try it out.



The music was performed by our favorites — ZIG ZAG with Dave Lizotte at the helm, and our osn John Nadeau (Senior) on bass.




Margit Studio's was also present. They offered opportunities for formal pictures as well as candids in the dance hall.

All in all, it was a very satisfying event, filled with good feelings, laughter and a sense of communityness among students and friends. We hope to have a repeat performance next year.










The Heart of Wisdom





Wow! Was this carnival different! What else can it be when you have the theme "That's Incredible."


