


## "THE ECHOES" STAFF OF 1955


## OUR CARNIVAL QUEEN ROSE MARIE LEBOEUF

It was a worthwhile and pleasant experience for them to get acquainted with all the former graduates of their Alma Mater. Unlike other seniors who cast long looks into the future, the 1955 Seniors are glancing backwards into their Alma Mater's glorious past: 801 Graduates in all--99 in Religious Life (80 Daughters of Wisdom and 19 in other Communities), 2 in the Priesthood, I at the Seminary and 36 gone to their eternal reward. 


