Violin Posture Checklist

Bow Hand

- 1. Thumb is bent using the tip of the thumb
- 2. Fingers wrapped around stick & frog with pinkie finger on top for balance
- 3. Hand is angled counter clockwise so that the index finger may apply pressure

Left Hand

- 4. Violin is placed over the shoulder enough with end button pointing at throat; ensure that both shoulders are relaxed and the scroll is not rising up higher than the other end of the violin
- 5. Thumb is placed at the side of the neck generally beside the first finger, or slightly closer to the nut than where the first finger lands. Don't grip too tightly.
- 6. Elbow is under the violin and the wrist is out to approximately flat with fingers curved above the strings over where they are to land

Please make a lost of goals you want to achieve every month and by the end of the year. Here's a few to get started.

Practicing

You should practice every day for_____ minutes. I suggest practicing while your parents are making dinner.

Your practice regime should cover your most recent violin goals. If we did not have enough time in your last lesson to do all of your repertoire, you should keep practicing the other tunes and exercises you have worked on over the past month or so. I suggest:

If you have an area of a tune (a lick) or a phrase that needs improvement, focus on repeating those bars of music ______ times.

If you are playing a fairly short tune, you should play it three times in a row as to re-enforce the accuracy and memory.

When you come to your lesson, please get your violin out ahead of time so I can tune it as soon as you walk in the studio. Doing so will give you more instruction time, for a half hour lesson goes by very quickly and I can't go over time when I have back to back students.

Please ensure to remember your music books and put your <u>name</u> on them. Although I will occasionally provide photocopy sheets for you, this is a supplement to your legal books.

Finally, please keep any sheets I give to you in a binder or folder so they don't get lost.
