



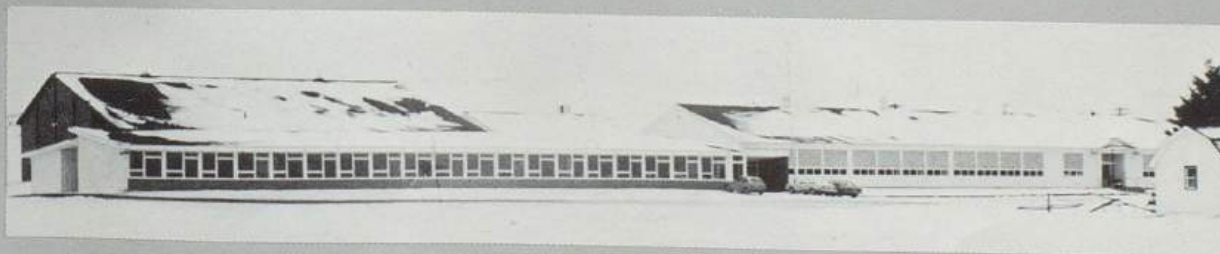




The students of Wisdom High School (the heart of PIONEER Country) welcome everyone to join them in their journey through HORIZONS.

Reaching that new horizon is our hope and goal.

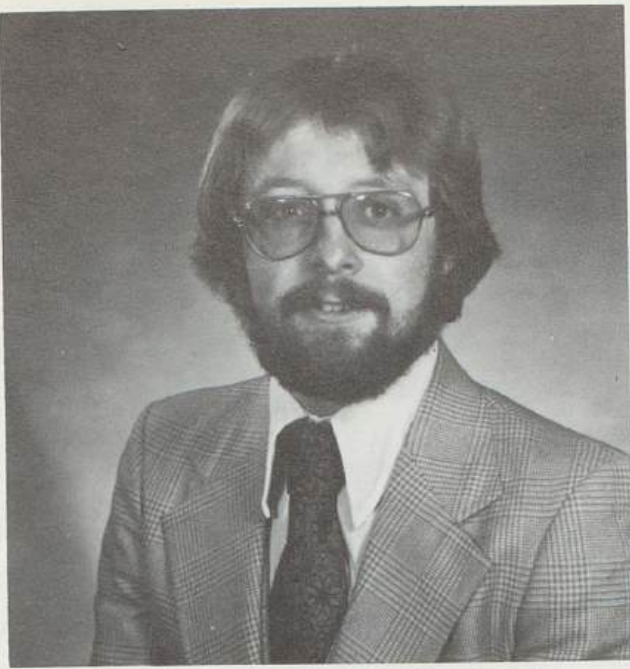




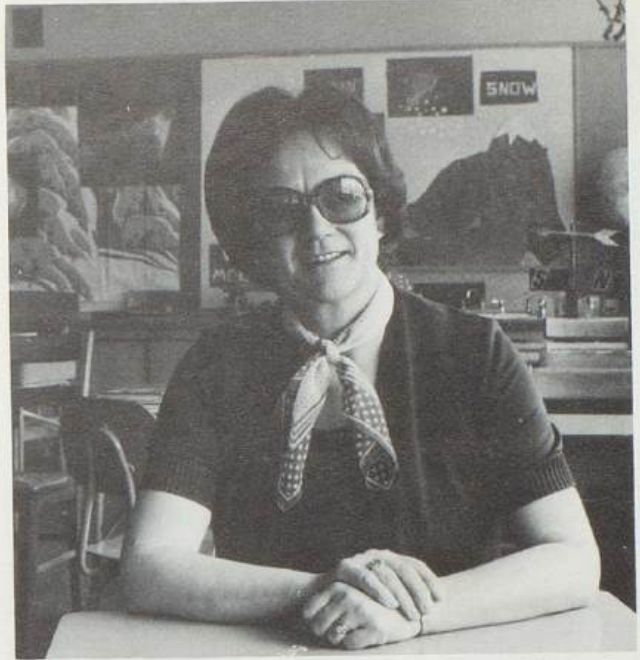

as I wanted.

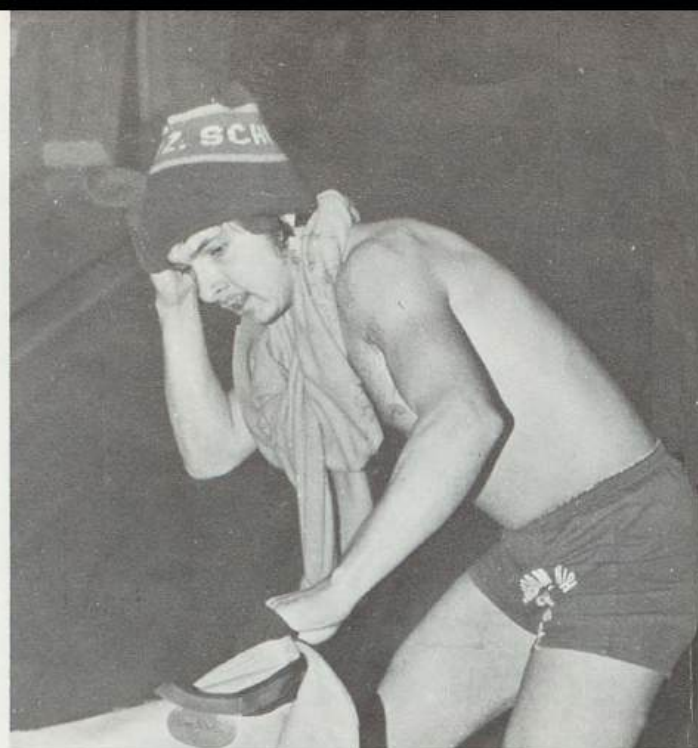
