A WORD FROM PASTOR MIKE: “WONDERFULLY MADE”

“For it was you who formed my inward parts; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; that I know very well. My frame was not hidden from you, when I was being made in secret, intricately woven in the depths of the earth. Your eyes beheld my unformed substance. In your book were written all the days that were formed for me, when none of them as yet existed. How weighty to me are your thoughts, O God! How vast is the sum of them!”

(Psalm 139:13-17)

In making the human race, God has invented a marvelous system of making. As created beings, we come from a long line of made - makers. We are produced beings who reproduce beings. Procreated - procreators. Birthed - birthers. And it's important to notice that all over this system of making we find the fingerprints of God. The Bible is very careful to teach us that we are not just born at the end of an assembly line. We are not some “end result” in a long line of results. We are not an “N” made by an “M” or a “W” made by a “V.” We are all created A's. We are just as created by God as our first parents. It was God who formed our inward parts and knit us together in our mother's womb. We are not just mechanically and redundantly reproduced. We are fearfully and wonderfully *made*.



CELEBRATE RECOVERY — IT'S A FAMILY AFFAIR FOR FEBRUARY

For adults in recovery, it becomes evident that our children are being affected by our hurts, habits, and hang-ups. Our children become confused and worried about us because by the nature of our addictions our relationships with them suffer and their self-image may suffer as well. February 2020, Valentine's month, is a great time to lovingly address those concerns.

Celebration Station is the children's curriculum for Celebrate Recovery geared for children 5-13 years of age. It is a place where our children can experience the love of Jesus as they learn how to love themselves and others while they grow their own relationship with God. They also learn healthy coping skills for life's tough lessons.

The children enjoy a meal with all of the people attending Celebrate

Recovery. This is an important time with the grownups because the children can see all of us fellowshiping together in a fun and relaxed atmosphere. They then have a period of supervised free play. (You should see them on the playground in warmer weather! We get to watch from the Fellowship Hall as they play. It's pretty inviting!) After a time of connecting with God through worship, the leaders present recovery principles and Biblical truths in ways that they can understand. The children are helped to identify their feelings and the reasons why they feel the way they do. Many times, it's difficult for our kids to talk about these things with us but by expressing them to other kids they find that they are not alone; not the “only ones.” Throughout the time spent

together there may be games, activities, crafts or stories that underscore the mainpoint of the lesson and they also have the opportunity to share their prayer requests and learn to pray for each other's. At the end of the evening the leaders will review the main points of the lesson.

In our recovery, we often try to protect our children from our weaknesses. Celebrate Recovery provides a way to help them understand that there are answers to their questions and insecurities. It helps us include them in our fight. Recovery IS a February family affair. Celebrate recovery meets at Chapel Hill from 5-7 every Monday except for holidays. A nursery is provided.
