today.

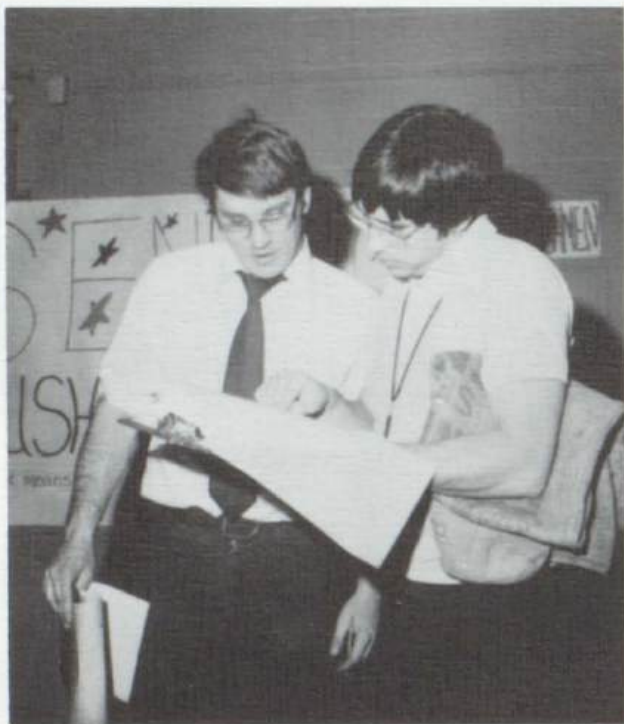

DAWN OF A NEW TOMORROW

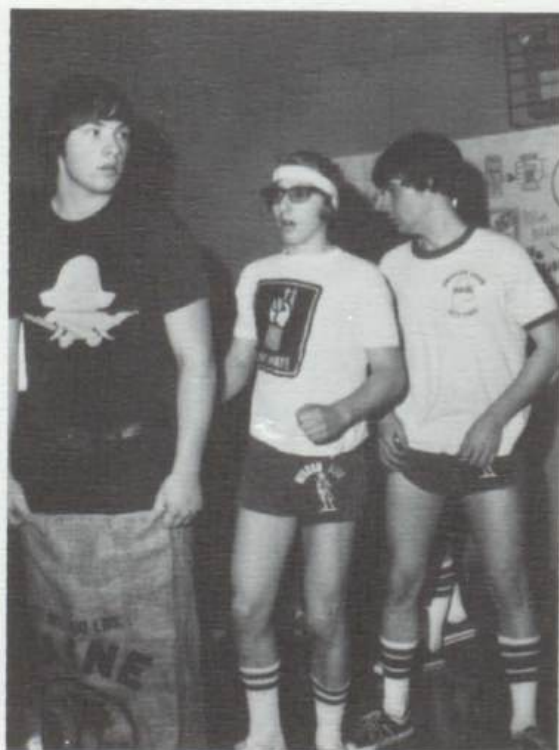
Somewhere in an endless expanse,

A BRIGHTER TOMORROW



