

Assisted Living Activity Program Training

Planning and Providing Quality Group and Individual Programming for Assisted Living Residents

Approved by the **Virginia Department of Social Service - Division of Licensing Programs** and meets the requirements of 22VAC 40-73-1120 F 5 of *Standards for Licensed Assisted Living Facilities*. This **40-hour curriculum** provides guidance for the person or persons managing or coordinating the structured activity program of the special care unit of an assisted living facility. These sessions are held via online ZOOM classrooms. Good internet connection, computer audio AND video required. Camera will be needed during the course. Frequent polling and attendance tracking is conducted each day.

Attendance for the full class each day is required for issuance of certificate.

This course will explore the standards related to activities, both in a typical Assisted Living setting and in a Special Care Unit of an Assisted Living Facility. Areas of focus include: the benefits and types of adult group activities; recognizing and assessing the activity needs of the resident; dementia and other types of cognitive impairment; techniques to assist with communication, behavior management approaches and therapeutic interventions; calendar and program planning and preparation.

Classroom materials will be provided after registration; a **certificate of completion** will be awarded at the end of the course.
