From The President

Members of the Edmonton Branch

This has been a truly remarkable year and not in a good way. As you all know we have not had a meeting since our AGM last February, and I am sure some of you have been wondering if your executive has been swallowed by a black hole. Well we are still here and are trying to plan, but the problems with the COVID outbreaks particularly in Alberta are making things difficult. We still believe it is just too dangerous to meet in person, but we are investigating options including Zoom meetings and will let you know when we have something positive on that front.

Your executive has not been idle during the last 10 months and I do have some positive items to report. To begin with Her Honour, the Honourable Salma Lakhani, Lieutenant Governor of Alberta has accepted our invitation to become our Honourary Patron during her term of office. Please note that changes must be made on any handouts you may have to reflect this change.

Additionally, we requested Dominion Council review the lack of activity in the various Branches due to the pandemic and consider a rebate of a portion of the funds paid for membership. I am pleased to report that they have come up with a formula based on the income levels of the Branches and for our Branch the amount will be approximately 50% of the funds you paid last year. This rebate will be issued by the Branch over the coming weeks once we receive the funds from Toronto and upon your registration for the coming year. Should you not wish to take the rebate, the funds will be absorbed into the general fund. If you desire a tax receipt, you will have to take the rebate and forward it to Dominion for the Edmonton Branch and you will receive a tax receipt. Registrations for the next year are now open online and by mail. I have included a registration form for those who wish to use the old method and instructions for those who wish to do things electronically in this newsletter.

Other bright spots for this year include some 23 new certificate applications, the largest number in any single year since 2009. Our Genealogist will have more to say about this in the newsletter. Elsewhere in the newsletter is a calendar of events for 2021. Please note that everything is subject to change until this pandemic is under control. AGS is planning a GenFair in Wetaskiwin which should be interesting for those who wish to attend. I have also recently been informed that our Annual Conference in Cornwall will now be a virtual conference so no travel will be necessary.

If we are unable to see each other before the end of the year, I would like to wish each one of you a very Merry Christmas and all the best in the coming year. Stay Home and Stay Safe.



Lord Dorchester and the Dorchester Proclamation



This proclamation by Sir Guy Carleton, 1st Baron Dorchester, is not only the main reason that the United Empire Loyalists' Association of Canada exists but it set up land board and the foundation of good municipal government. Who was Guy Carleton and what exactly did this proclamation say?

Guy Carleton was born on September 3rd, 1724 in County Tyrone, Ireland. At the the age of seventeen in 1742, he was commissioned as an ensign into the British Army's 25th Regiment of Foot. This began a lifetime of service to the British army and a slow steady rise to the rank of Major General.

Carleton became friends with James Wolfe who, after Carleton has served in Flanders in 1747, recommended him as a guide to the 3rd Duke of Richmond on his tours of Flanders. Wolfe and Richmond both played important roles in his future career.

James Wolfe, now a Major General, was given command of the upcoming campaign against Quebec and appointed Carleton as the quarter-master general, given command of 600 grenadiers, responsibility for provisioning of the army and the placement of cannons for the Battle of the Plains of Abraham.

Over the next few years, Carleton served in battles against the French and Spanish. Then on April 7th, 1766 Carleton was named acting Lieutenant Governor and Administrator of Quebec and commander-in-chief of troops stationed in Quebec. It is likely that the Duke of Richmond



who was now Secretary of State of North American colonies had some influence in the appointment.

Carleton returned to England for consultations in August 1770 and didn't return until 1772. While in England Carleton, age 48, married Lady Maria Howard age 19. They had 11 children, 9 boys and 2 girls. Of the seven boys that survived to adulthood six served in the army and one joined the church. Carleton and Maria returned to Quebec in 1774 to oversee the implementation of the Quebec act that was based on his recommendations.

The First Continental Congress denounced the Quebec Act as undemocratic and for allowing Catholics to hold civil service postions. In May 1775 Carleton received notice of the start of the rebellion. He sent two regiments to Boston leaving only 800 regular soldiers in Quebec. His attempt to raise a militia was unsuccessful as neither the ethnic French nor English residents were willing to join. The natives were willing to join but Carleton forbid any native action outside of Quebec.