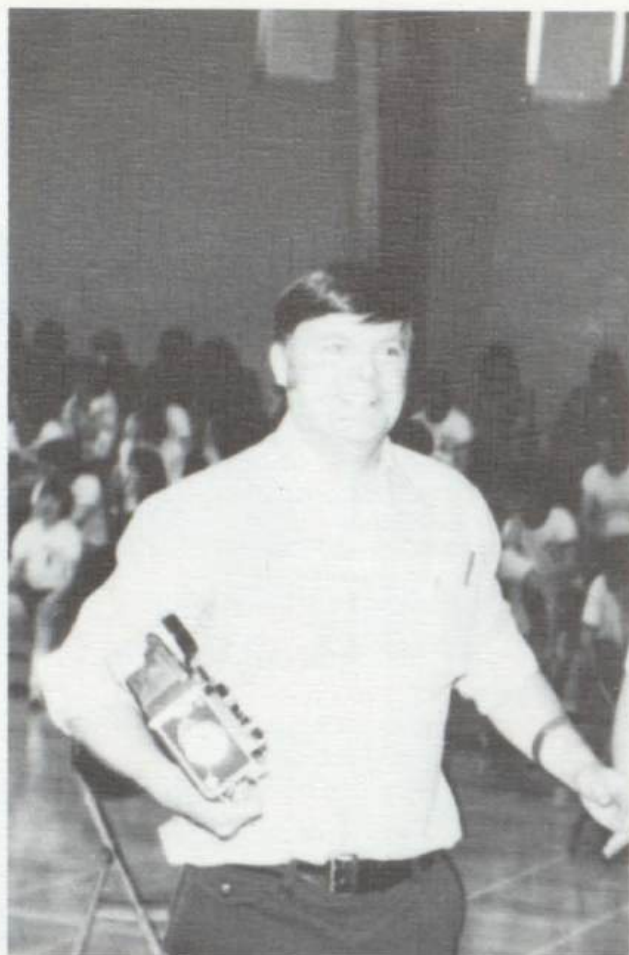
The future is a time

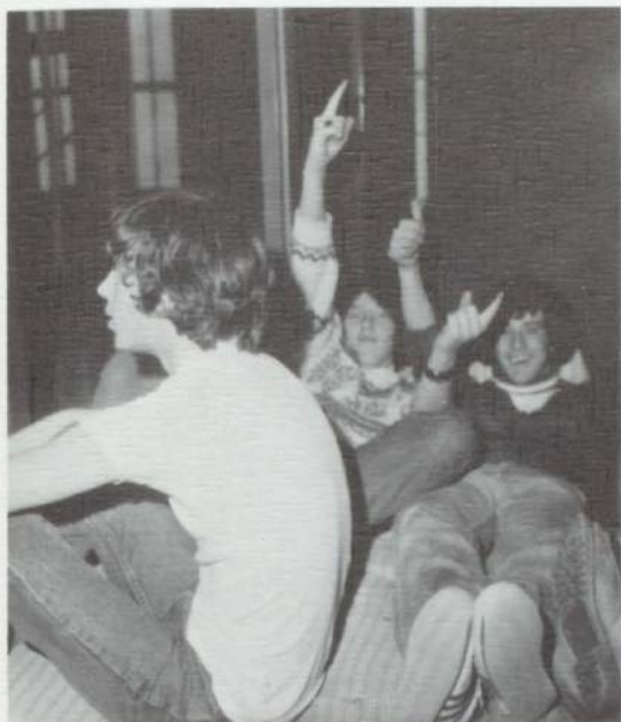

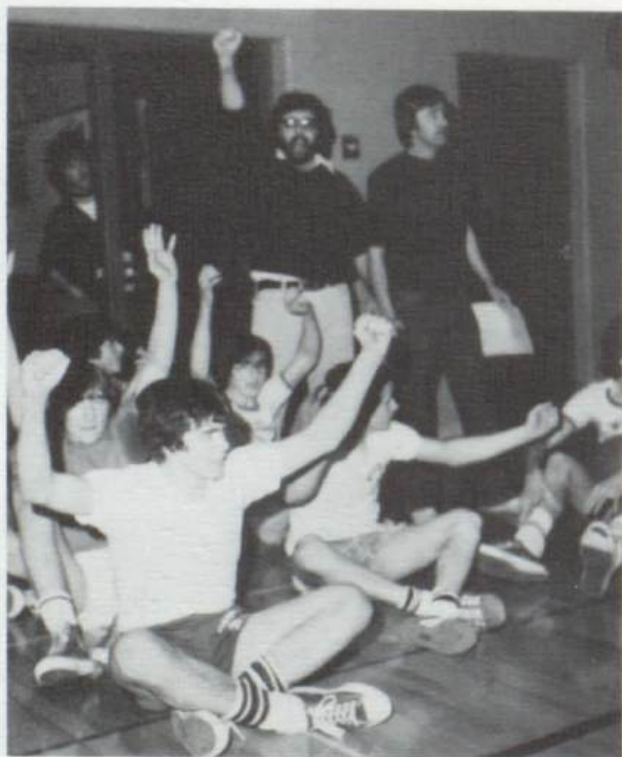

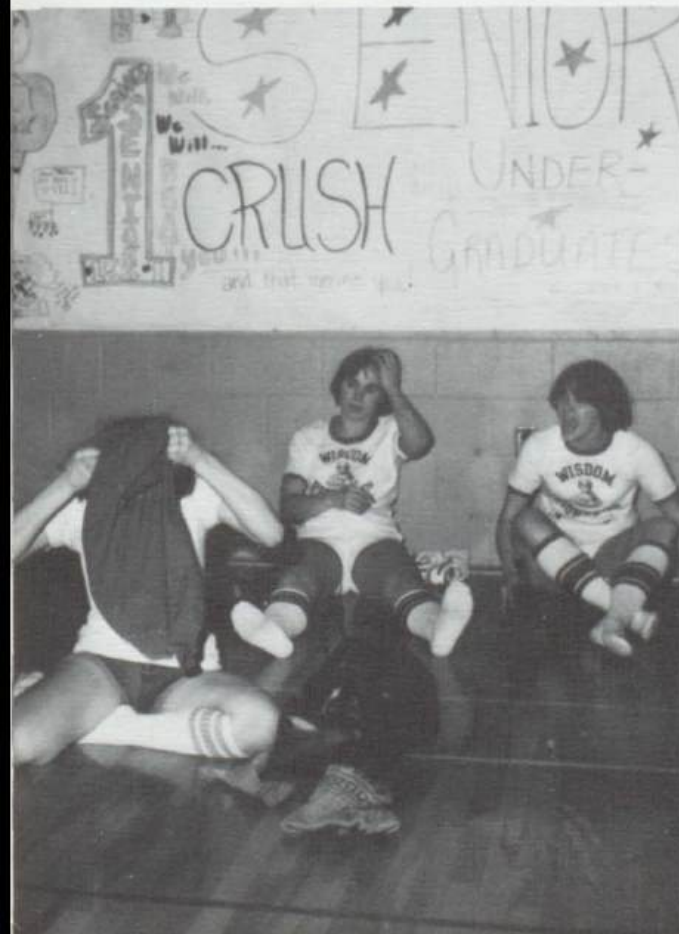




