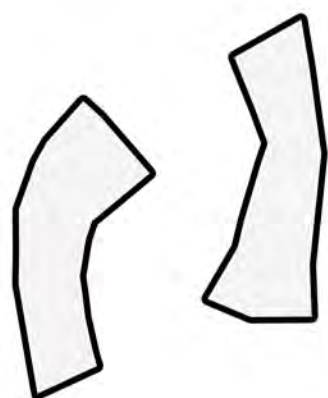


Make Abraham

Abraham's sleeves,



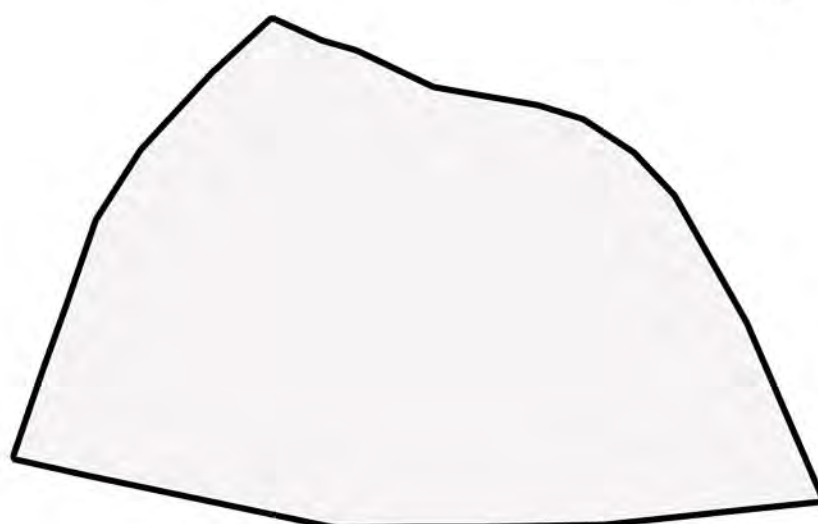
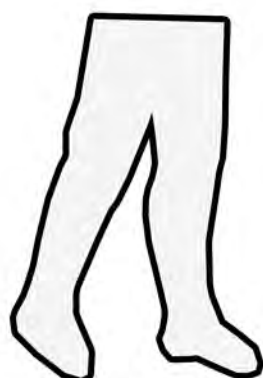
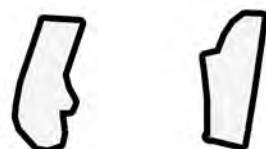
and of course brown for their body parts.

Instructions

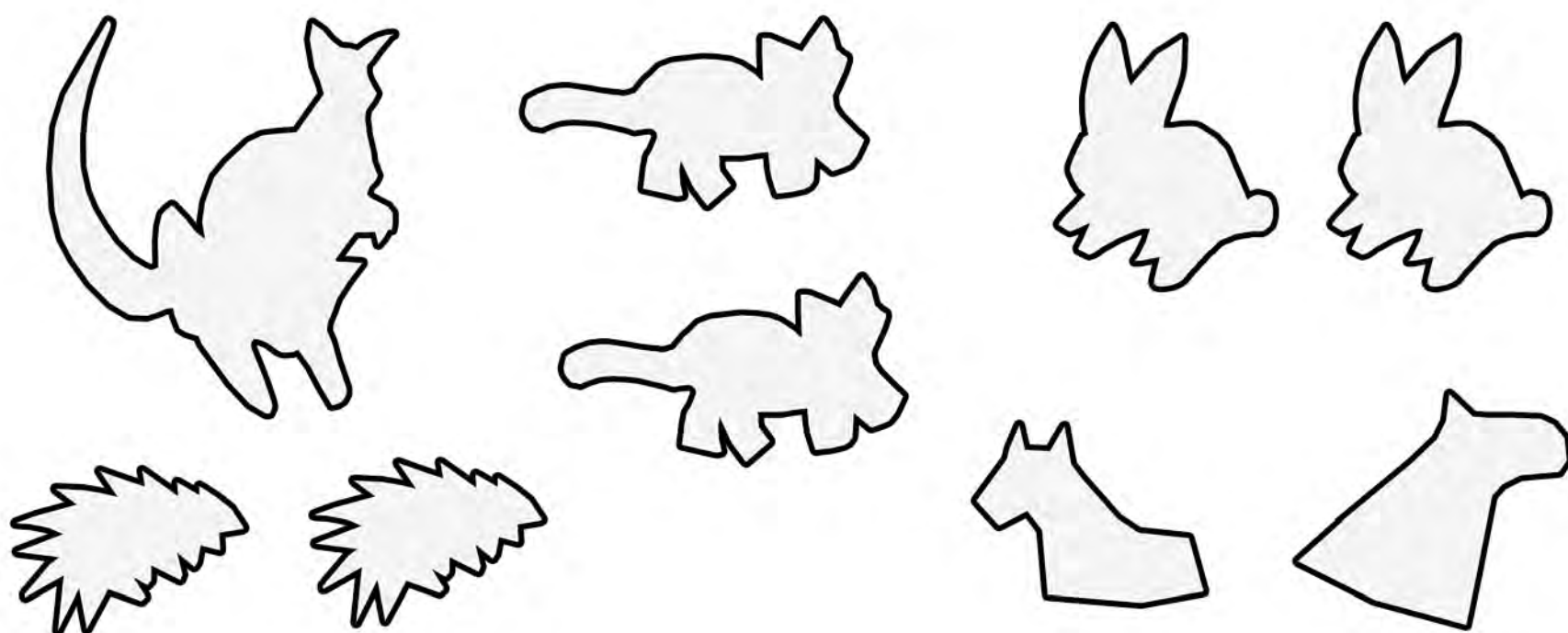
1. Cut shapes and tape Abraham's sleeves to back of his tunic.
2. Glue body parts to backs of clothes and Sarah's hands to her front.
3. Now assemble and paste main shapes and text blocks to page.
4. Finally stick 12 stars up in the sky to represent the 12 tribes of Israel.



Make ark

God sent a flood and told Noah to save two of every animal on a very large ark.

Use patterns and bright colors for the animals,



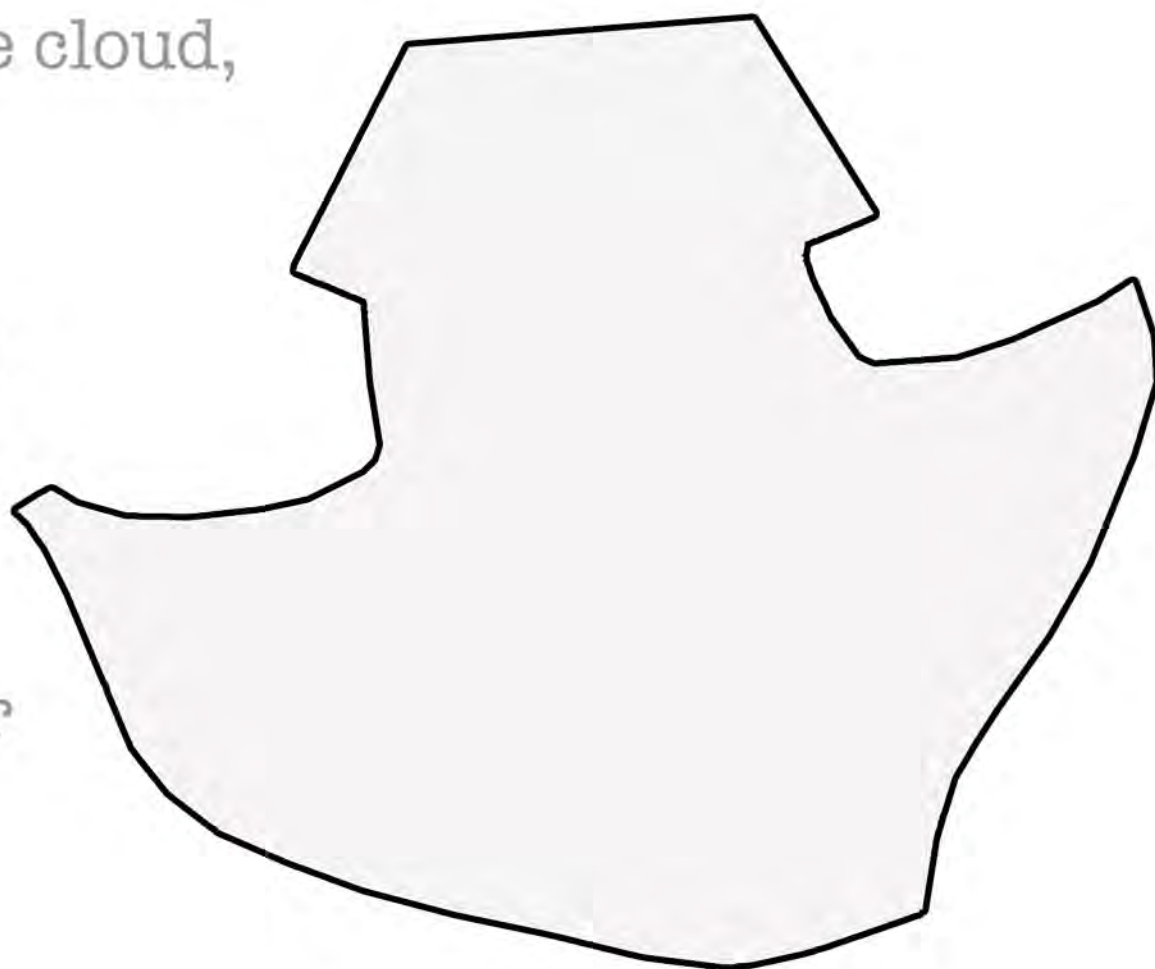
something brown or wood-effect for the ark,

and blue for

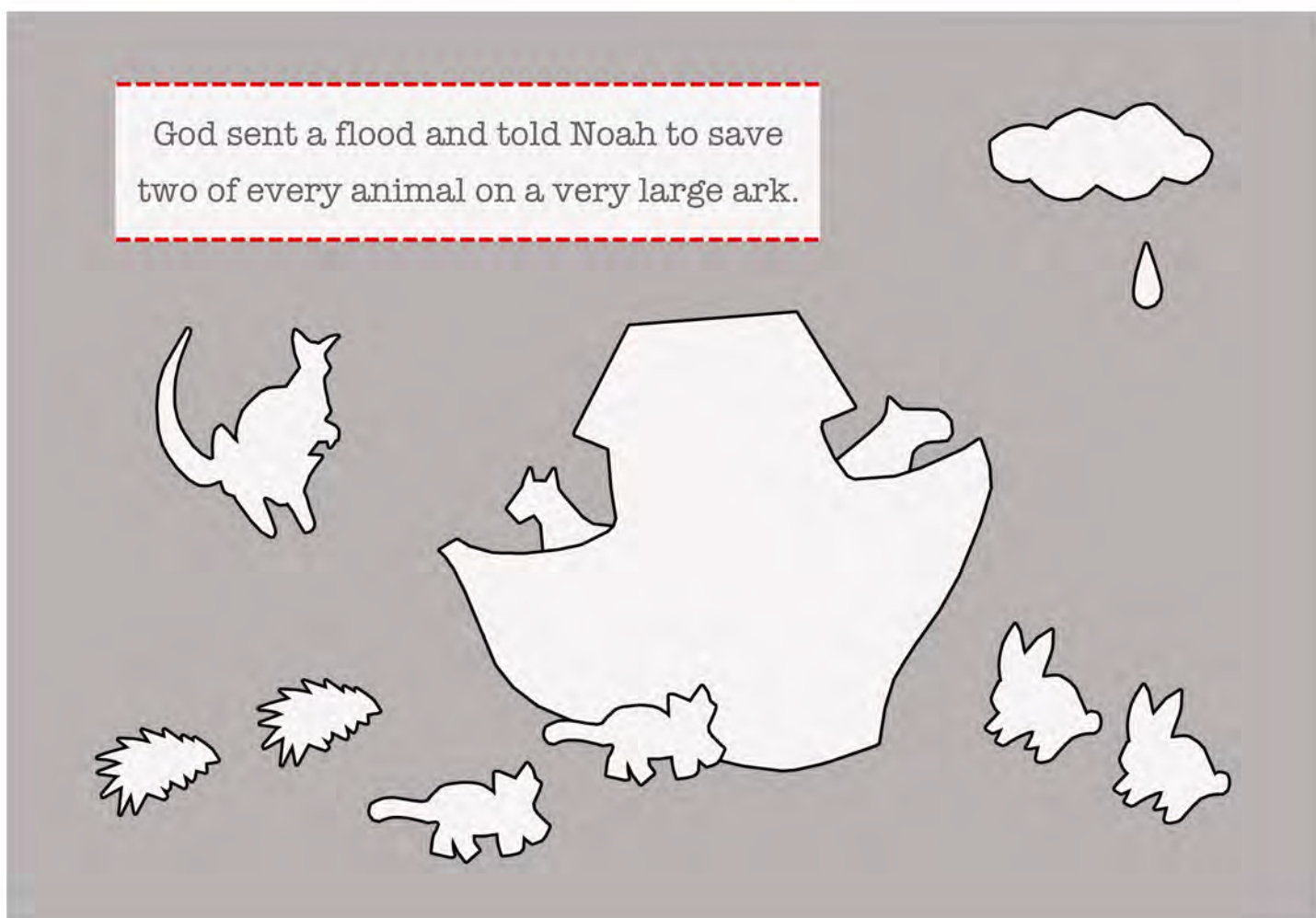


the drop.



Instructions

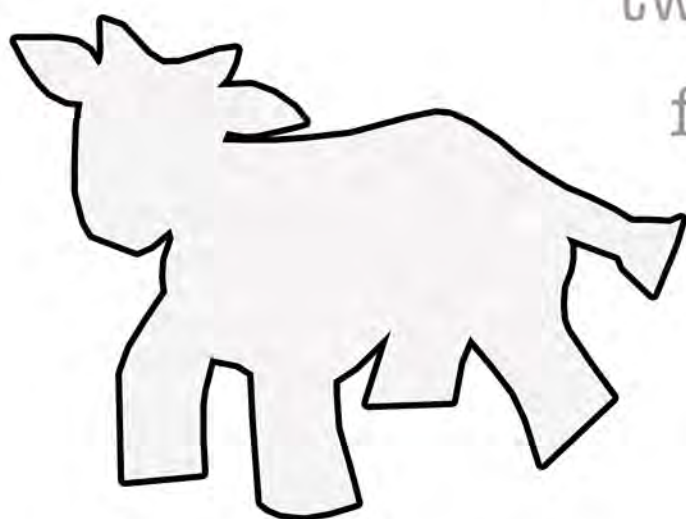
1. Tape and cut shapes from papers of your choice.
2. Be especially careful when cutting the hedgehogs and the kangaroo -- and make sure you keep your workspace tidy so that you don't lose any of the animals.
3. Tape or glue the dog and horse to the back of the ark.
4. Paste the words and shapes as shown, or arrange them how you think the scene should look.



Make calf

But the people grew grumpy

a golden calf they had made.

