ter, our willingness to succeed, and our academic and athletic abilities.



What the future holds in store for us is unknown, but a quick survey reveals that many will further their education into the law, medical, and business fields.





# PIONEERS GO EASTERN MAINE! A BANNER YEAR FOR BOY'S BASKETBALL

























# DIMENT GET ANY DIMENTS
