

The name for the park celebrates the town's history. Alexandre "Mennon" Ouellette, born in St. André de Kamouraska, Quebec, in 1804, first settled along the St. John River in what is now Frenchville during the 1830's. Legend has it one day "Mennon" told his wife, Theotiste, he was going for a trek in the woods southeast of the river. It was at that time he came upon this beautiful field of water – now Long Lake. He and his family settled at the head of the lake and for years it was called 'lac à Mennon.' "Parc Du Lac À Mennon" name was created in part by James & Rita Chamberland and the town selectmen. Lake Mennon Park is home to the Memorial Trees planted in 2010 by Marquis Tree Works, a softball field, paved walking path, playground, a tennis court and picnic areas.



Visiting Her Father's Homestead


During the summer of 2014, Francois "Paco" and Belinda Plourde Cano, along with their sons, Cameron and Clifton, came all the way from Luxenbourg to visit with Belinda's father's relatives in St. Agatha, Maine. Belinda's father, Evan Plourde, son of the late Pierre and Madeline Ouellette Plourde of St. Agatha, was a career military man who served in the U.S. Marine Corps in Korea and was a T SGT in the U.S. Air Force when he served in Vietnam. Evan died March 28, 1975 at Newington's Veterans Hospital in Connecticut after 23 years in the military. His widow, Catherine Biermann Plourde, always stayed in touch with Evan's brother and sister-in-law, Reginald and Francoise Plourde of St. Agatha. In July of 2014, Belinda, "Paco," Cameron and Clifton, landed in New York and drove to New England where they visited with numerous relatives. While in St. Agatha they had the opportunity to visit Evan Plourde's burial site in the St. Agatha Lower Cemetery and visit with Carole Plourde and Francoise Plourde. The Luxenbourg family was delighted to see Evan Plourde's section in the military albums at the Ste-Agathe Historical Society's Preservation Center.

Closing Ceremonies for the World Acadian

More than 7,000 people attended the ceremonies and concert at Témiscouata-sur-le-Lac, Quebec, according to France LeMoignan, CMA 2014 communications coordinator. Jack Michaud of St. Agatha placed his handprint on the base of a new sculpture by François Maltais that was created for the closing ceremonies in Témiscouata. The sculpture symbolizes the future generation of Acadians through children whose hand imprints are part of. The sculpture will remain permanently at its outdoor location in Place de l'Acadie.

Jack was one of nearly a dozen children from Maine who joined other children from communities in New Brunswick and Quebec to place their handprints at the base of the sculpture.



"Do We Have As Much Sense as a Goose?" Todd H. Fast Sr.

Next spring when you see geese heading back north for the summer flying along in a "V" formation, you might be interested in knowing what scientists have discovered about why they fly that way. It has been learned that as each bird flaps its wings, it creates an up lift for the bird immediately following.

By flying in a "V" formation, the whole flock adds at least 71% greater flying range than if each bird flew on its own. BASIC TRUTH #1: PEOPLE WHO SHARE A COMMON DIRECTION AND SENSE OF COMMUNITY CAN GET WHERE THEY ARE GOING QUICKER AND EASIER BECAUSE THEY ARE TRAVELING ON THE THRUST OF ONE ANOTHER.

Whenever a goose falls out of formation, it suddenly feels the drag and resistance of trying to go it alone and quickly gets back into formation to take advantage of the lifting power of the bird immediately in front. BASIC TRUTH #2: IF WE HAVE AS MUCH SENSE AS A GOOSE, WE WILL STAY IN FORMATION WITH THOSE WHO ARE HEADED THE SAME WAY WE ARE GOING.

When the lead goose gets tired, it rotates back in the wing and another goose flies point. BASIC TRUTH #3: IT PAYS TO TAKE TURNS DOING HARD JOBS – WITH PEOPLE OR WITH GEESE FLYING NORTH.

The geese honk from behind to encourage those up front to keep up their speed. BASIC TRUTH #4: WE NEED TO BE CAREFUL WHAT WE SAY WHEN WE HONK FROM BEHIND.

Finally, when a goose gets sick, or is wounded by gunshot of falls out, two geese fall out of formation and follow it down to provide help and protection. They stay with it until it is either able to fly or until it is dead, and then they launch out on their own or with another formation to catch up with their group. FINAL TRUTH: IF WE HAVE THE SENSE OF A GOOSE WE WILL STAND BY EACH OTHER LIKE THAT.



Dear Members and Friends of the Ste-Agathe Historical Society,

The World Acadian Congress and all of its special events and family reunions has come and gone. We are now left with the memories and many new friends. The Town of St. Agatha participated with three communities in Canada for the Tripling Meetings. We met with members of the Saint-Louis-du-Ha!Ha!, Saint Elzéar-de-Témiscouata, and Kedgwick municipalities to create lines of communication and share the highlights of each region. There were 120 different family reunions held on both sides of the river. This attracted visitors to go to many other regions. Family reunions hosted in St. Agatha included the Guerrettes, the Michauds, the Lagassés/ Lagacés, the Picards, the Deschênes/ Deschaines/ Milville, the Fosests, the Chasses, the Babins, the Morneaults, and the Gagnons. The historical site kept extended hours from the 8th of August to the 24th and we were fortunate to have extra volunteers like Jean Paul Michaud from New York and Angie Chamberland from the DC area. Throughout the summer our Trail Guides and Youth Guide, made possible by the Maine Acadian Heritage Council, were available to welcome the visitors. St. Agatha native, Florence Rose Martin, and her daughter, Darlene Rose Kritzman, were featured at Musée Culturel du Mont-Carmel in Lille, ME. They presented traditional 'complaintes,' or ballads. Florence lives in Lewiston and Darlene lives in Topsham.

The exhibit room featured the story of the Acadians for the summer of 2014. As the season drew to a close, the directors were already planning the theme of the exhibit room for 2015. The one idea that rose to the top was about celebrating our town fathers, from Joseph Boucher, the 1st Selectman to the present town manager, Christy Sirois.

We had a very busy summer. The season is so brief to showcase the collection of artifacts and photographs. We are open from mid-June to mid-September. As you can see from the 2014 Acquisition List, we received many new "old" items. We look forward to another season and we hope that you will take the time to come visit the historical site.