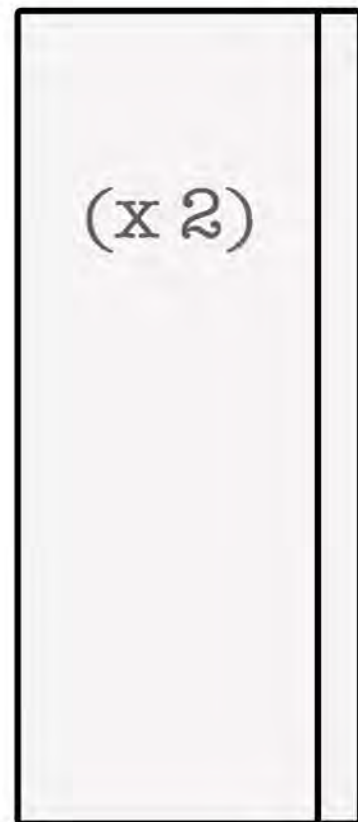
Use gold foil (candy wrapper) for the calf,

for each “flag” half,



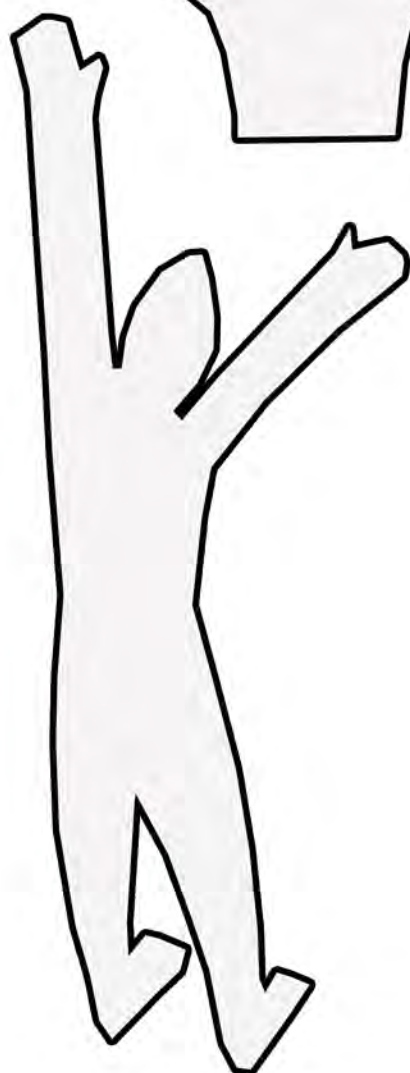

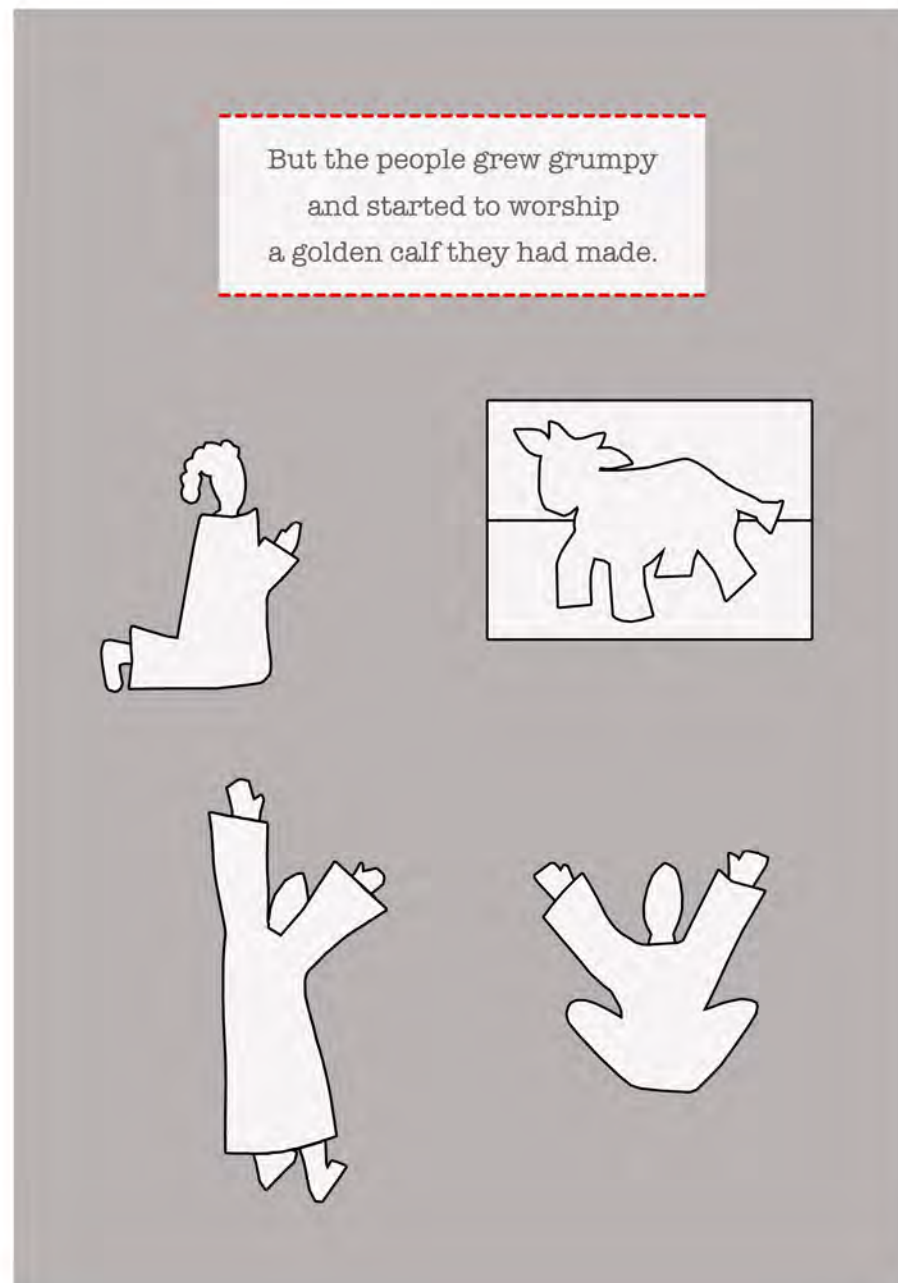

Instructions

1. First cut the figures' bodies from brown paper and their clothing from patterns or other papers.
2. Paste the clothes onto their bodies.
3. Cut two different rectangles, one slightly wider than the other, so that they overlap. Use solid colors or textures for these. Then tape them together to make a flag shape.
4. Carefully cut the calf from gold foil (or any kind of paper with gold in it), and paste and assemble the pieces as shown.



Make Commandments

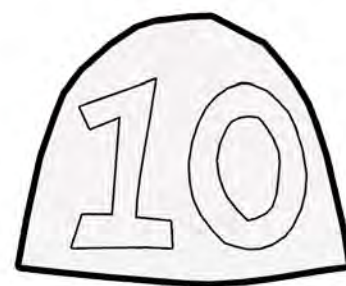

10. NO jealousy.



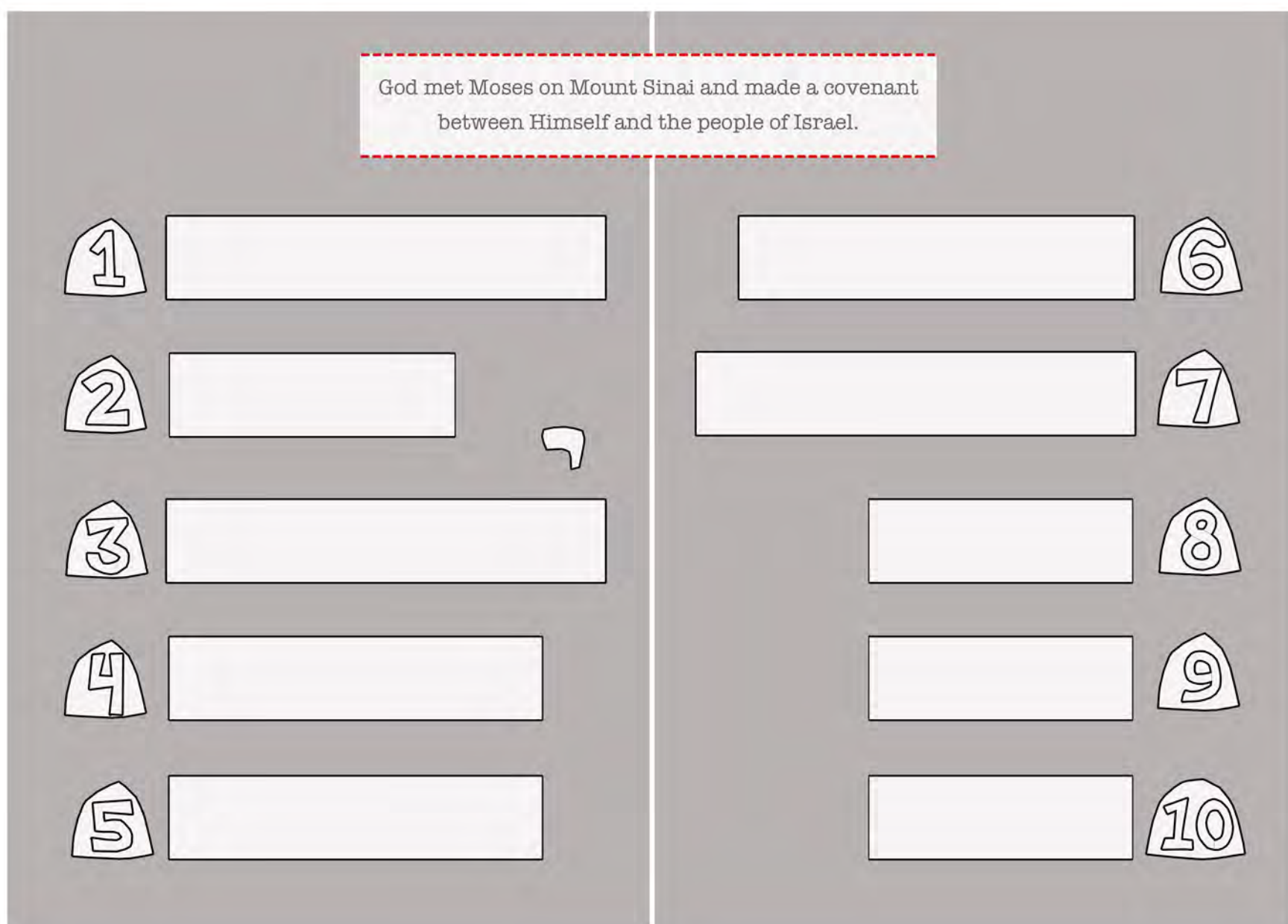
Then cut 10 strips of white or cream paper.



Make Commandments p. 2

Instructions

1. Cut all the shapes, making 9 of the smaller tablet and one of the wider one marked for "10".
2. Be careful when cutting numbers 6, 8, 9, and 10. They are marked with lines to follow to create the holes in each of them.
3. Paste the numbers onto the tablet pieces.
4. Write a Commandment on each piece of the white or cream paper, using markers or crayons.
5. Trim and paste everything as shown, or in a more free manner as seen in the original illustration. If you wish, decorate the page with other elements.



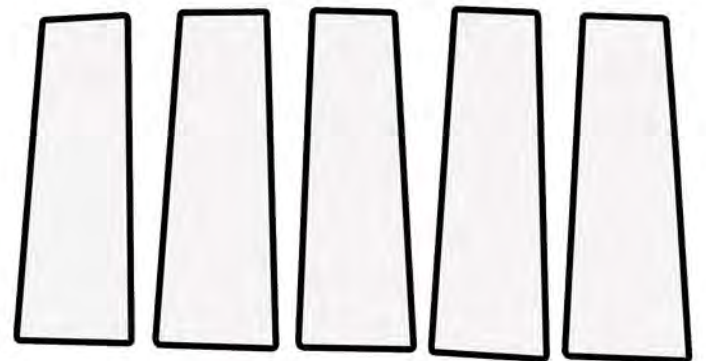
Make Daniel

The Greeks demanded that the Jews bow down to their many gods ... or die!

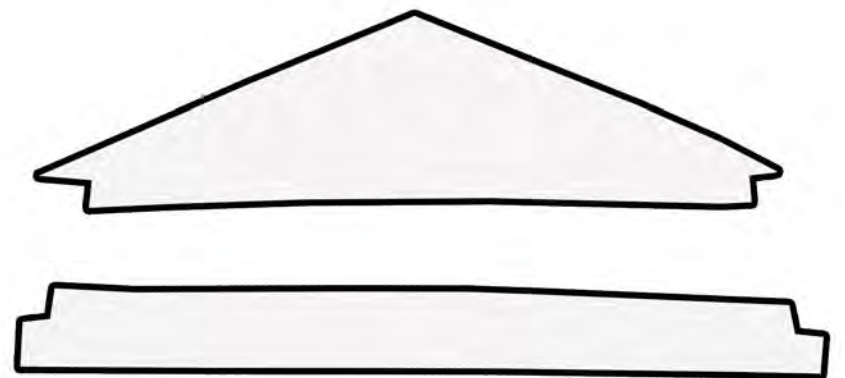
Even the jaws of hungry lions could not convert him and he passed through their den unscathed.

Use cream, marble,

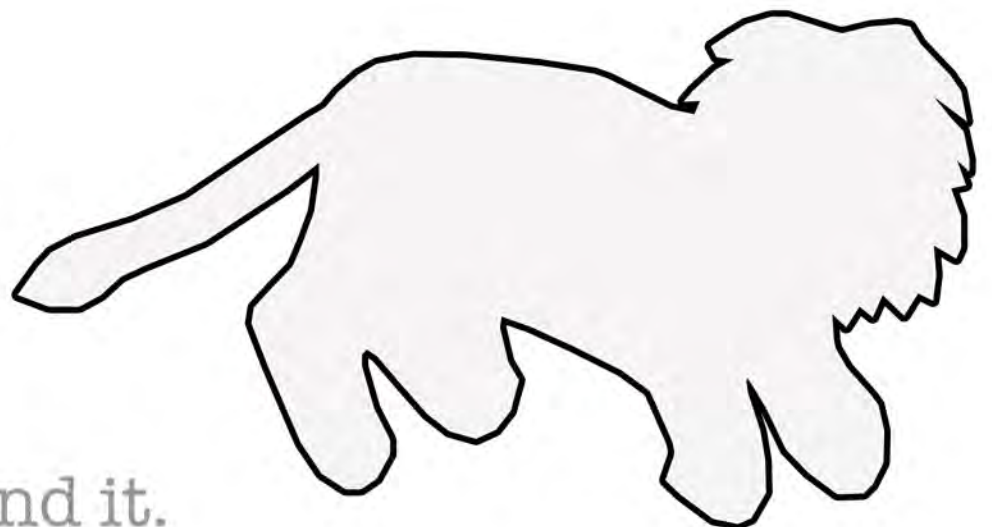


or texture for temple.



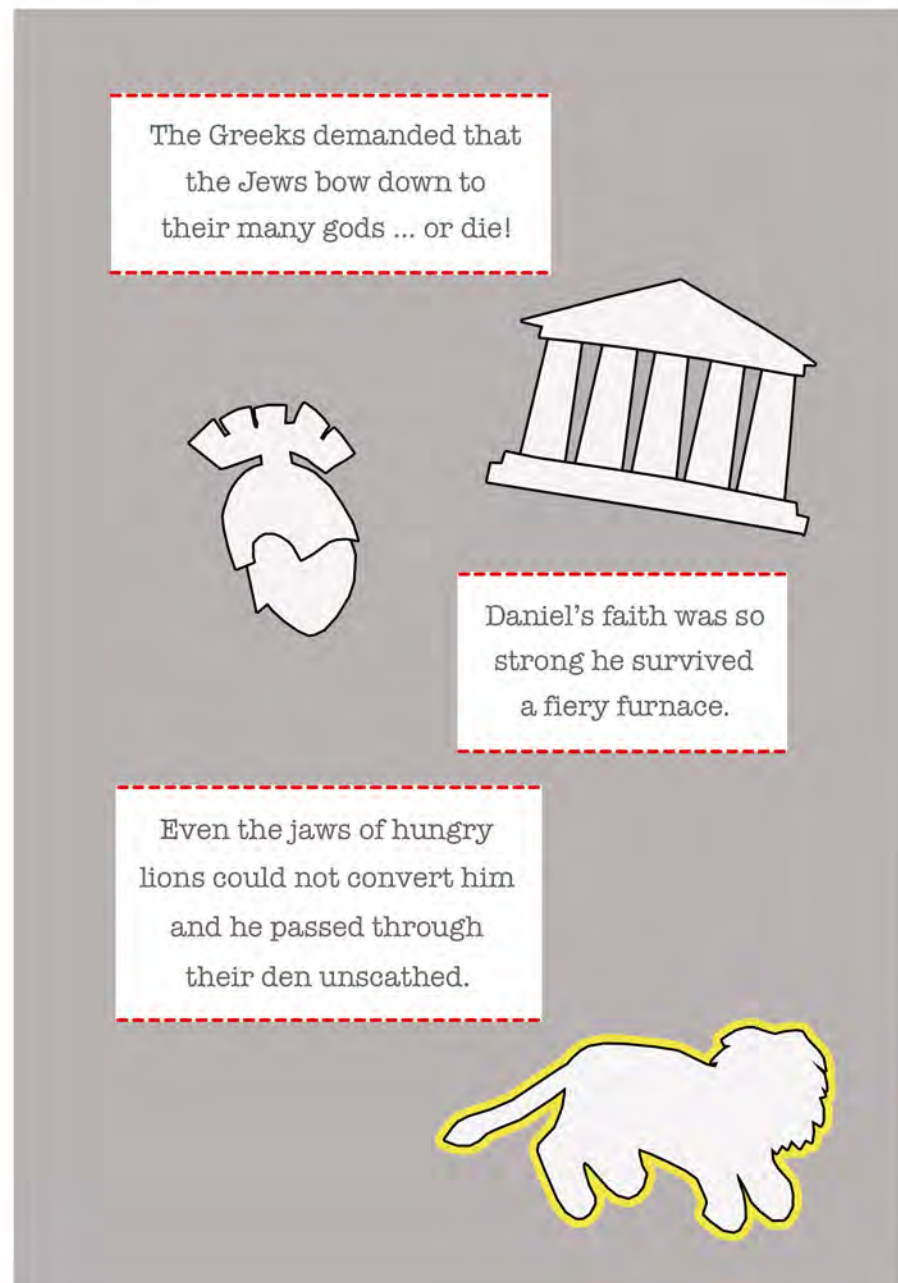
Cut Greek's helmet from a pattern,

and cut a border around it.



