

"Dracula" because "It was near Halloween and I admire vampire



that will live forever. This play was definitely our best yet thanks to all the new equipment and the very hard work everyone put into it."





















On April 26, 1991, students from several business classes went to Caribou to participate in the Regional


COACH'S CORNER


















Next season, our team should be even stronger. Two Seniors are leaving but the upcoming Junior High players are already a very good group.


