


"THE ECHOES" STAFF OF 1955

The 1955 Graduates wish to express their sincere gratitude to the members of the different graduating classes since 1910 who have responded so wholeheartedly to their request for news and information about their fellow graduates. It was a worthwhile and pleasant experience for them to get acquainted with all the former graduates of their Alma Mater. Unlike other seniors who cast long looks into the future, the 1955 Seniors are glancing backwards into their Alma Mater's glorious past: 801 Graduates in all--99 in Religious Life (80 Daughters of Wisdom and 19 in other Communities), 2 in the Priesthood, 1 at the Seminary and 36 gone to their eternal reward. The others are happy in their individual vocations as evidenced in their letters to us. How happy we would be if it were possible to quote these letters in their entirety. 1910

In a letter to her classmate, Madeleine Beaulieu, Isabelle Dechaine (No. 14) Mrs. J. Michaud from Waterville, writes: "...I can't regret the laughing spells we got in class though I lost good notes at the time; after all we are young only once. Our Beloved Teachers are in heaven praying for us, I hope."

Yes, you may be sure that you are not forgotten by those faithful teachers who gave the best of their lives to the formation of their pupils; they certainly watch over you now.

Patrick Bouchard is married and stationed at Ancon, Canal Zone. He regrets not to be able to pay a visit to his Alma Mater for the 50th Anniversary.

1913

In a letter of December last, Catherine Fournier (Sister M. Jeanne d'Arc, Franciscan) expressed her profound gratitude to God for the 50 years of generous labor given by the Daughters of Wisdom for the greatest glory of God. She had a very special word of praise for the heroic Foundress (Mother M. Therese) and her devoted followers. What a surprise!.. a long newsy letter from Alice Roy (34) Lachance from Saco. She writes: ". . There are only 3 with us now: Paul '40 (25), Marie May '40 (19) and Louis (23). 