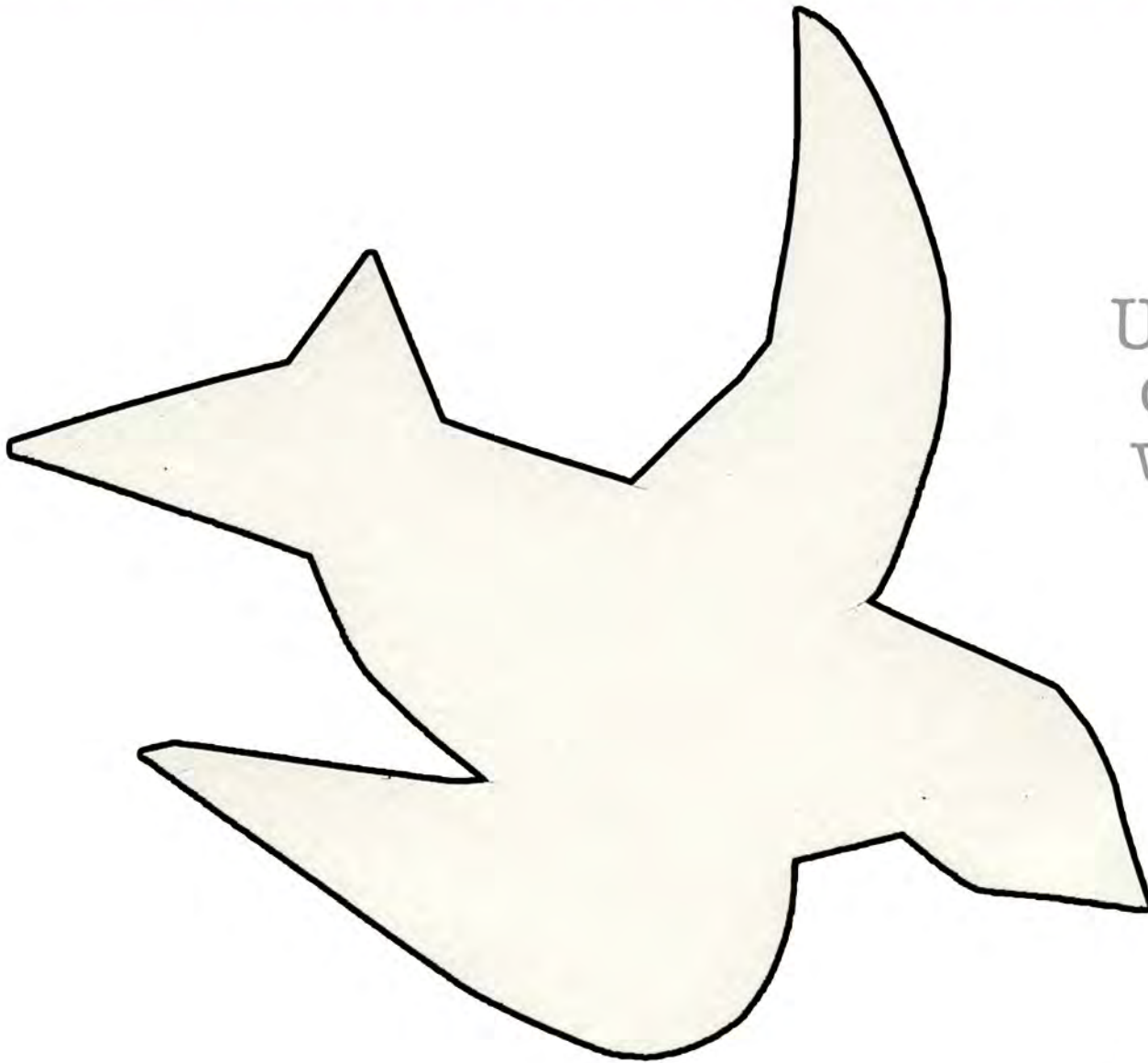
Instructions

1. Carefully cut the pieces, pasting the red lion to yellow paper and trimming a contoured border.
2. Paste the helmet onto the Greek's head.
3. Arrange the temple columns so that the widest ends are all at the bottom. Paste the outermost columns **behind** the top step of the bottom level. Center and paste the middle piece, followed by the last two pieces. Add the roof **over** the columns.
4. Paste all the pieces against a dark background.



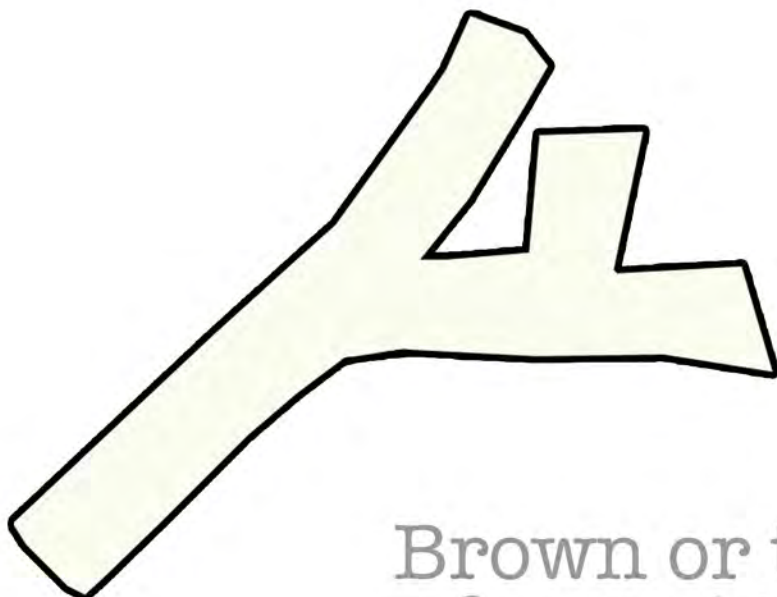
Make dove

“Noah sent a dove from the ark.”

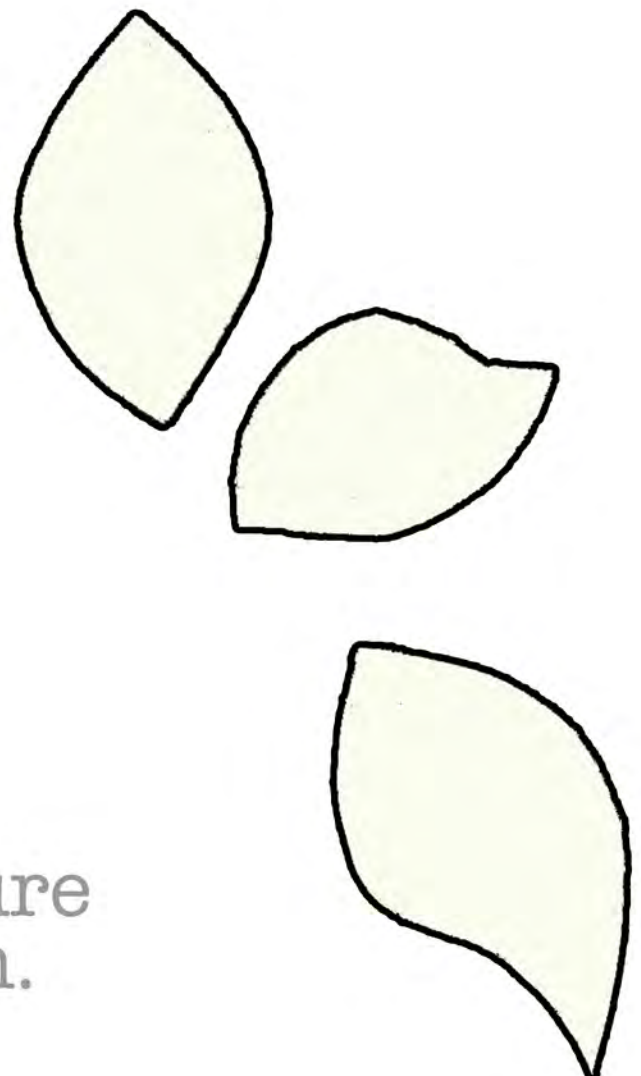


Use this piece

Instructions

1. Cut the dove, twig and leaves with the recommended papers.
2. Cut the text strip and trim as shown.
3. Follow the diagram below to lay out the pieces.
4. Trace a corner of each piece to mark where it will be pasted.
5. Paste the pieces in the following order: twigs, leaves, dove.

Make Eden

God also created a paradise,
a garden at a place called Eden.

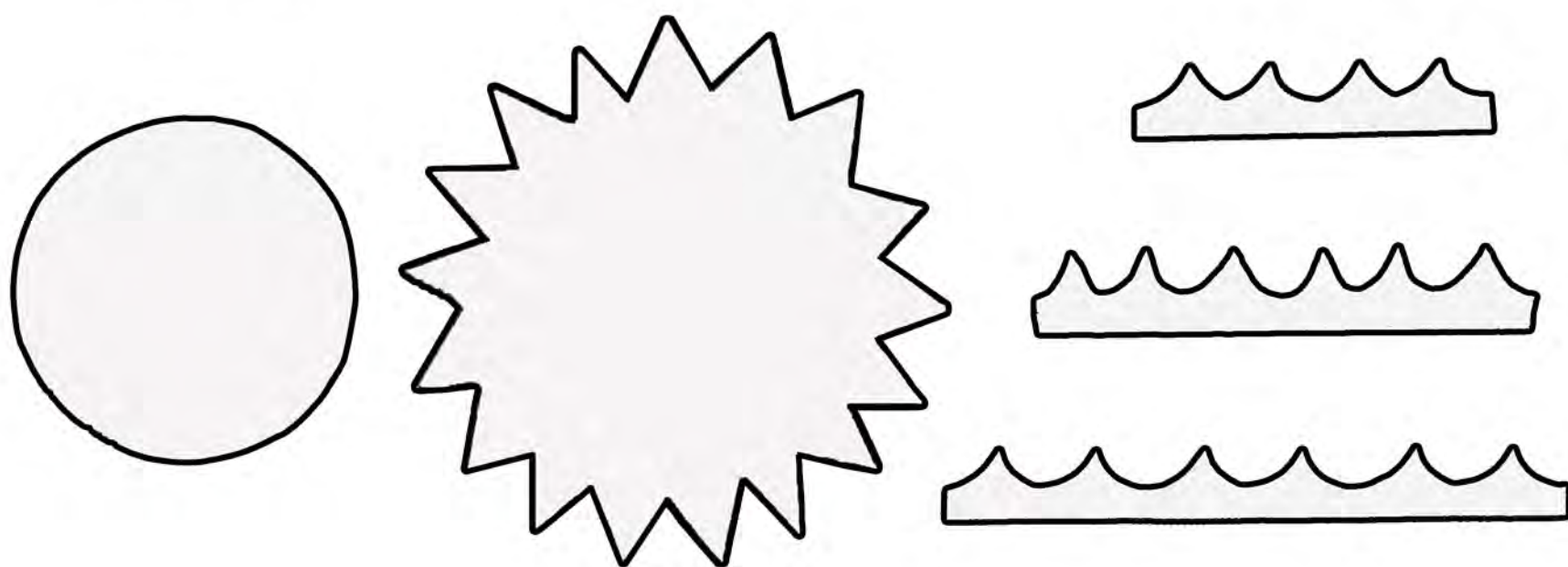
And God let the first man and the first woman live in it.

Use construction paper for the sun and water:

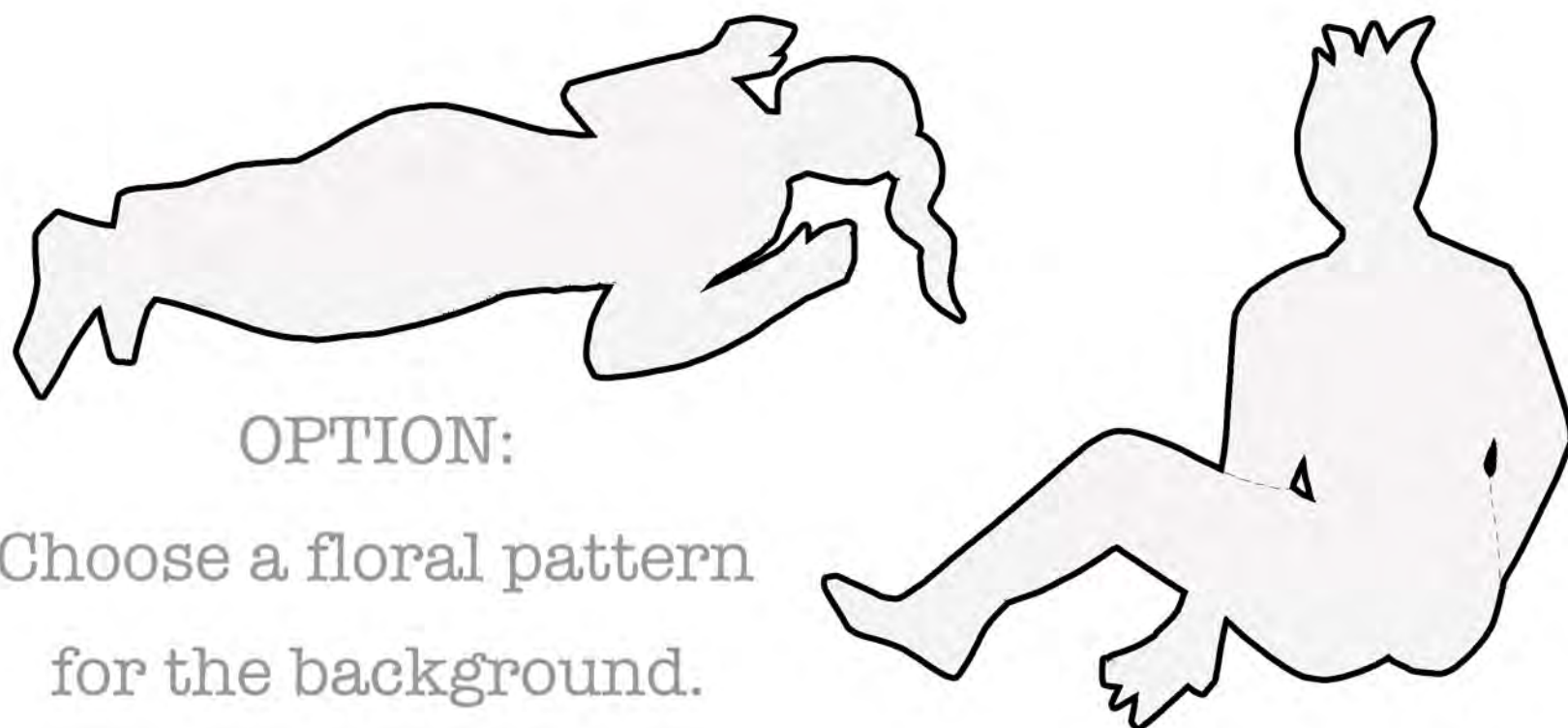

for Adam and Eve.

