Upon further reflection, Dennis Michard said his favorite play was ''Musketeers'' when he was playing the role as Athos. He says, ''I fit my character in this play.''


He also said that, ''drama will help me exxpress myself better in a job I might have later in life.'' His closing comment was: ''Do it for yourself and not for others.''



PIONEER YEARBOOK STAFF



We all have a great time preparing this publication for all of you and hope you enjoy it for many years to come.





An interview with Coach Deschaine:



Coach Aldrete believes that Wisdom's success in volleyball in the past years is due primarily to our excellent feeder program in physical education.


When asked which team he feared the most, he said, "I fear no team! If we get beaten, we've beaten ourselves."

Looking ahead, players joining the team next year should realize tht an important new goal will be to regain our self image and, of course, the county of among a self-image. championship.




AN INTERVIEW WITH SANDY SIROIS. By: Randy Ayotte
