LOVE OFFERING NOVEMBER 10TH

Christian Community Outreach was first founded in 1986 by local churches in the area to provide those in need with food and other basic necessities. It has grown into a foundation that helps with

rent and utilities for those who cannot afford it. It's Mission is to be a special ministry created to respond with dignity and concern to persons who have urgent needs for food, housing, and medicines, not being met. Through August, the agency has provided food boxes to 3,332 Henderson County families (feeding 6,470 adults and 2,812 children). They have assisted 232 families with utilities (\$23,000+), 180 families with rent (\$18,000), 38 clients with medicine, and 47 clients with emergency gas to take loved ones out of town for doctor visits.






CELEBRATE RECOVERY—FOR STUDENTS THE LANDING

The Landing is Celebrate Recovery's student ministry geared toward Junior High and High School age students. This curriculum is designed to mirror the same material as the adult Celebrate Recovery curriculum, only packaged for students The pressures that are put on the modern preteen and teenager can be overwhelming, as ca the additional expectations from adults and peers alike. Some are not equipped to adequately handle these pressures without help. Bullying, substance abuse, school anxieties and troubles at home add to the hopelessness ad pessimism that our sons and daughter, grandsons and granddaughters have trouble understanding; communicating those worries to someone who can help can be difficult. Recent studies are showing that self harm has increased dramatically in this age group. It is the 3rd leading cause of death between the ages of 15-24 and the 4th leading cause of death among 1- to 14 year old's. The need for a safe place to confront those issues is obvious. The Landing exists to provide and environment for our students to process life and the struggles that accompany it, provide tools to help them live emotionally and spiritually healthy lives and point towards freedom found in Jesus Christ.

Following a fellowship meal, a typical night in the Landing will consist of:

- Connect Time—Serves to create connection between our students and teachers. Usually involves a game or activity.
- 2. Worship—Gives our students an opportunity to connect and rest in God.
- 3. Teaching Time—Leaders present biblical truths and recovery principles that they can apply to their lives



Through the Landing, this 60minute program allows our students to have that safe place to find help, hope and healing through engaging the recovery principles and growing in a relationship with Jesus Christ. Ultimately, this ministry can help students learn how to break cycles of dysfunction and provide tools for them to live free and healthy lives.

Celebrate Recovery meets at Chapel Hill from 5pm—7pm every Monday except for holidays.