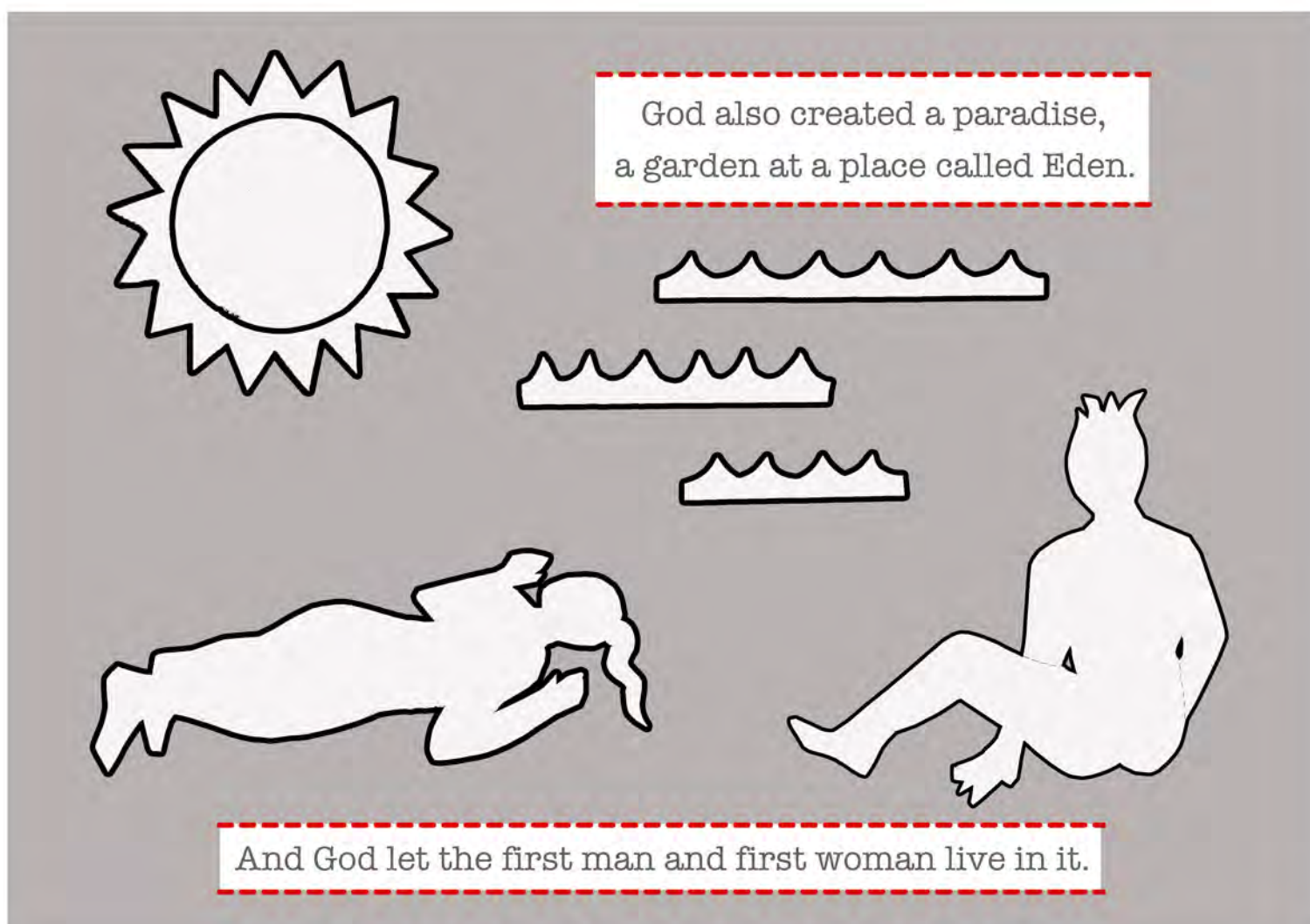


OPTION:

Instructions

1. Tape and cut shapes from suggested papers.
2. Follow the dotted lines to cut gaps between Adam's arms and body.
3. Paste the words and shapes as shown. OR ...
4. To make a more colorful paradise, cut and paste a piece of flowered paper slightly smaller than the background.
5. Center and paste this piece onto the background so that the background becomes a border to it. Then paste the words and shapes onto it.

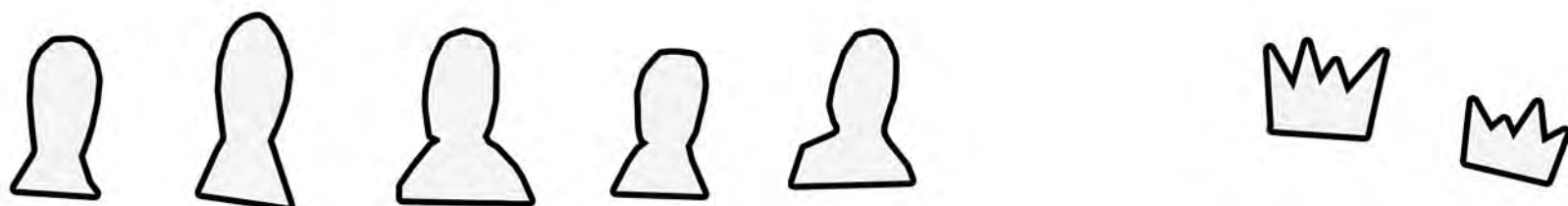


Make Exile

from home called the Exile.

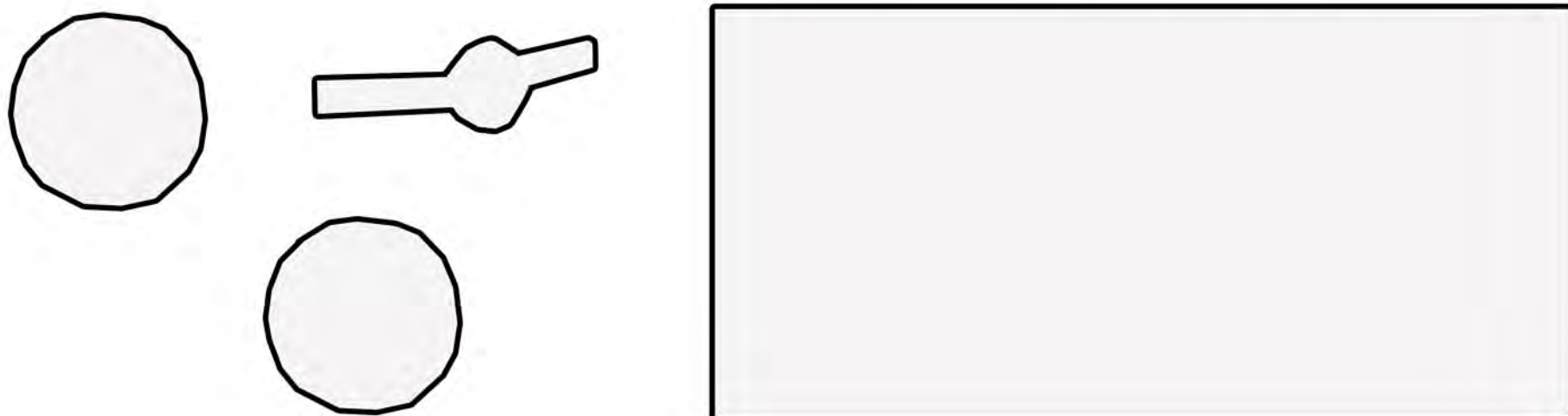
Use brown for heads and orange or gold for crowns.



Use newsprint or a dull color for prison clothes.



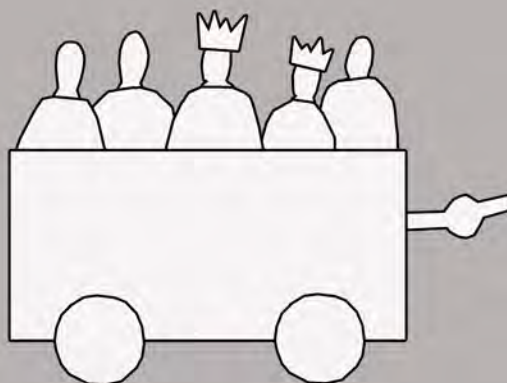
Choose your own colors and patterns for cart.



Instructions

1. Cut shapes, keeping track of which heads match the right cloaks.
2. Overlap the cloaks as shown, lining up the bottoms and securing this edge with tape at the front.
3. Paste heads and crowns to cloaks, and tape this and the hitch to back of cart.
4. Glue or paste big pieces to the paper, and add the wheels.

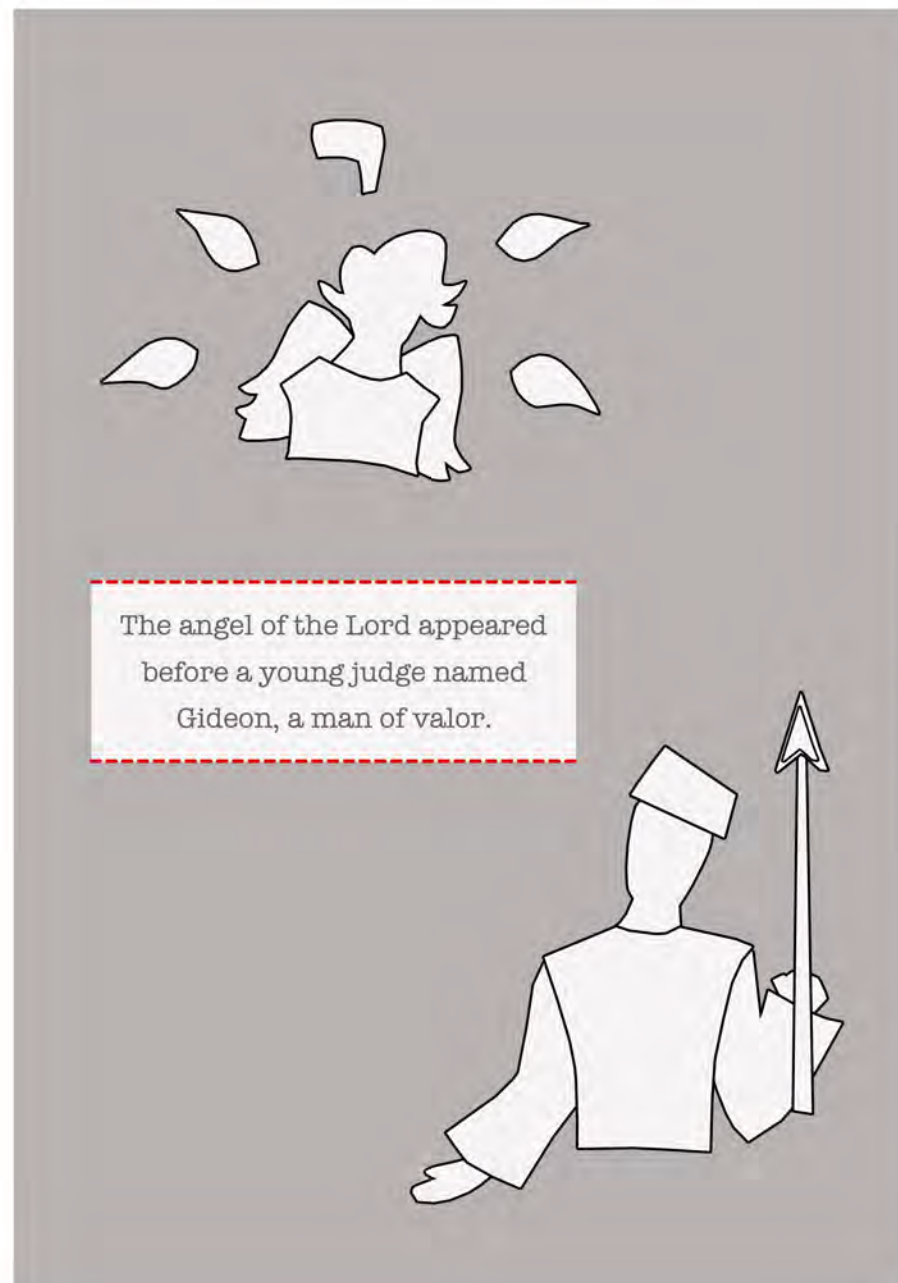

Instructions

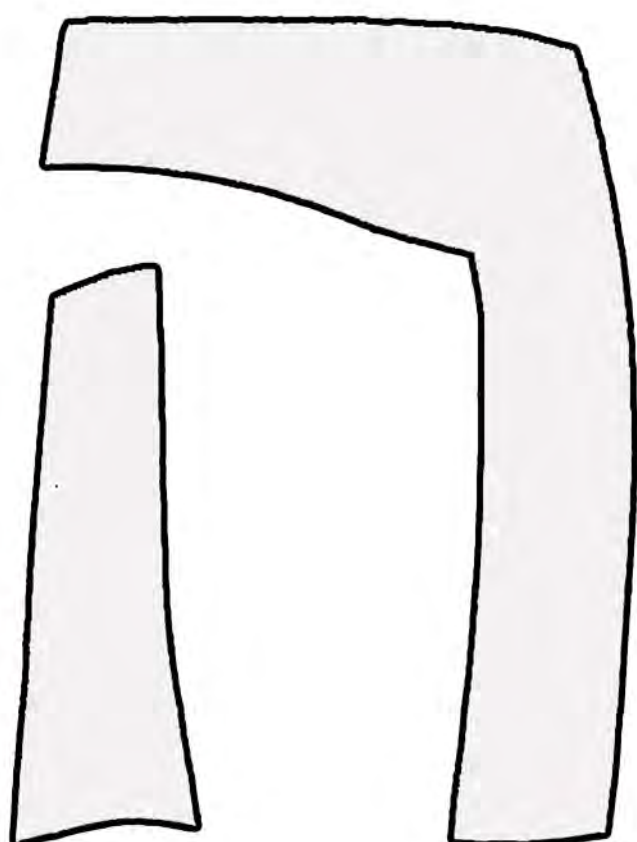
1. For a two-toned spearhead, cut the larger piece from cardstock and fold tin foil tightly over it. Then paste a smaller silver piece over it.
2. Paste the angel's shirt onto its head before attaching them to the wings. Likewise, paste Gideon's head to his tunic and cap before adding his sleeves and, lastly, his hands.
3. Assemble and glue the main pieces as shown. Then add the leaves and "yod".
4. Place and paste the spear last.



Make God's name

God's name is spelled with the Hebrew letters
for Y-H-W-H and read from right to left.

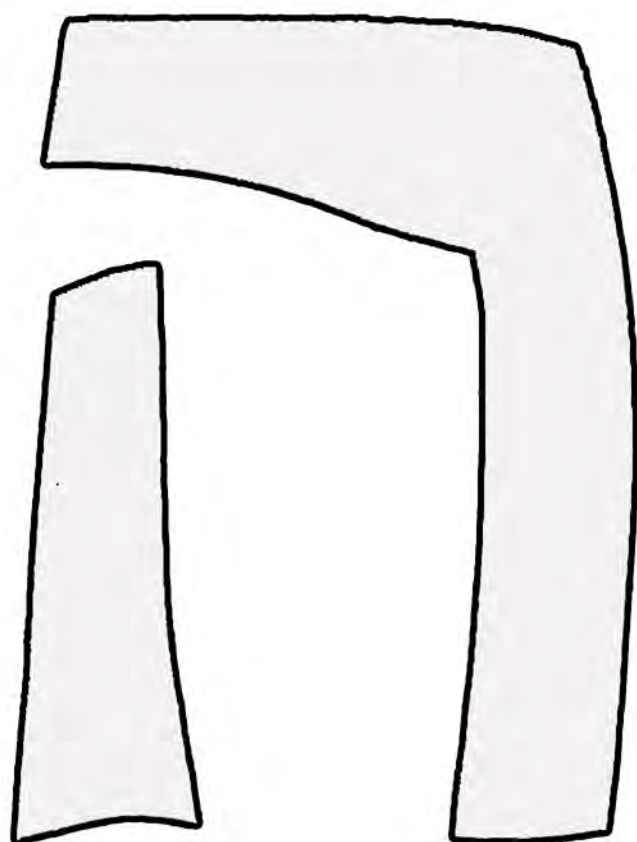
This sacred name comes from the word "to be".

Instructions

1. Cut out the sentences and the letters on the previous page. Leave space around each letter as you cut.
2. Tape each piece of letter to the front of the paper you are using for God's name.
3. Cut neatly along the shape of each letter -- cutting the two taped layers.
4. Arrange and glue the pieces as shown.

God's name is spelled with the Hebrew letters for Y-H-W-H and read from right to left.



This sacred name comes from the word "to be".