SHADOWS OF MY FUTURE

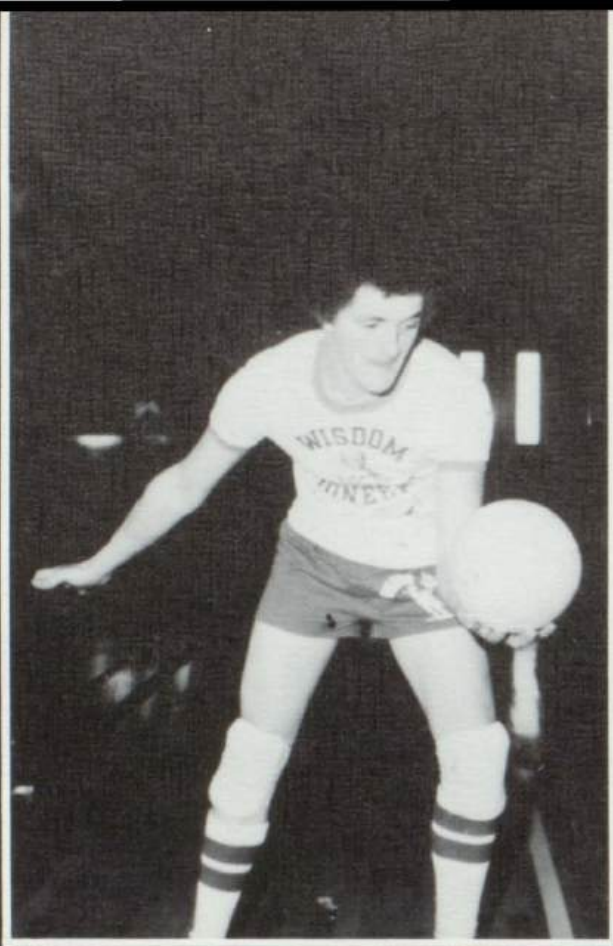

Time has passed almost unseen before our eyes.

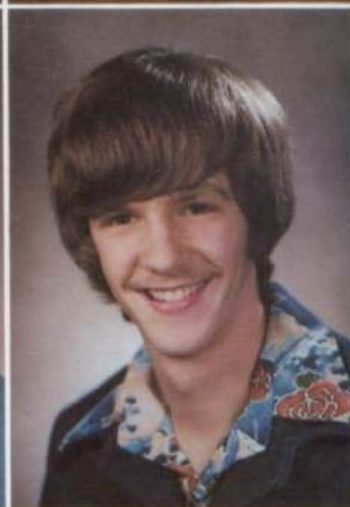
We can cherish only the wavering glimpses

