



Wisdom's 1983 Commencement Program

Wisdom High School was the site last Wednesday, June 8th, of the 1983 graduation program. Some 850 parents, friends, and relatives were on hand to witness this event which saw 64 Seniors receive their diplomas. The Wisdom Jr. and Sr. High School Band — directed by Mrs. Martha Michaud — provided the music during the evening playing such selections as: "Endless Love" and "Hill Street Blues Theme."

The *Commencement Addresses* were given by; Brenda Chamberland, the "Co-Honor Essayist," who spoke on "The Value of Education." Brenda is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jerome Chamberland; Greta Fongemie, "Co-Honor Essayist," reflected on how one may acquire wisdom. Greta is the daughter of Mrs. Therese Fongemie; Lynn Dugal, the "Salutatorian," at this time thanked the many people who played a large part in their high school years and pointed out the support this 1983 graduating class received from many caring people and organizations in setting up Project Graduation — an alcohol-free party — which was a trip to Quebec City; and Monica Bourgoin, the "Valedictorian," gave her "Message to the Underclassmen." 

Winter Carnival Royalty