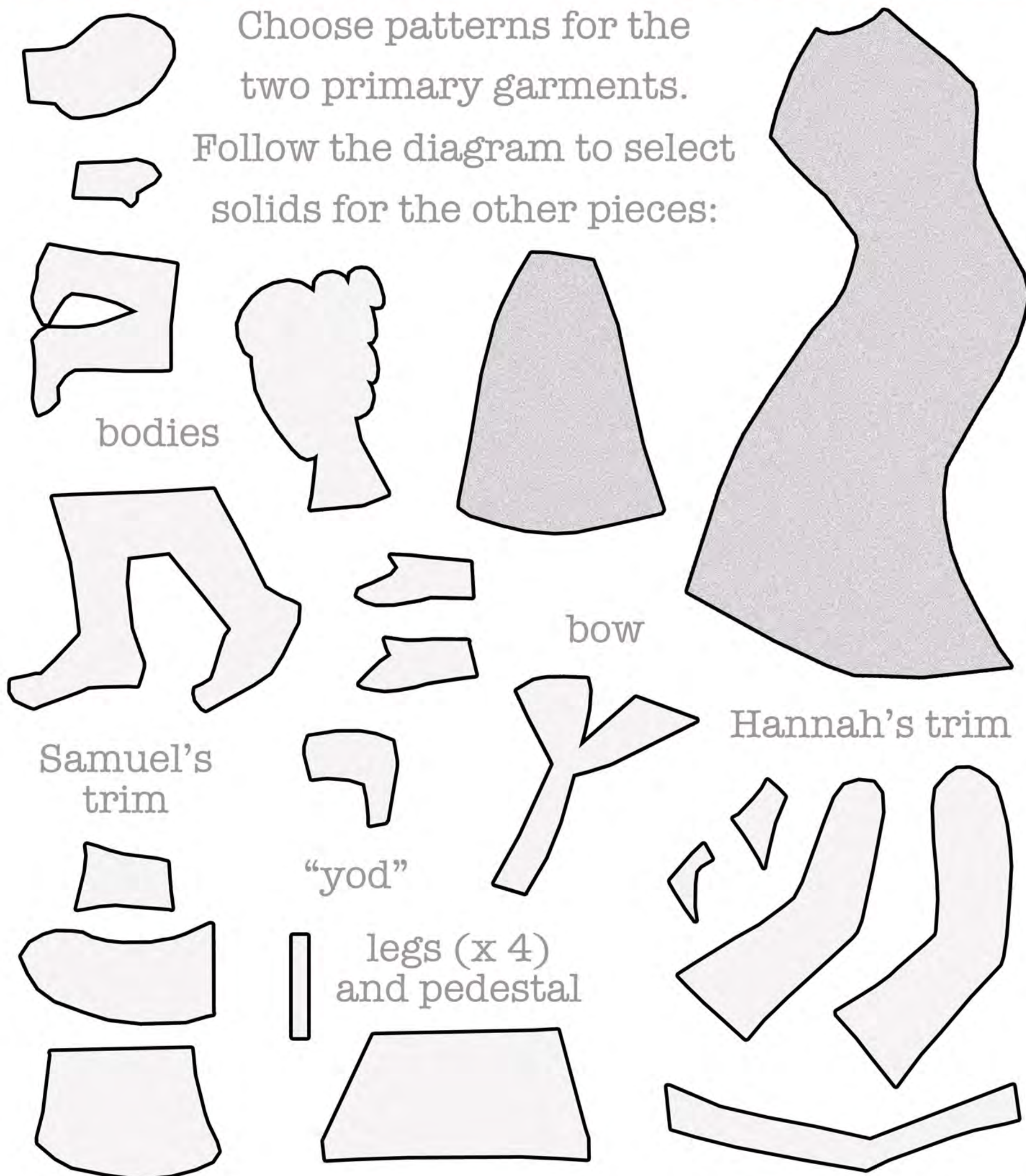
Make Hannah

Hannah dedicated his life to the Lord.

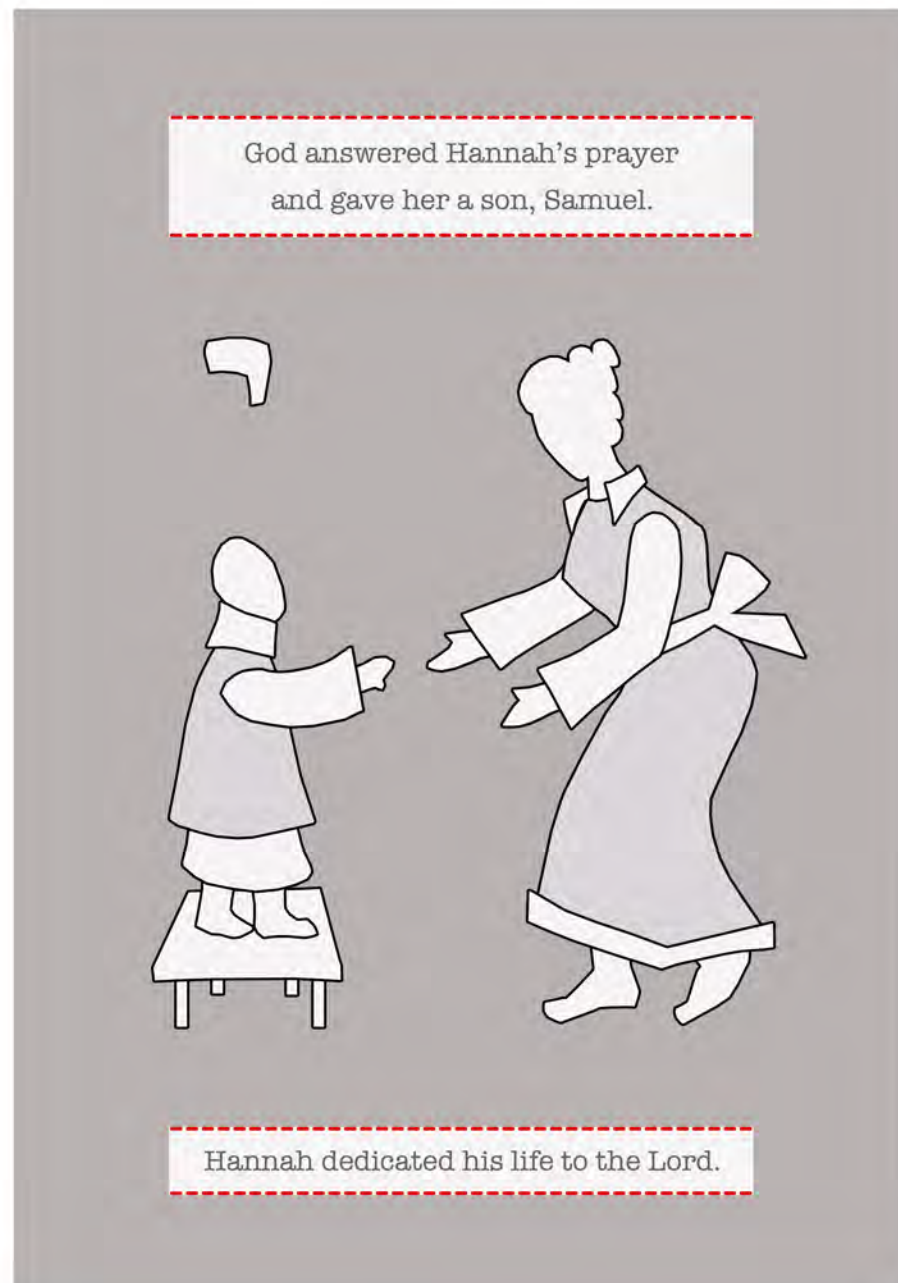
Choose patterns for the

Instructions

1. Carefully cut and lay out all the pieces.
2. Start by pasting the legs to the table. Then paste Samuel's head, collar, smock, skirt, and feet. Leave his arm and hand for the last step.
3. Now assemble and paste Hannah's bow, hem, and head to her dress. Then paste her feet, collar and arms, overlapping them as shown. The left piece of her collar will tuck behind her neck.
4. Finally arrange and paste the completed pieces, extending Samuel's arm towards his mother.



Make Jonah

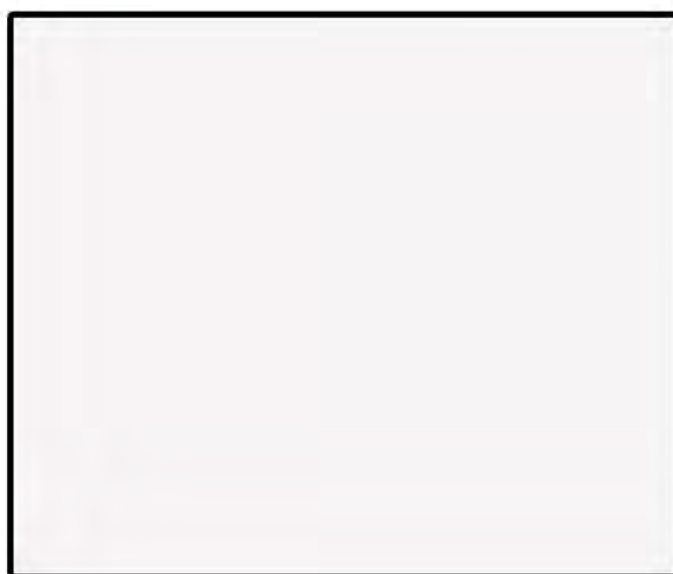
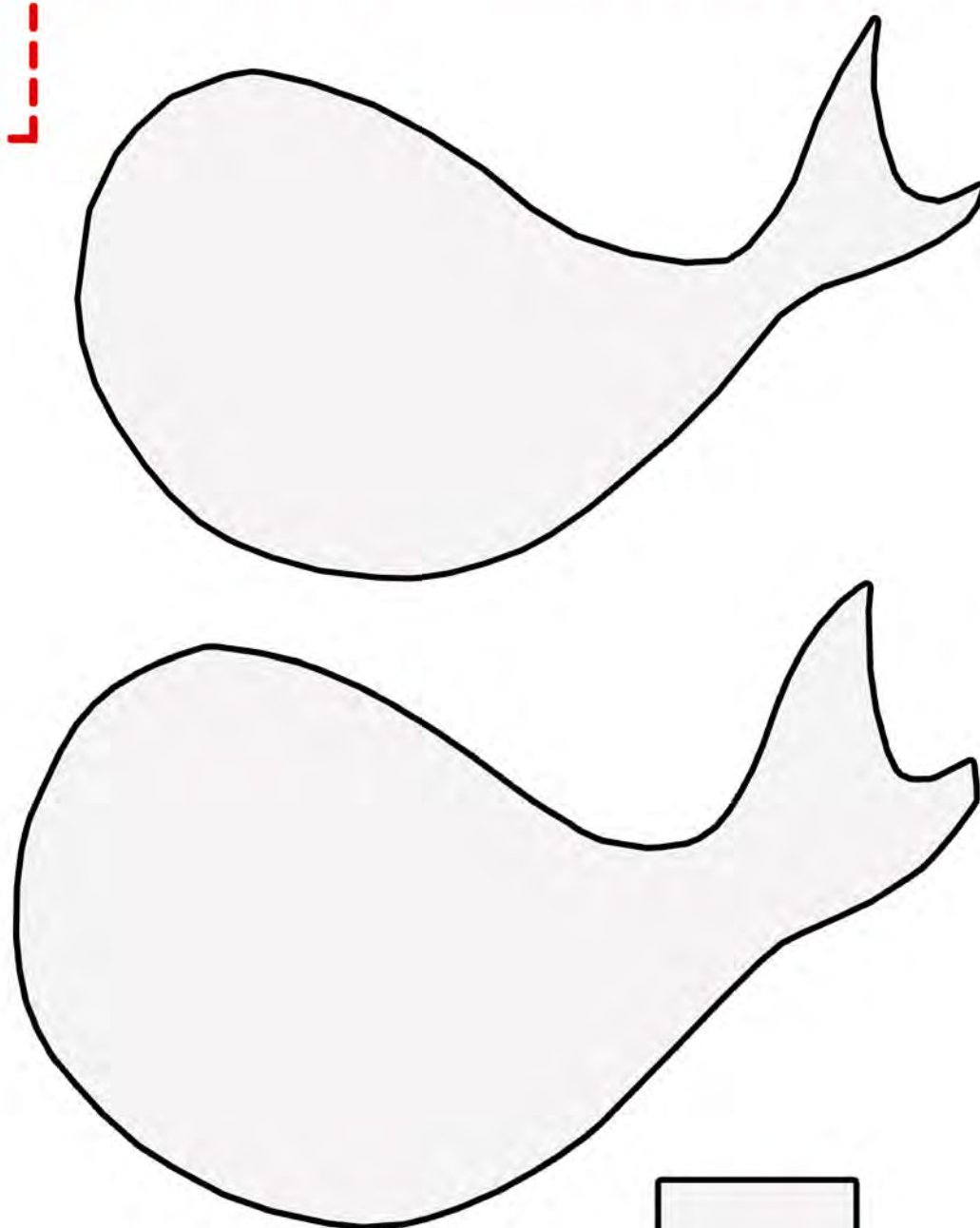

