Recipe for using electricity more efficiently for cooking.

Use flat-bottomed pans. The flatter the pan, the better the contact with the electric unit. Be sure the pans have tight-fitting lids to reduce cooking time and moist ture loss. Match





Reduce cooking time by thawing meats before cooking them. When recipes call for a preheated oven, don't turn it on too far in advance usually 10 to 15 minutes will do. Plan one-dish meals that can be cooked in a port-able electric appliance such as a skiller, deep fat fryer. Dutch oven or crock pot.

For toasting bread, use a toaster or portable toaster-oven instead of your range oven. The smaller appliances are more efficient for this job.




















Wisdom's 1983 Commencement Program
