Last Post: WARDS UE, Shona Barbara (nee Cameron)



It is with great sadness that the family of Shona Barbara Wards announces her sudden passing from an abdominal aortic aneurysm on Tuesday, August 10, 2021. Shona is happy to be reunited with her predeceased husband, Jack Wards. She will be greatly missed by her daughters, Jennifer (Bill) Shalapay, Allyson (Dwayne) Mandrusiak, Linda Cochran.

Shona was a dedicated and tireless worker for the Edmonton Eskimos (38 years) and the Eskimo Alumni; the Rebels (you know who you are); and too many community organizations to name.

For the UELAC, Shona contributed much, as an active member of the executive holding the postions of Edmonton Branch President, Membership Director and Secretary. She organized and participated in formal Branch dinners, the School Visitation Program, parades, annual Conferences, and promoted the UELAC at every opportunity. Shona appeared in costume at all special functions, helping, and encouraging others to make period costumes.

Shona's Loyalist ancestor was Sgt. Daniel Keith of the Queen's Ranger, who settled in New Brunswick. The certificate was awarded in 2004.

In 2005, Shona Wards was instrumental in the planting a Bur Oak tree on the Alberta legislative grounds as a special educational project for the Edmonton Branch of the UELAC. In 2007, a small plaque was added in recognition of a visit by Queen Elizabeth II to commemorate Alberta's 100th birthday. A larger plaque and base were added in 2010.

The plaque reads:

United Empire Loyalists' Association of Canada This bur oak tree commemorates the visit of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II in celebration of Alberta's Centennial 1905-2005. Placed by the descendants of the United Empire Loyalists who are members of the Edmonton and

Calgary Branches. The roots of this tree symbolize the ancestral roots of Loyalists who fled the Thirteen American Colonies during the American Revolution (1775-1783) and remained faithful to the British Crown. Oak leaves have long been held as a symbol of loyalty to the Monarchy since the time of Charles II. Just as the branches of this tree grow and spread, similarly many Albertans are descendants of the original Loyalists.

Marcia Mclean – Assistant Genealogist

My name is Marcia McLean, and I have recently joined the Executive as Assistant Genealogist. My interest genealogy developed soon after I discovered my biological family – as an adoptee I had so much to discover! With one family in Ontario, one in Nova Scotia and one in New Brunswick, I am well versed in finding records in each of those provinces. I am also interested in using DNA to broaden research avenues and locate family, as DNA played a key role in my own family discovery journey.

I have also taken on the role of keeper of the patterns for period clothing. I have always been interested in history and in "old stuff", which led to my early career in community museums. As a lifelong knitter and sewer, I gravitated toward the textile-based artifacts, which is how I landed at the University of Alberta for my Master of Arts in Textiles and Clothing. If anyone is looking for advice or assistance with developing their own Loyalist outfit, I am happy to help out!

I have two Loyalist ancestors, Joseph Denton Sr. and Cornelius Nice. Here is a little bit about each of them:

Joseph Denton was born in 1752 in Huntington, Suffolk, New York. On August 3, 1775, he and five others were accused of dissent against the rebellion and providing supplies to British ships. He arrived as a Loyalist in Nova Scotia in 1784, having sailed from Long Island on the ship Atlanta. In 1801 he was granted 210 acres in Digby Township. With his first wife, Martha Waters, Joseph Denton had seven children; he had another nine with his second wife Mary Odell. Joseph Denton died in June 1835 at Little River, Digby, Nova Scotia.

Cornelius Nice was born in 1754 in Germantown, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. The youngest of 10 children, he was born a few months after the death of his father and named for him. He served as a Private in Major Philip Van Cortland's Company of the 3rd Battalion of New Jersey Volunteers. In May 1783, Cornelius Nice arrived at the mouth of the Saint John River with the Spring Fleet, which carried over 2000 Loyalists to the Saint John area. He settled in Belleisle, New Brunswick and died in December 1816