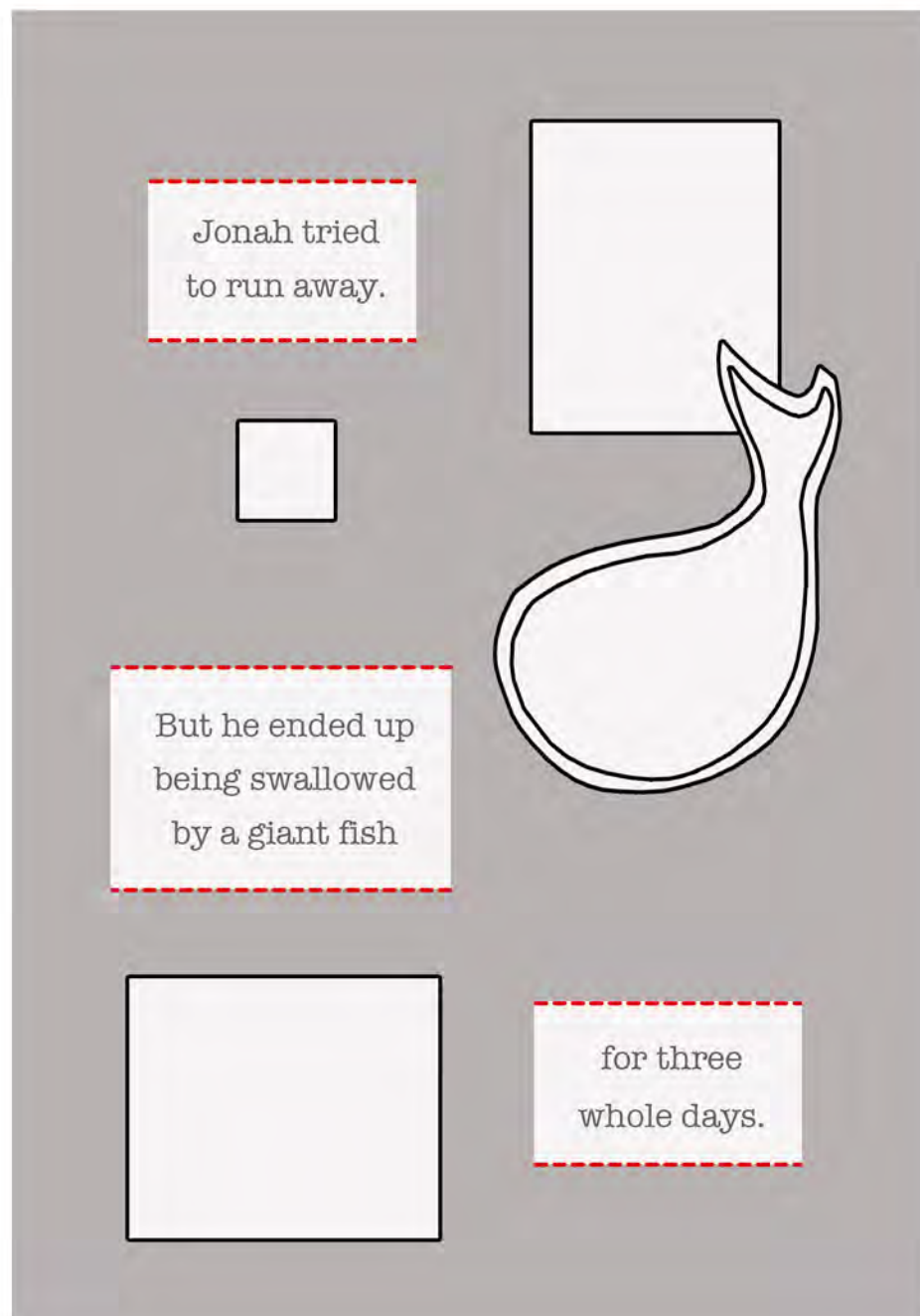

Instructions

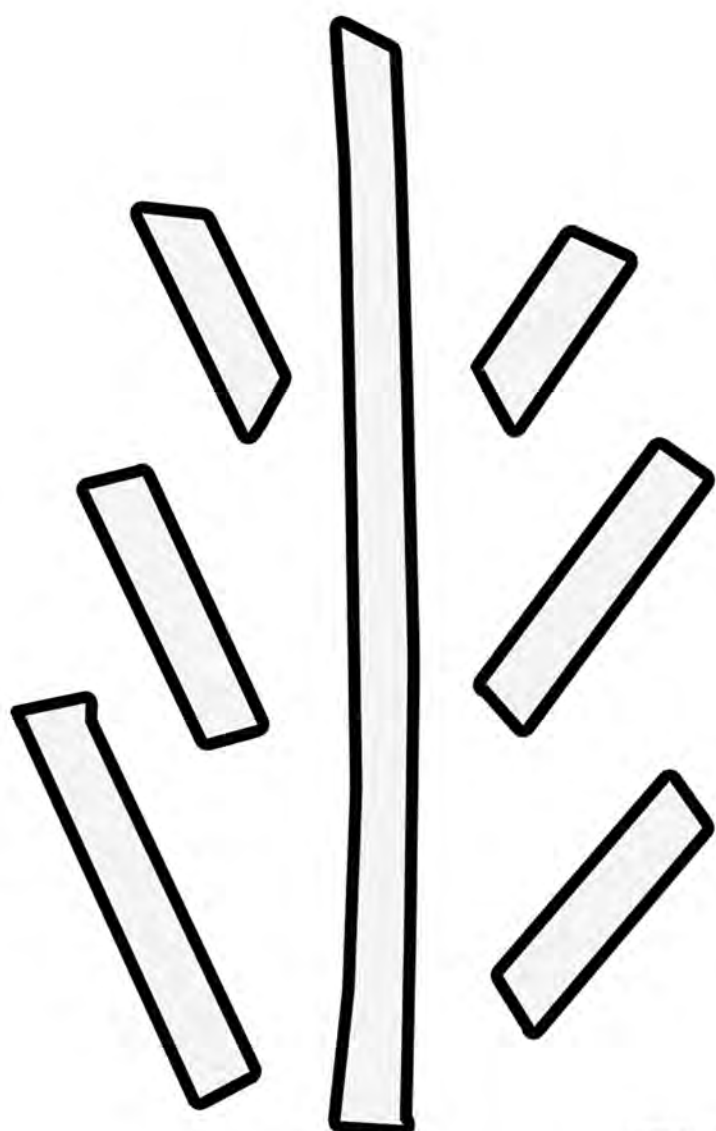
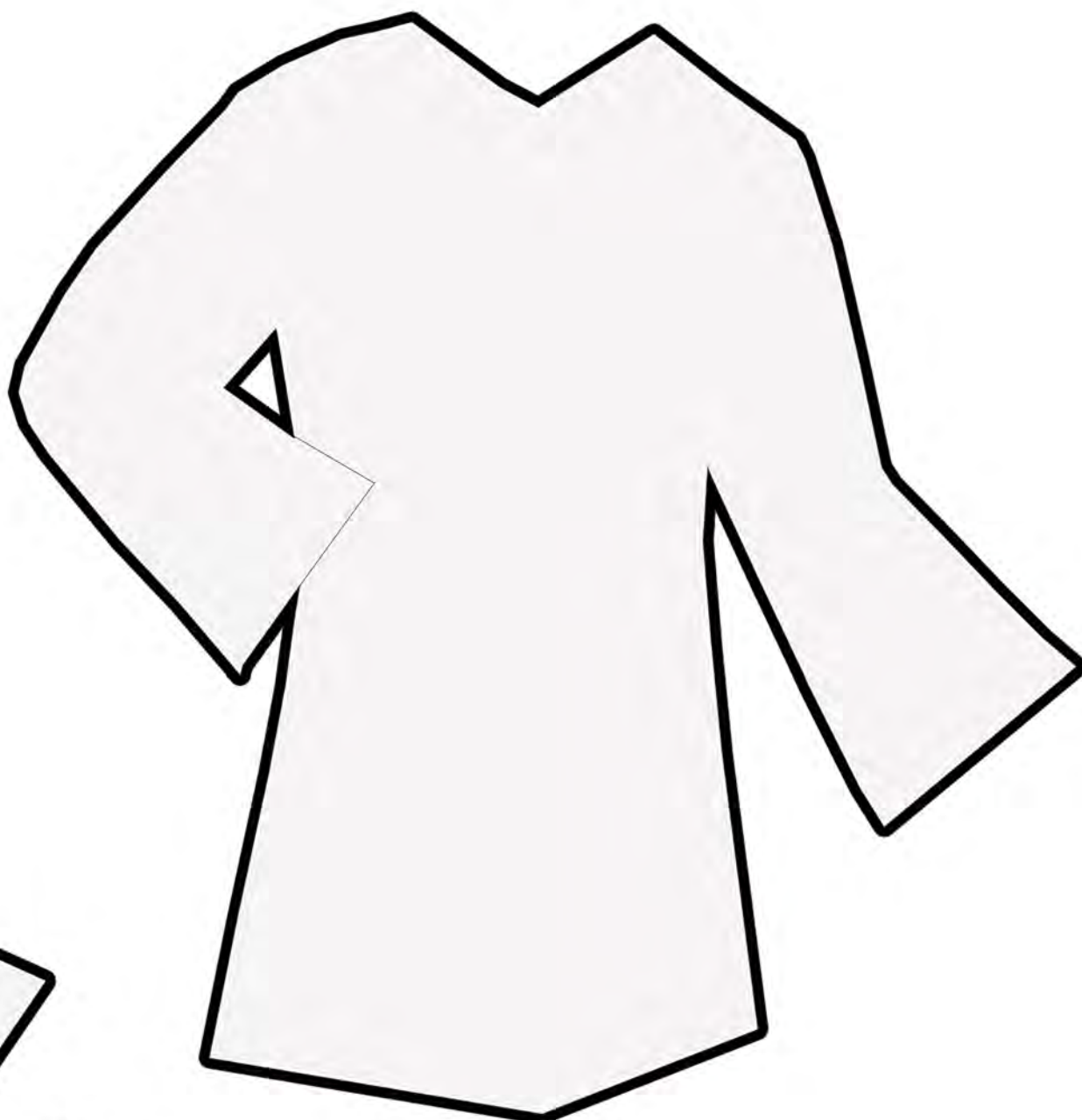
1. Cut each shape, ensuring that you cut along the inside of the line of the top layer of the fish, so that it fits into the bottom layer.
2. First paste the blocks and text. Then paste the bottom layer of the fish as shown.
3. Place and trim the top layer of the fish to ensure it fits before pasting.



Make Joseph

Jacob made his favorite son Joseph
an incredibly stylish coat.

Choose a
beautiful
pattern
for Joseph's
coat.



Use real ribbon or cut paper
for the trimming.



Finish with real or paper buttons.

Instructions

1. When cutting the coat, follow the line marking the inside of his left sleeve to create the area between his arm and his torso.
2. Paste the coat and text box as shown.
3. Glue ribbon or paper trimming into place. The pieces have been laid out on the template to match which go on the left and which go on the right.
4. If you use real buttons, you can then sew them onto the trimming and through the paper. If this seems too hard, just glue paper buttons.

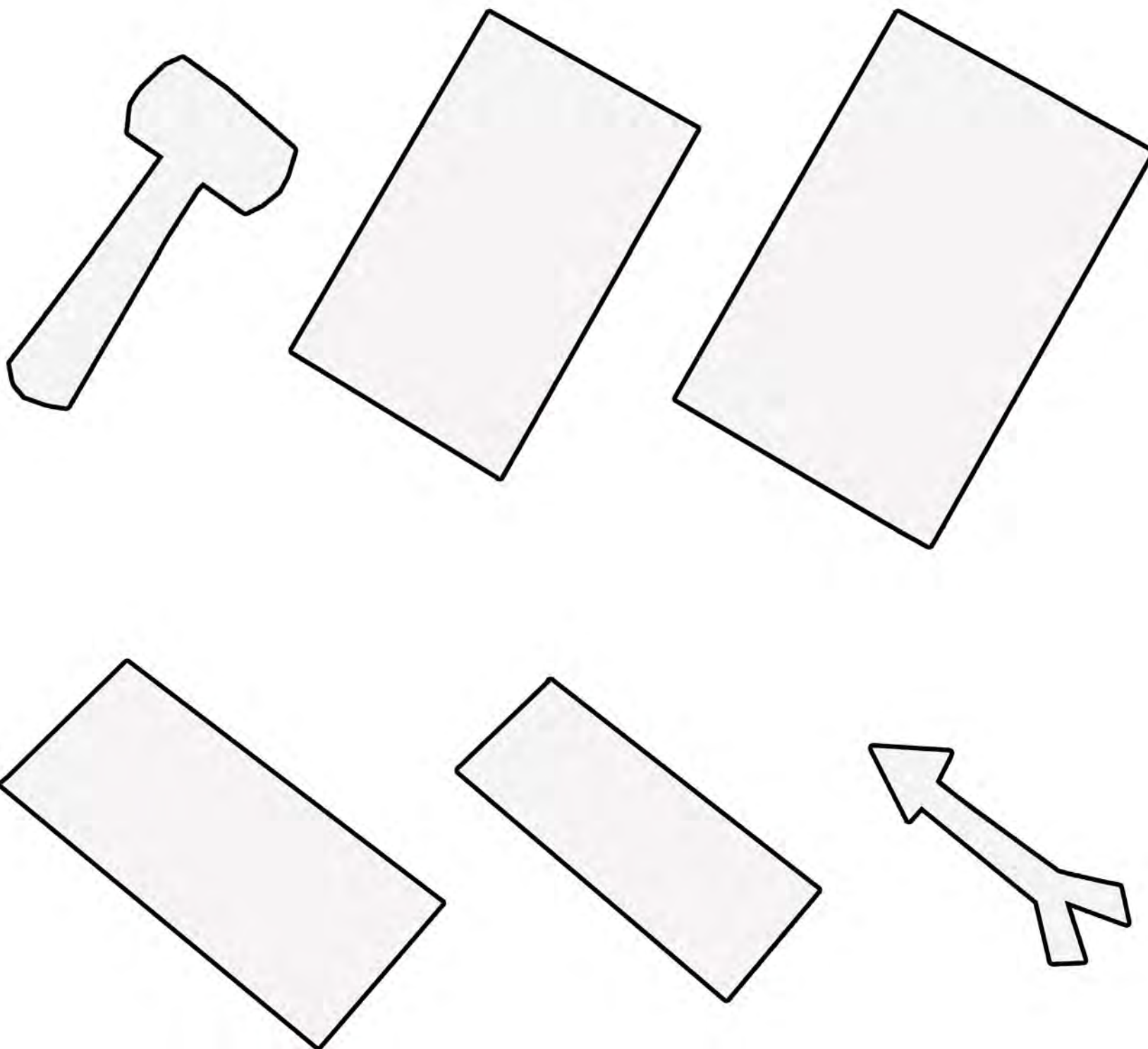


Make Judges

The tribes lived as clans and were led by a series of chiefs they called judges.

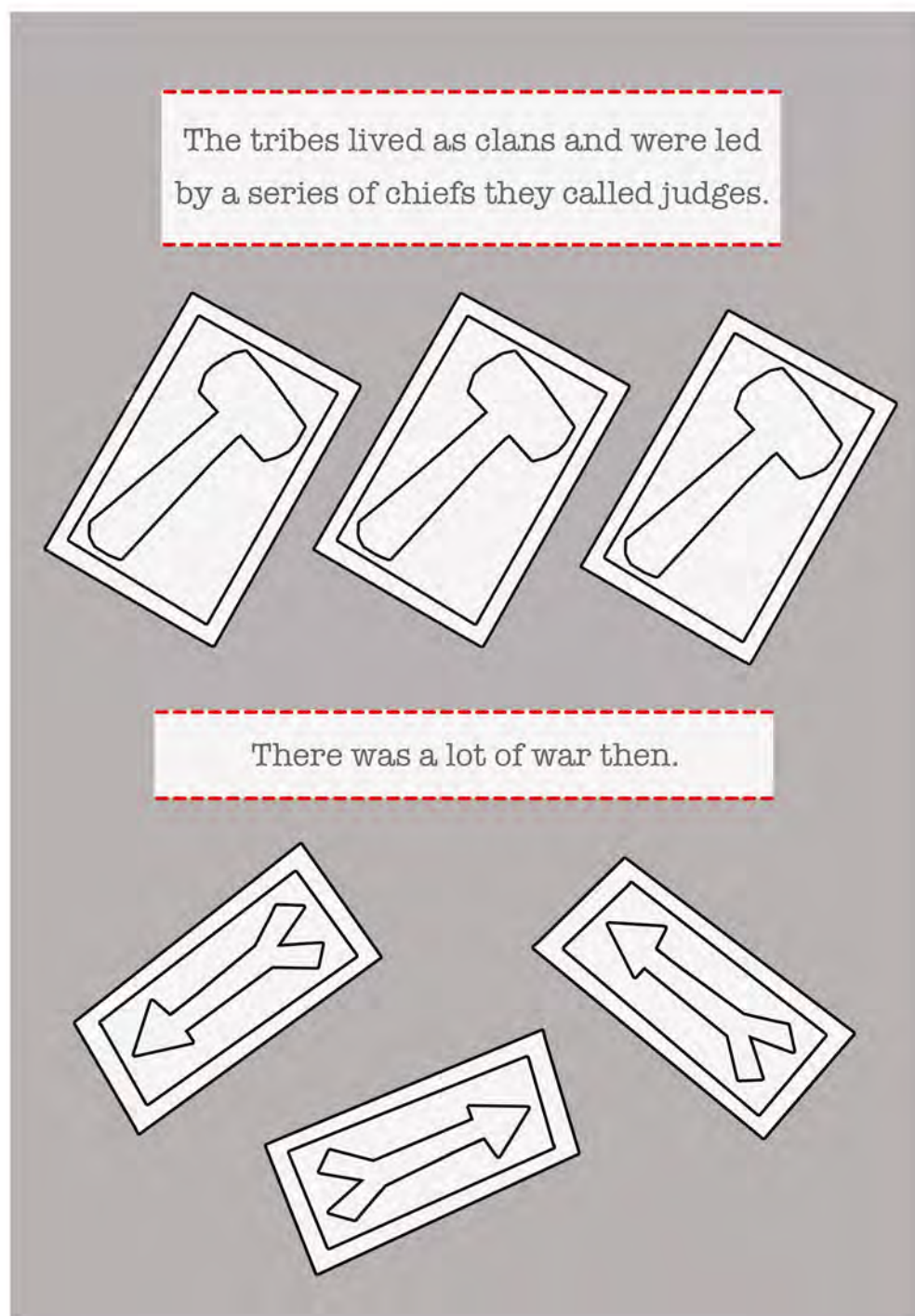
There was a lot of war then.

Instructions

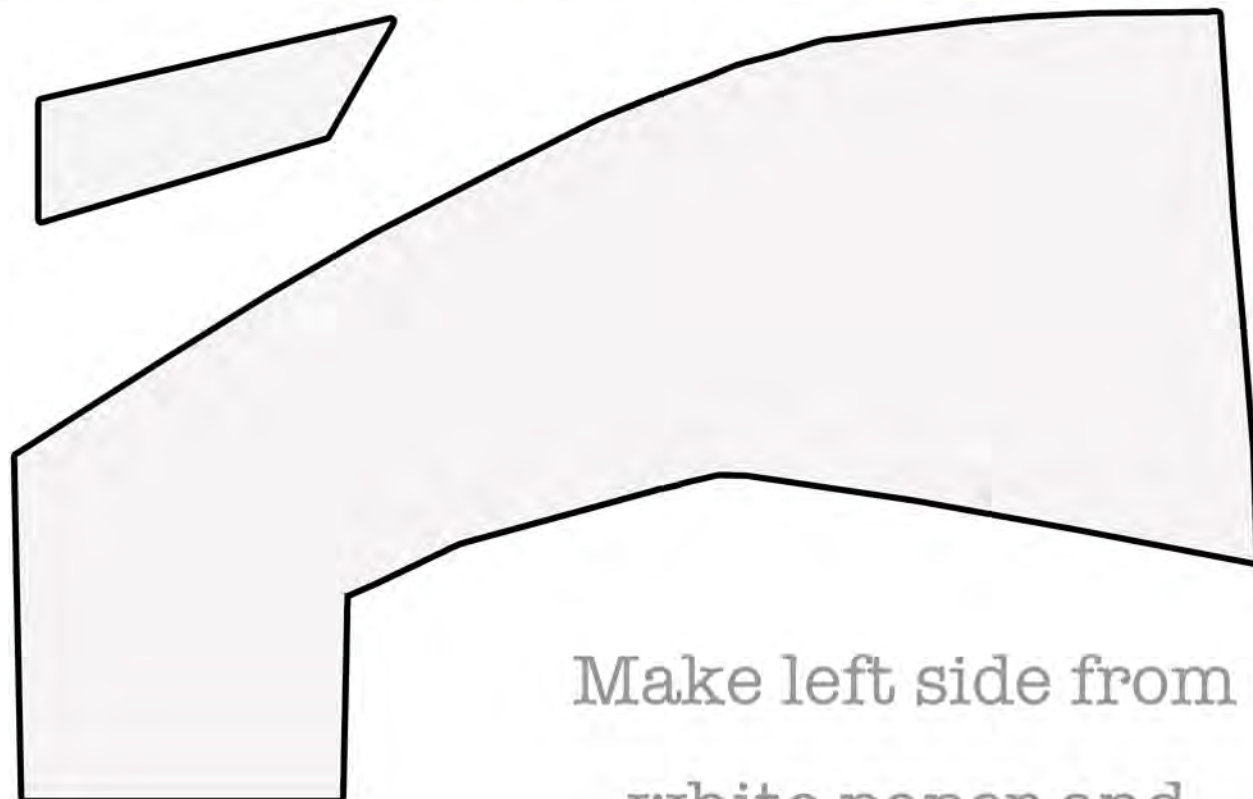
1. Cut each shape three times in the paper chosen for the layer.

