Above all, grant me unconditional love. For if I know it is there, I will be able to give the same to my children and they will be able to give it to theirs.

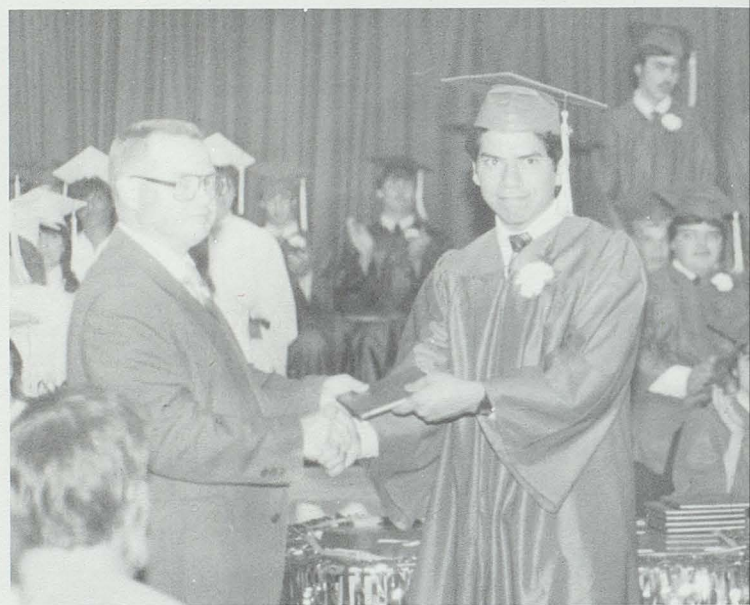
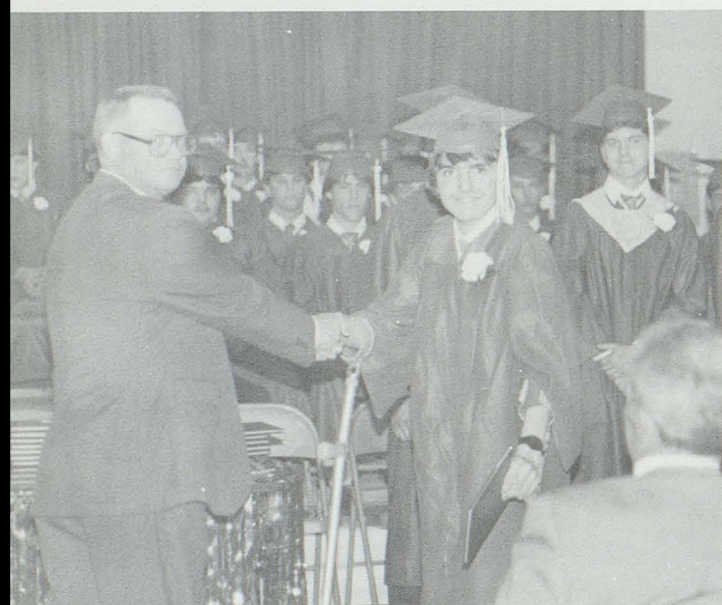

That you must not quit.

