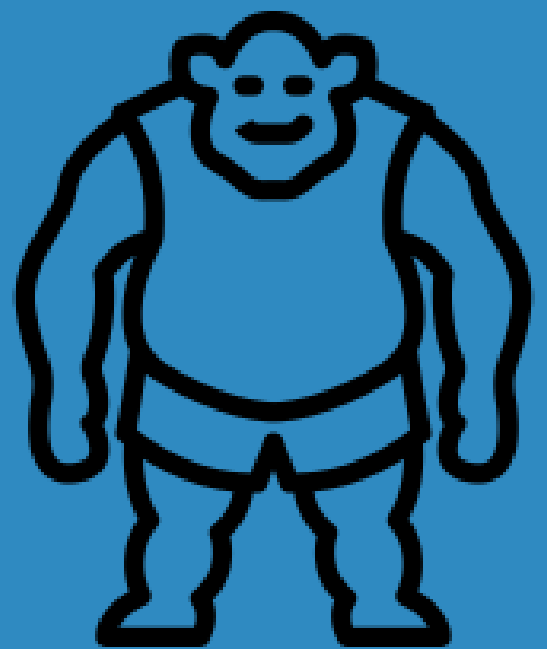
Jack encounters the giant above the clouds. His greatest test is finding the treasures (gold, magic harp, hen that lays golden eggs).

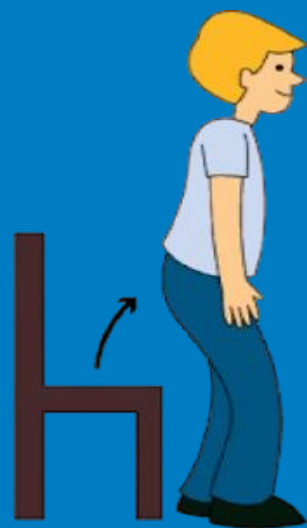

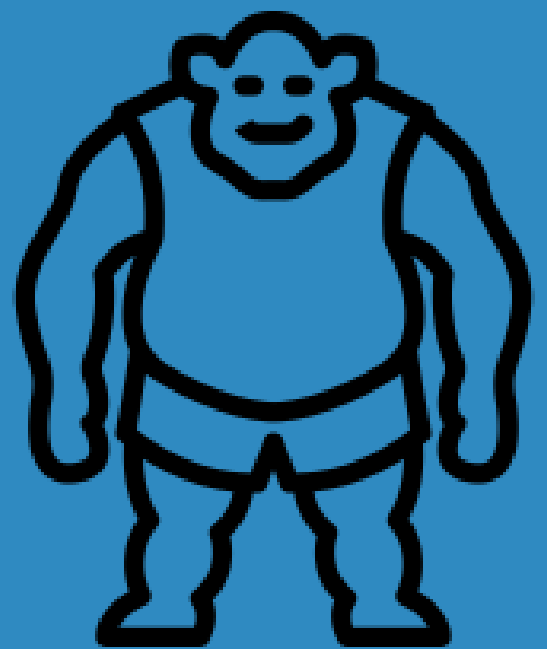


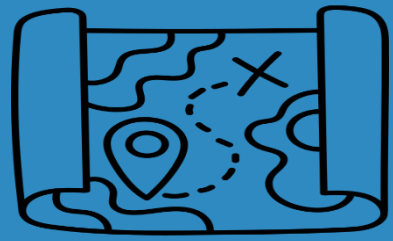

What did you notice about what scares you more — things outside of you or inside you?