3. Arrange pieces and text as shown.



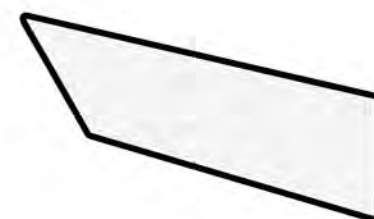
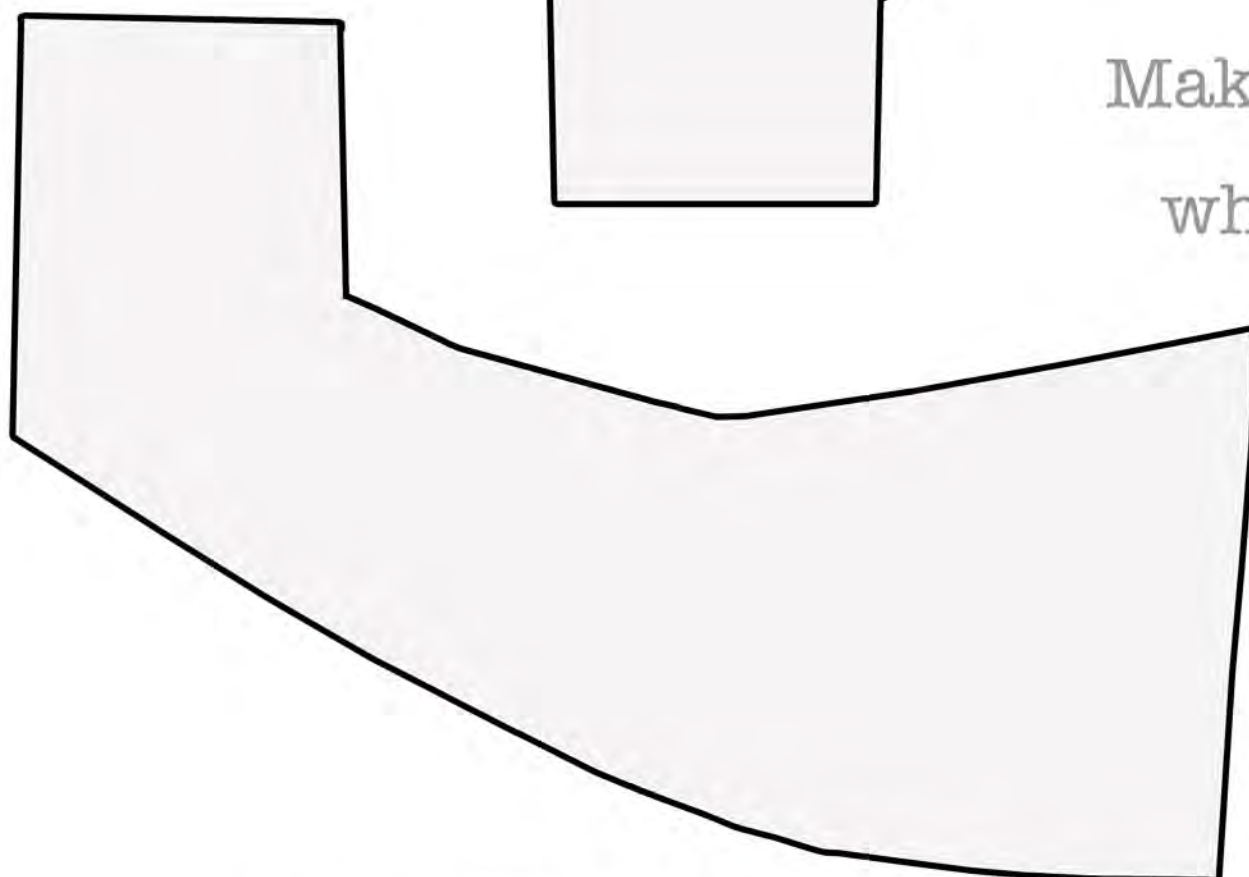
Make Moses

Moses saw an Egyptian hurting a Hebrew slave.

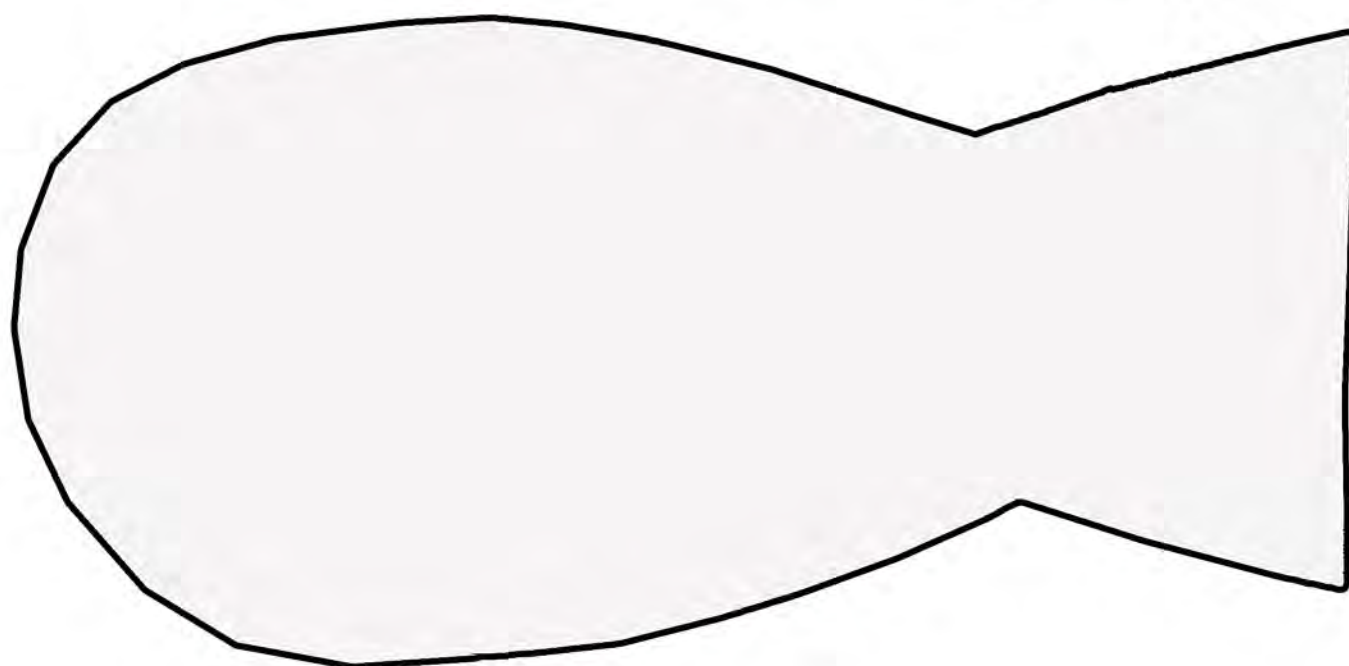
Make right

Instructions

1. When cutting the shapes, note that the right piece of his headdress is slightly narrower at the top than the the left piece. This is because the right piece overlaps the left, and they will appear to meet in the middle.
2. Paste the head below the center of the paper. Then paste the left side of the headdress, followed by the right side, as well as the box of text.
3. Finally paste the two smallest pieces as shown. The picture shows the conflict Moses faces between his Egyptian lifestyle and his Hebrew heritage.

Instructions

1. After cutting shapes from suggested papers, glue diaper onto Baby Moses. Then tape princess body parts to the back of her dress, so that they look like the image below.
2. Glue princess's belt. A slight change in shade shows you exactly where to place it.
3. Now paste the words and shapes as shown.
4. The last thing to do is to paste on her head-dress and headband. This will help you place it at the correct angle to her head.

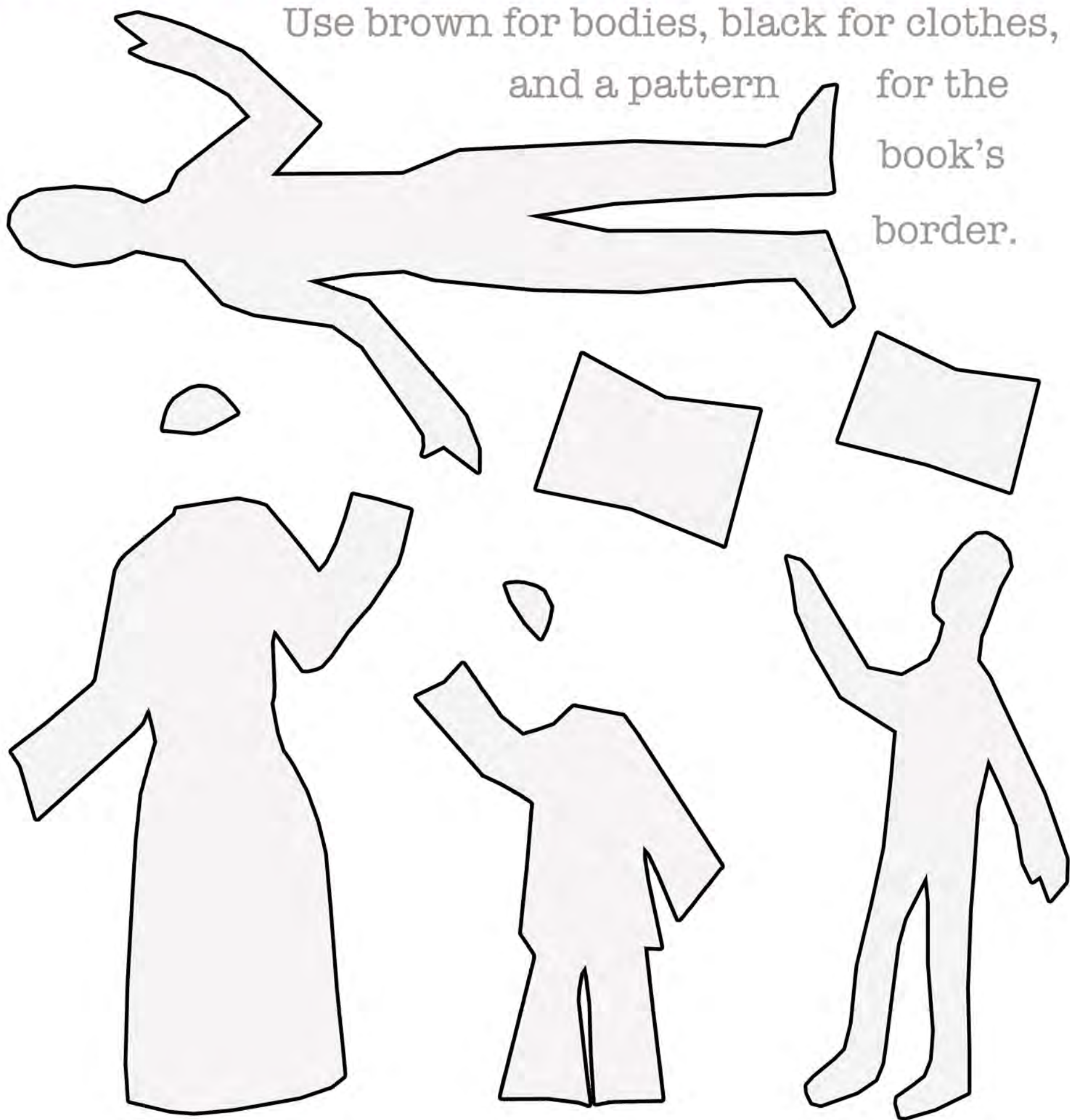


Make rabbi

The rabbis read the laws of Moses and the other Scriptures over and over again.

Instructions

1. After cutting the shapes, glue the clothes and caps to the rabbi and the boy.
2. Glue the top white piece of the book onto the patterned piece.
3. Now paste the words and shapes into place.

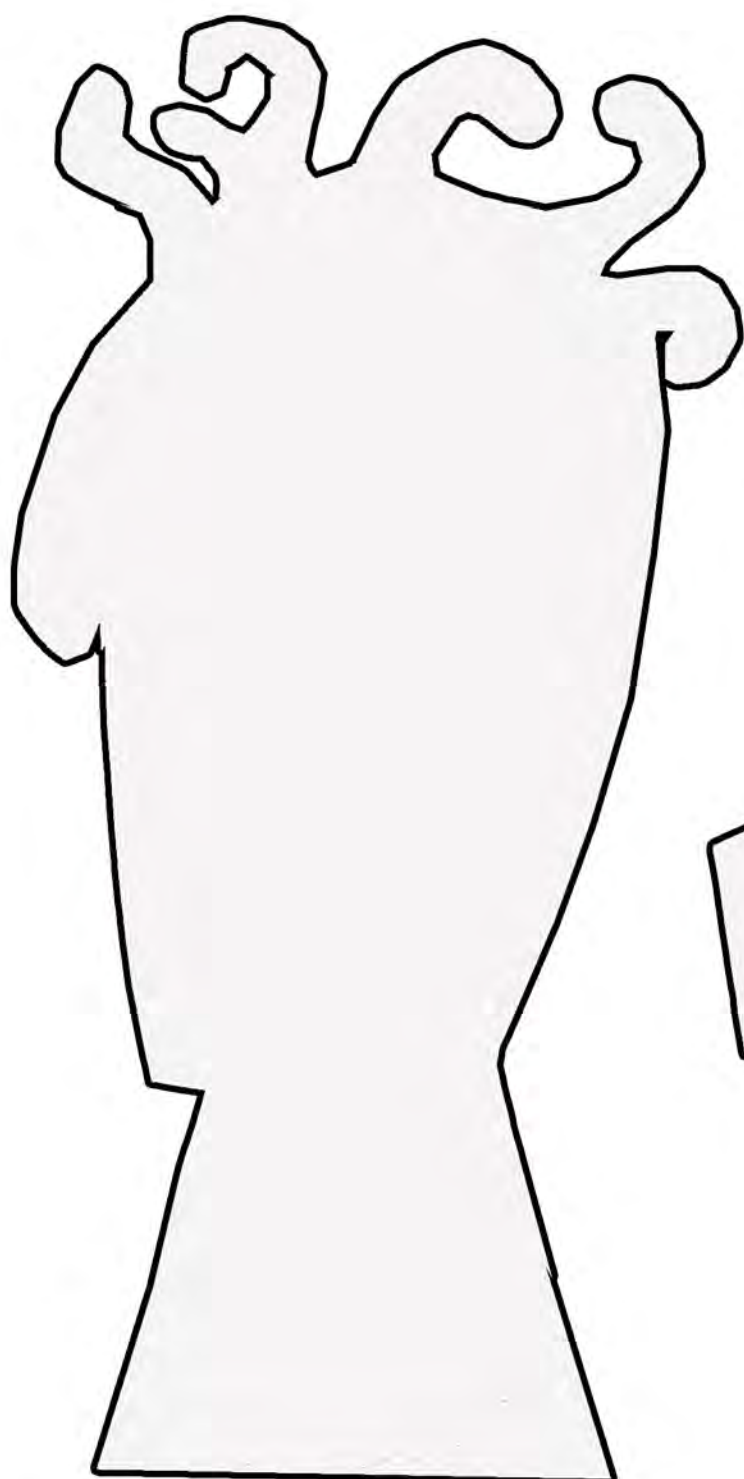
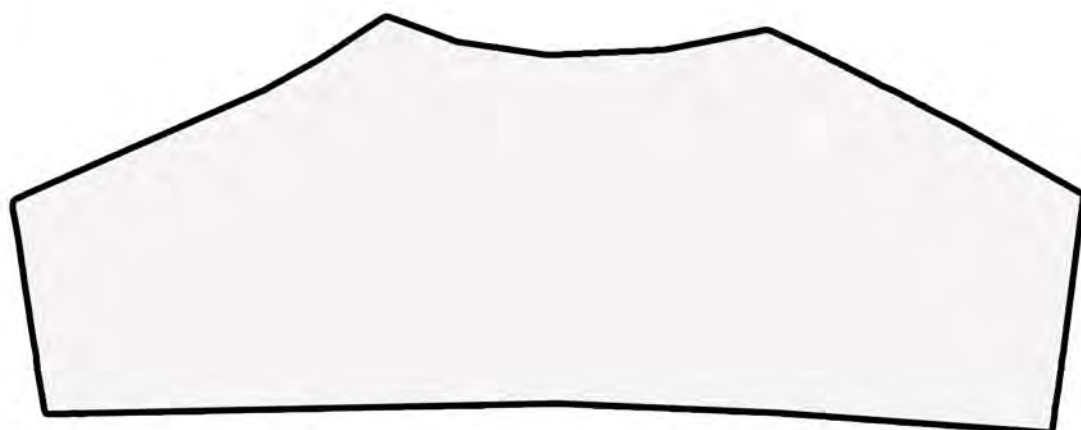
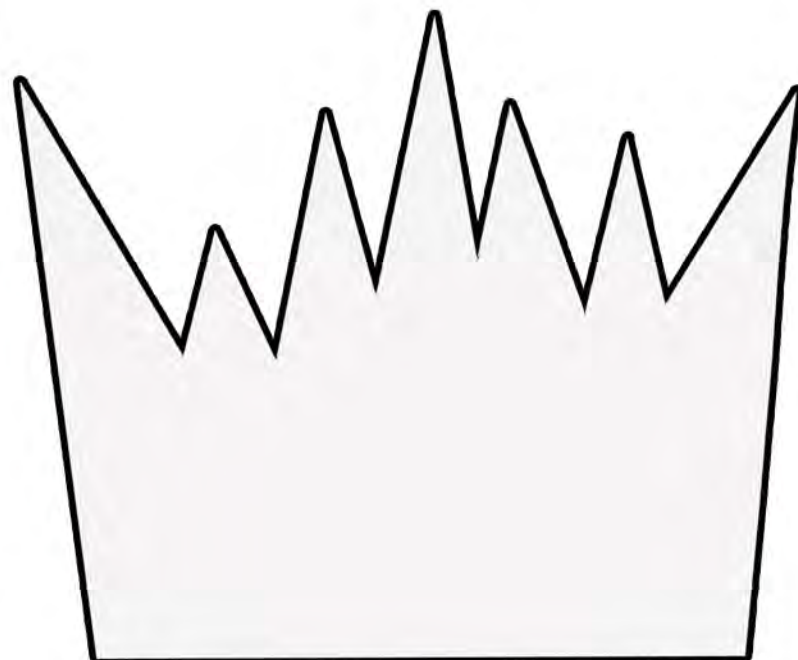

