Who may compete: Open to the public. Ages 12 though 17 may only compete with parents present at the firing point.

Range Location:

Clay County Outdoor Adventure Park

Firearms: Competitor supplied. Any center fire pistol or revolver –Iron sights ONLY – **NO OPTICS**

Ammunition: 30 rounds. 9mm/.38 Cal through .45 cal. Ball, wadcutter/semi wadcutter only. **No tracer, incendiary or armor-piecing ammo allowed.**

Targets: NRA Official B-8 25 yd Timed & Rapid Bullseye. Distance 25 yards.



Spotting Scopes: The use of telescopes to spot slow fire shots or between TF & RF strings is allowed.

Eye & Ear Protection: Hearing protection is required. Eye protection is highly recommended.

Course of Fire: Modified National Match Course containing one string of slow fire, two strings of timed fire and two strings of rapid fire.

10 Rounds, 10 minutes Slow Fire

Two (2) five-round strings, 20 Seconds, Timed Fire

Two (2) five-round strings, 10 Seconds, Rapid-Fire

There will be a pause between each Timed and Rapid-Fire string for reloading.

Competitors are required to always use empty chamber indicators, except when in their prep period and live fire stages.

Conduct of Fire: Shooters may use one or two hands as they wish, but no artificial support may be used. Shooters will start the Timed & Rapid Strings from the low ready position with the shooting arm lowered to a 45 degree angle. You may raise and fire on the commence fire command or audible signal. Rounds fired after cease fire will be counted as misses deducting the highest shot of a 10 round string.

Low Ready Position: – keep muzzle forward of bench.