Carleton directed the defence for the Battle of Quebec and the attack on Trois-Rivieres. He commanded British naval forces in the Battle of Valcour Island on Lake Champlain. Carleton now a Lieutenant General, asked to be relieved of command in 1777 and returned to England. In 1781 Carleton was back as commander-in-chief of the war effort, when informed in 1783 that Britian would grant the United States independence.

He met with George Washington to arrange the evacuation of New York according to the treaty of Paris. Carleton refused to return former slaves to the Americans but proposed a registry so that former owners might be compensated. He declared that it was a breach of faith not to honour the pledge of freedom for former slaves. He proposed a registry of all former slaves called the "Book of Negroes." The Americans agreed to this but as far as can be determined, compensation was never paid.

Carleton returned to England but was back to Quebec in 1778 as Governor-in-Chief. In August 1786 he was raised to the Peerage of Great Britian as the 1st Baron Dorchester. The Constitutional Act of 1791 split Quebec into Upper and Lower Canada with Sir Alured Clarke, Lieutentant Governor of Lower Canada and John Graves Simcoe, Lieutenant Governor of Upper Canada. Carleton left for Britian in August 1791 but was back in August 1793 to resume his duties. Robert Prescott was appointed as Carleton's replacement in 1796 and he sailed from Canada in July never to return.

Sir Guy Carleton, Lord Dorchester, died suddenly November 10th, 1808 at the age of 84.

Lord Dorchester's Proclamation

At the Council Chamber at Quebec, Monday 9th . November 1789. Present,

His Excellency the Right Honble, LORD DORCHESTER, The Honble. WILLIAM SMITH, Efquire, Chief Juffice. HUGH FINLAY, GEORGE POWNALL,) THOS. DUNN, HENRY CALDWELL EDWD. HARRISON,) WILLIAM GRANT, JOHN COLLINS, FRANCOIS BABY, CHARLES DE LANAUDIERE, ADAM MABANE,) J.G.C. DELERY, LE CTE. DUPRE',)

Efquires.

His Lordfhip intimated to the Council, that it remained a Queftion, upon the late Regulation for the Difpofition of the Wafte Lands of the Crown, whether the Boards, conftituted for that Purpofe, were authorized to make Locations to the Sons of Loyalifts, on their coming of full Age and that it was his wifh to put a Mark of Honour upon families who had adhered to the Unity of Empire, and joined the Royal Standard in America before the Treaty of Separation in the year 1783.

The Council concurring with His Lordfhip, it is accordingly ORDERED,

That the feveral Land Boards take Courfe for preferving a Regiftry of the Names of all Perfons, falling under the aforementioned, to the End of their Pofterity may be difcriminated, from future Settlers, in the Parifh Regifters and Rolls of the Militia, of their refpective Diffricts, and other Public Remembrancers (sic) of the Province, as proper Objects, by their preferving in the Fidelity and Conduct, fo honourable to their Ancestors, for diffinguifhed Benefits and Privileges.

And it is alfo Ordered, that the faid Land Boards may, in every fuch Case, provide not only for the Sons of thofe Loyalifts, as they arrive to Full Age, but for their Daughters alfo, of that Age, or on their marriage, affigning to each a Lot of Two Hundred Acres, more or lefs, provided neverthelefs that they refpectively comply with the general Regulations and that it fhall fatifactorily appear, the there has been no Default in the due Cultivation and Improvements of the Lands already affigned to the Head of the Family, of which they are Members.

Williams C.C

Accompanying the resolution to London to be presented to the king, was attached a "Form of militia roll for the western districts to discriminate the families before mentioned" which included the following....

"N.B. Those Loyalists who have adhered to the unity of the Empire, and joined the Royal Standard before the Treaty of Separation in the year 1783, and all their children and their descendants by either sex, are to be distinguished by the following capitals, affixed to their names: U.E. alluding to their great principle the unity of the Empire."

Why did S used to look like f?