Instructions

1. Cut each shape, being especially careful with Saul's crazy curls.
2. Attach collar to cloak from back.
3. Paste Saul, cloak and text as shown.
4. Glue or paste the crown upside down, lifting the right curl to fall over the top of it as shown.



Make wise man

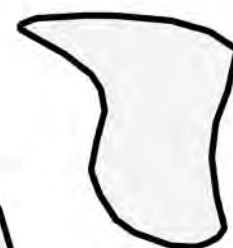
There were many well-read men in Solomon's court who reflected on the ways of the world.

They knew that wisdom was better than riches.

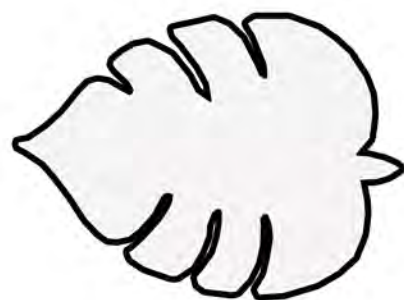
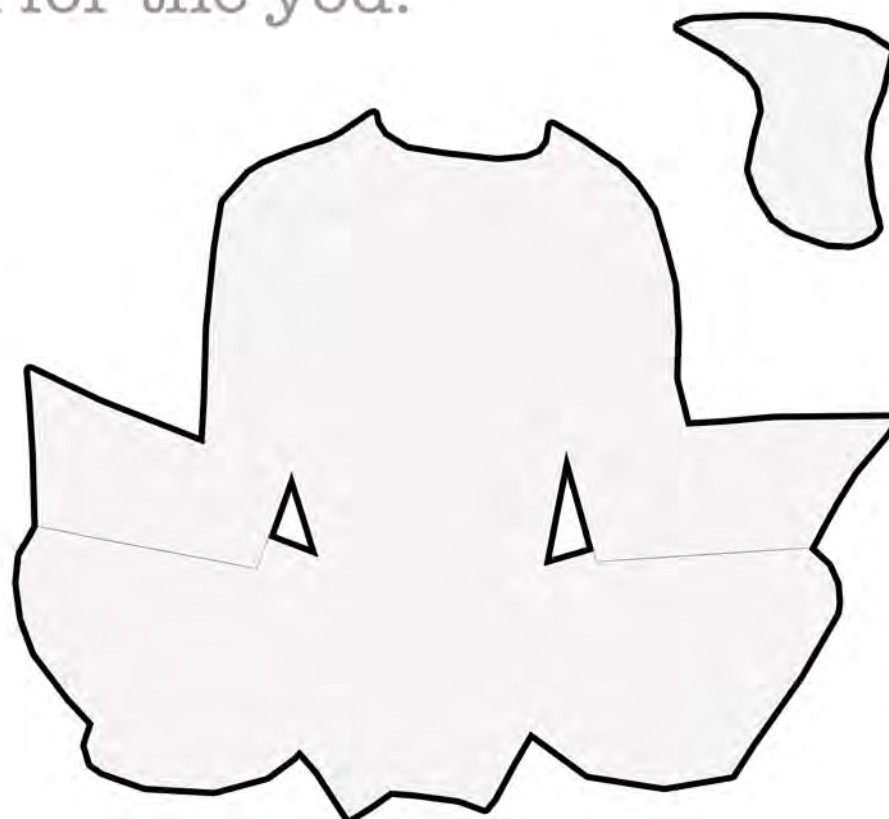
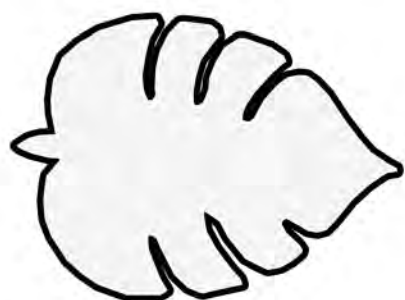
Use a pattern for the wise man's cloak and cap,



and green for the yod.

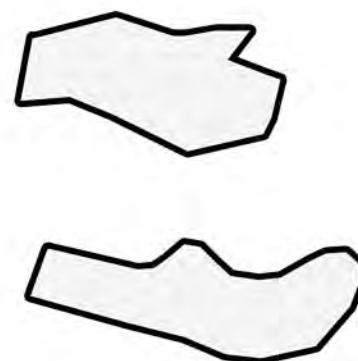
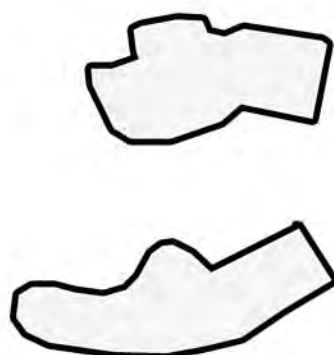
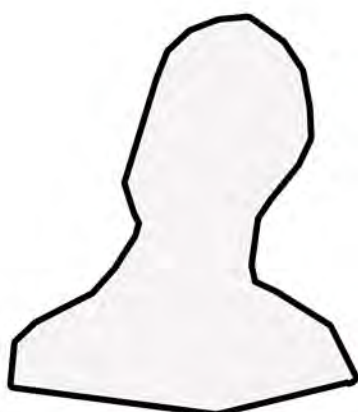


Use a different green for one leaf



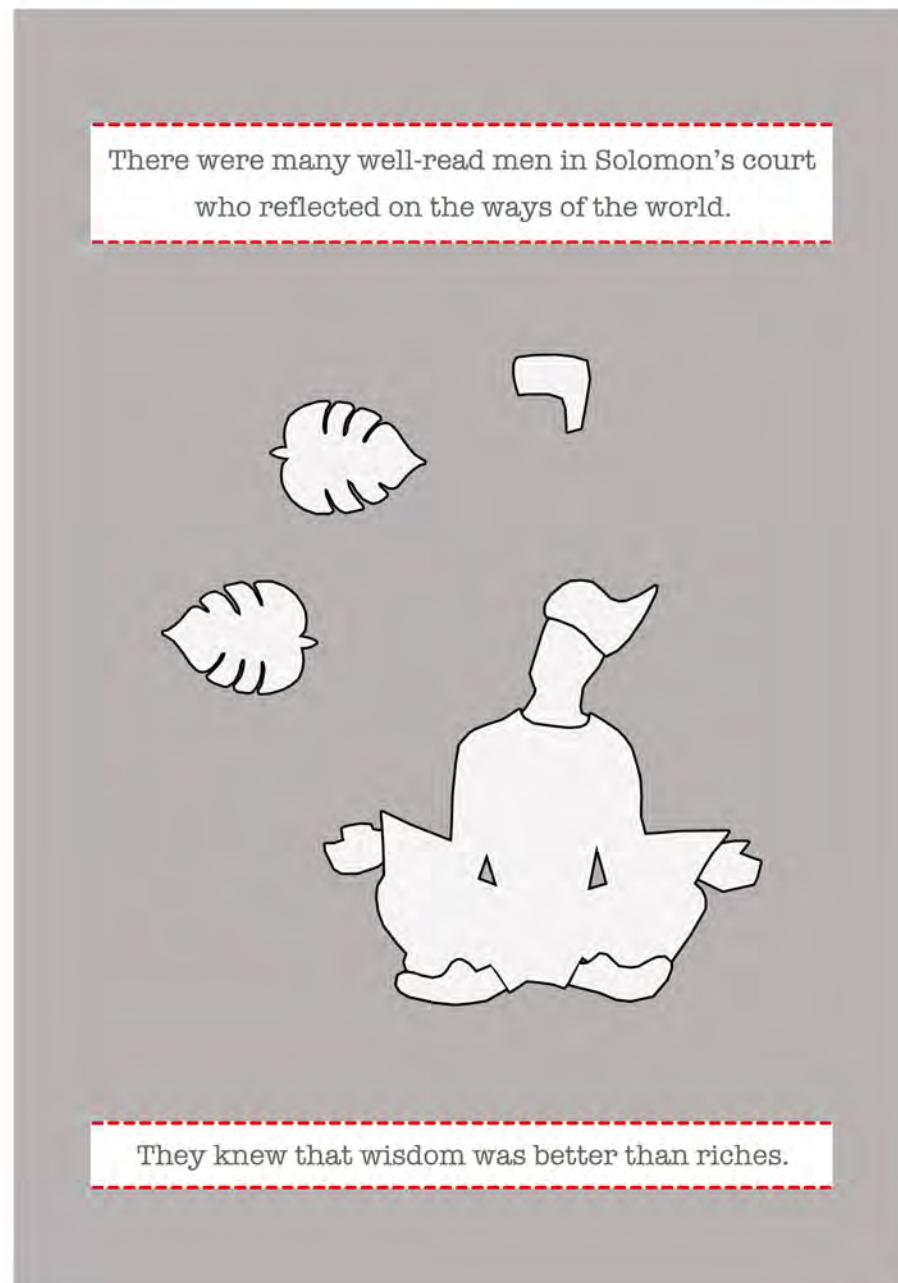
and brown or orange for the other leaf.

Instructions

1. Carefully cut the pieces, using brown and green to create spring and autumn leaves.
2. Cut neatly along the grey lines drawn across the wise man's cloak and create the gaps between his arms and body.
3. When pasting his feet, the inside edges will tuck behind his cloak. His ankles and toes will lie in front of his cloak.
4. Arrange and paste the remaining pieces.



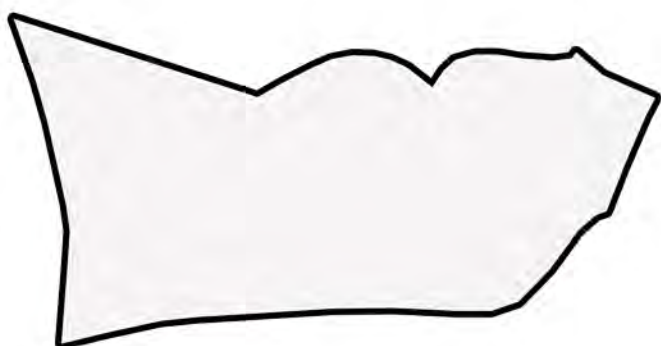
Make Wives

Leah and Rachel--

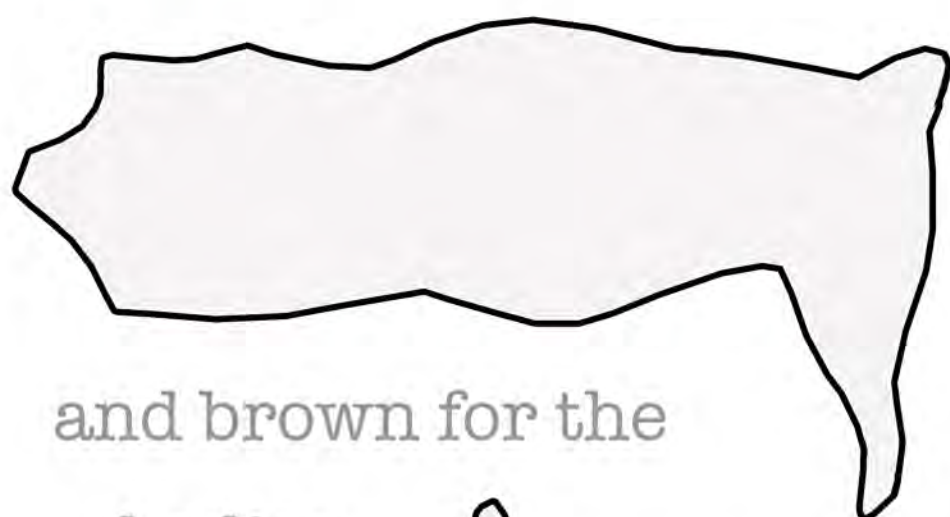
one plain and one pretty.

they had twelve sons.

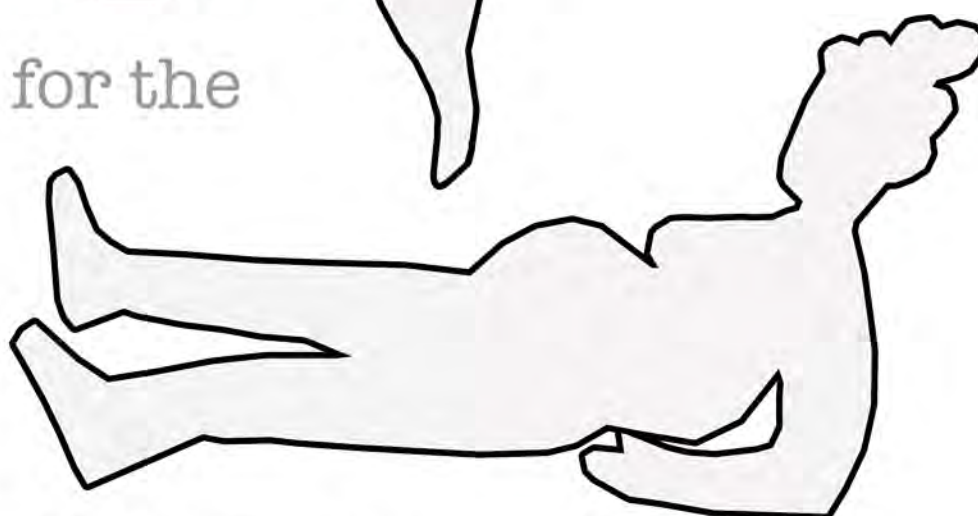

Instructions

1. Cut shapes, with special care to Leah's arm -- and cutting along the line on Rachel's body to create the space between her arm and head.
2. Then secure the line you cut across Rachel's arm with tape, so that she is a more solid piece.
3. When you paste their dresses, lift Leah's left hand and Rachel's right arm over the paper.
4. Now assemble and paste the shapes and text blocks to page as shown.