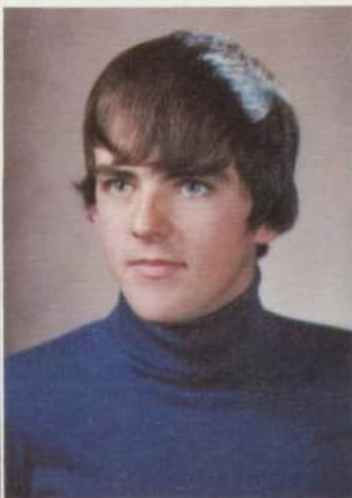

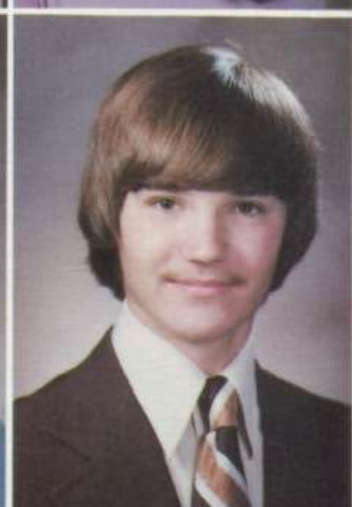


SHADOWS OF THE FUTURE

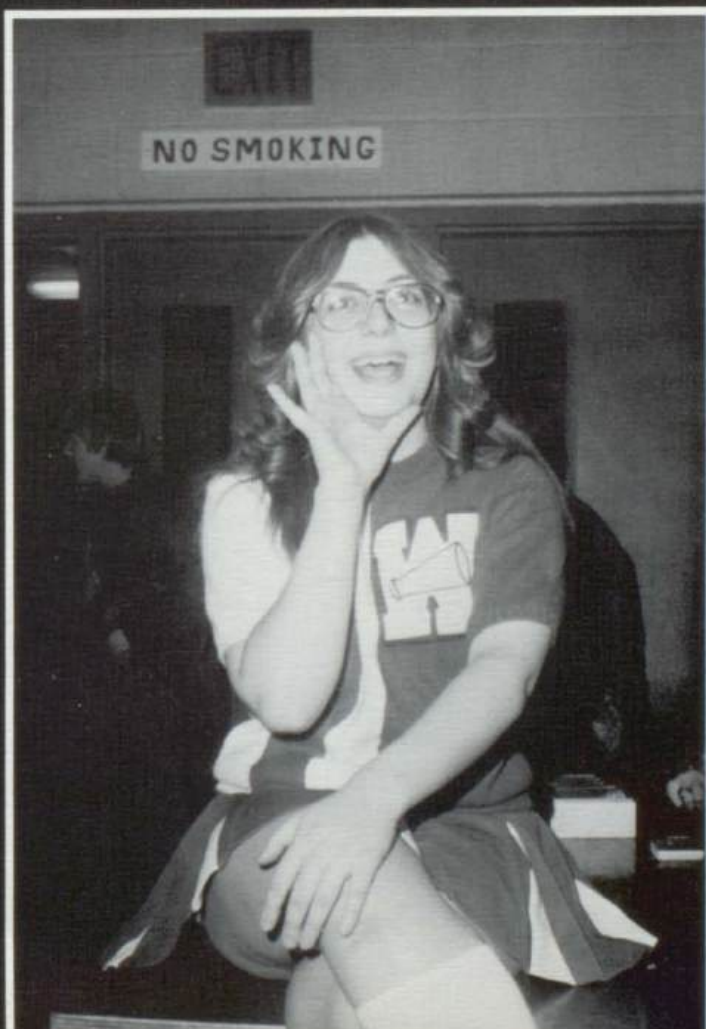


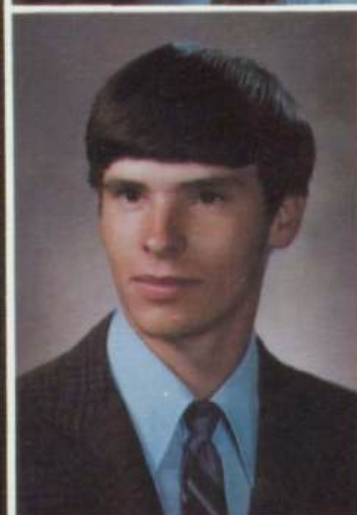
THE ROAD OF THE FUTURE

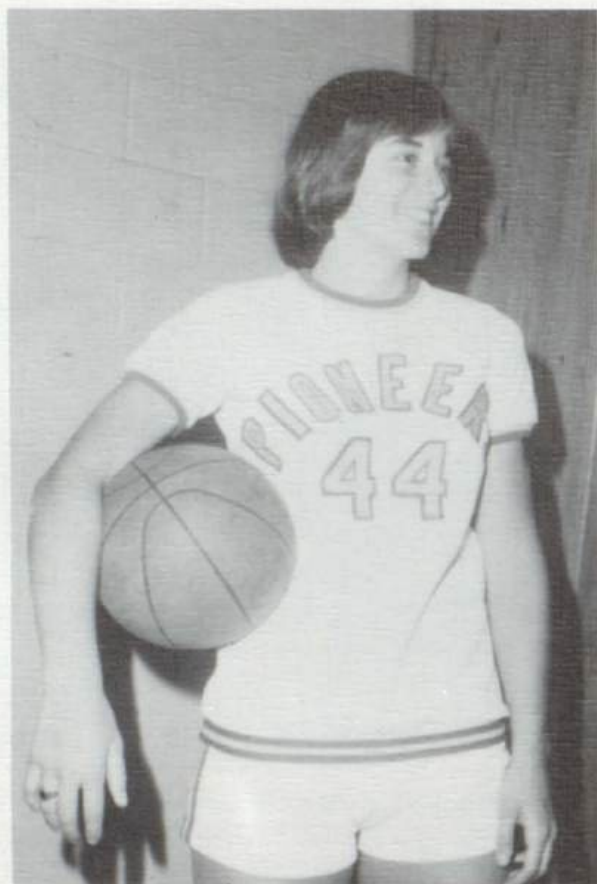


THE WISDOM SOFTBALL TEAM