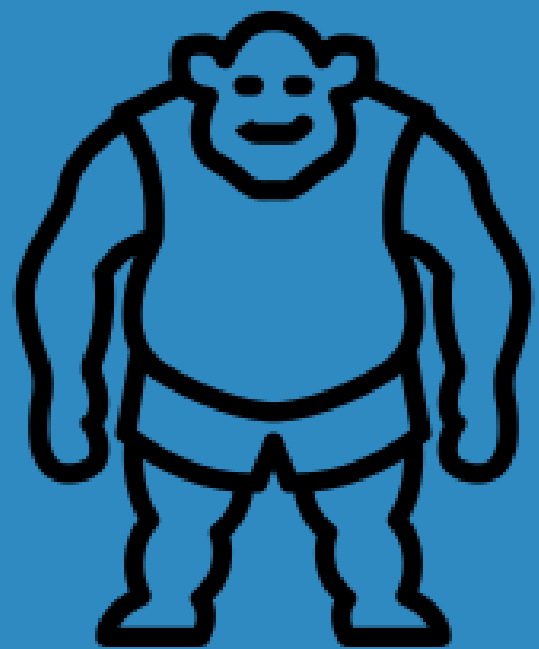

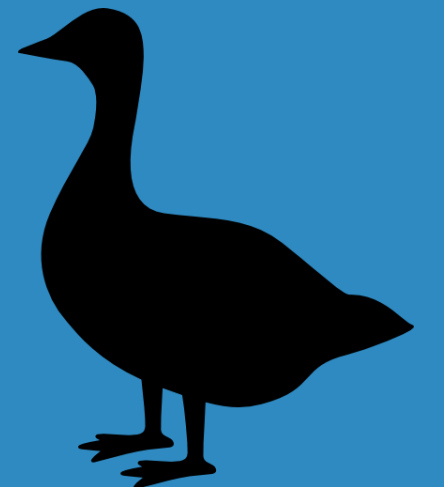


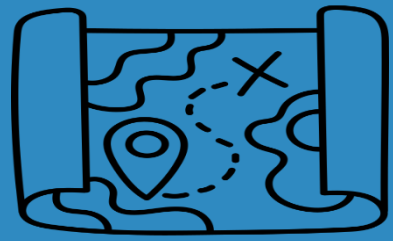
The Treasure

Jack is now a hero, having transformed from a naive boy into a brave and resourceful young person who has overcome incredible odds.



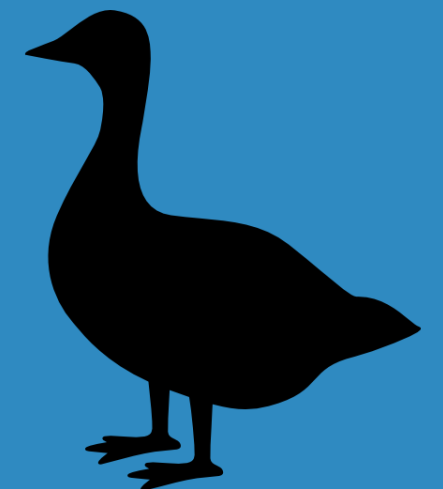

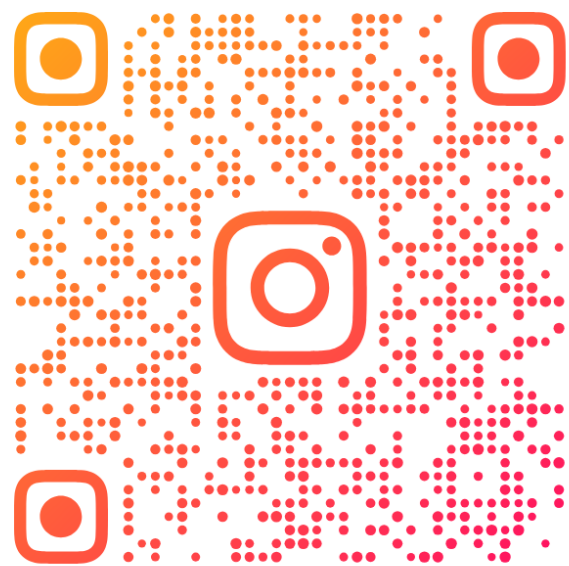
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