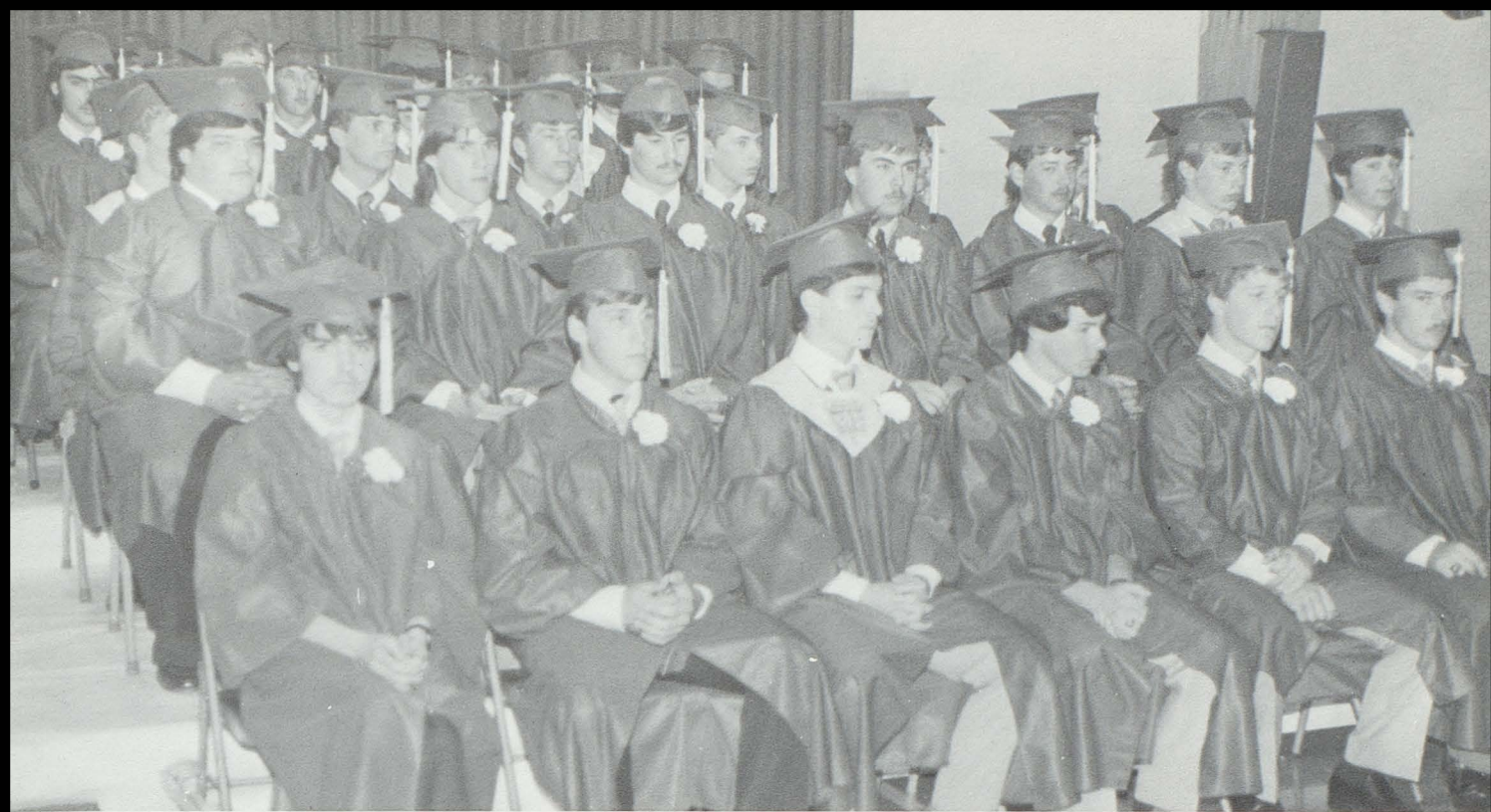

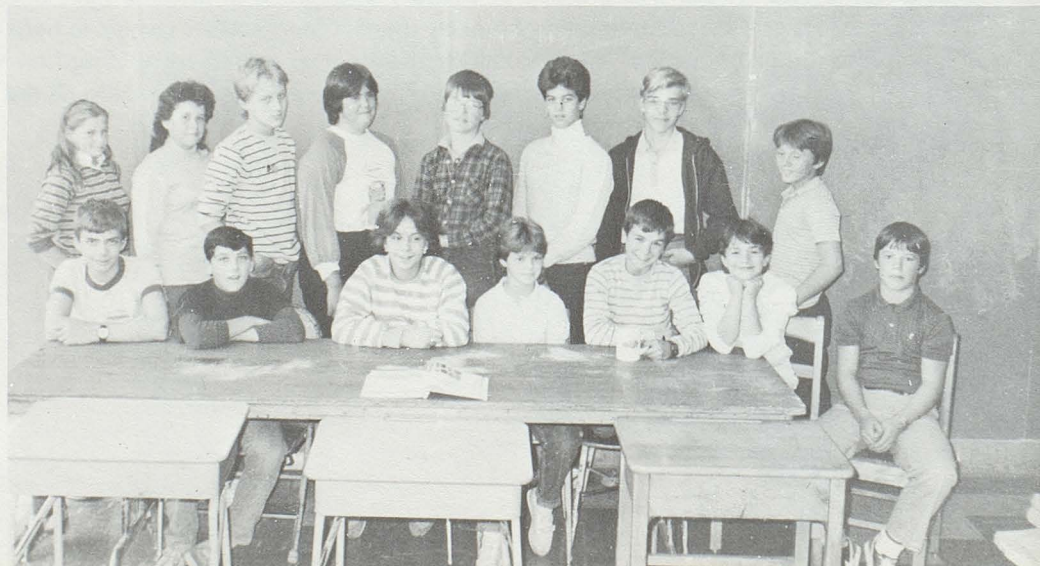

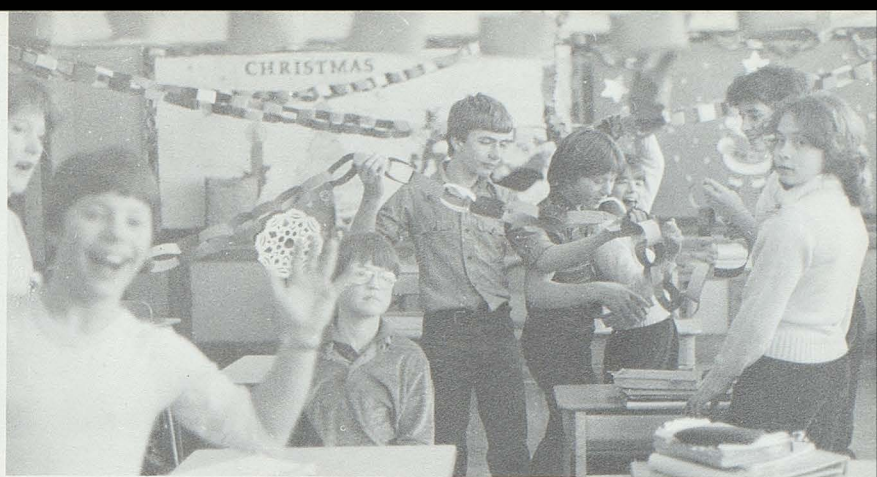

Heather Tincher, Melissa Ling, Kelly Michaud, Karie Michaud and Jenny Michaud served as hostesses and prompters. The public was invited.



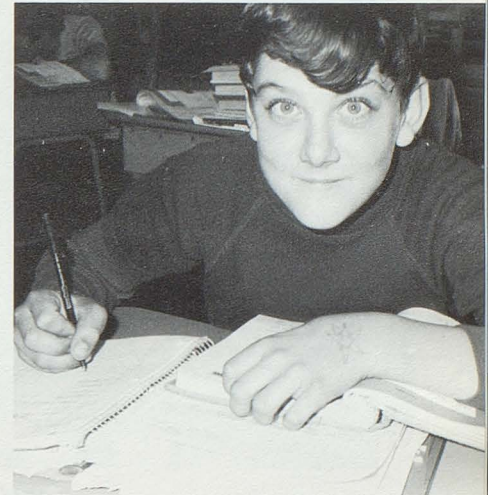
