Class	Fruit / Veg / Flowers	Description
Class 1	Potatoes - white	1 dish of 5. Plate provided.
Class 2	Potatoes - coloured	1 dish of 5. Plate provided.
Class 3	Leeks	1 dish of 2.
Class 4	Leeks (Pot)	1 dish of 2.
Class 5	Onions (up to 250g)	1 dish of 3. Each onion must not exceed 250g. Plate provided.
Class 6	Onions (over 250g)	1 dish of 3. Each onion must exceed 250g. Plate provided.
Class 7	Onions - heaviest	1 exhibit of 1.
Class 8	Onions - spring	1 dish of 6. Plate provided.
Class 9	Shallots	1 dish of 6. To be presented on dish of sand. Plate provided.
Class 10	Parsnips	1 dish of 3. Tops trimmed to 76mm (3in) approx. Plate provided.
Class 11	Beetroot - round	1 dish of 3. Tops trimmed to 76mm (3in) approx. Plate provided.
Class 12	Beetroot - cylindrical	1 dish of 3. Tops trimmed to 76mm (3in) approx. Plate provided.
Class 13	Cauliflower	1 dish of 1. Any variety. Root stem trimmed to 76mm (3in) approx.
Class 14	Cabbage	1 dish of 1. Any variety. Root stem trimmed to 76mm.
Class 15	Carrots - short (under 6 inches)	1 dish of 3. Tops trimmed to 76mm (3in) approx. Plate provided.
Class 16	Carrots - long (over 6 inches)	1 dish of 3. Tops trimmed to 76mm (3in) approx. Plate provided.

Class 17	Cucumbers	1 dish of 1.
Class 18	Tomatoes - cherry	1 dish of six (variety must be specified on the display label).
Class 19	Tomatoes - medium	1 dish of 5. (variety must be specified on the display label).
Class 20	Tomatoes - large	1 dish of 3 (variety must be specified on the display label).
Class 21	Tomatoes - truss	25% or more to be ripe.
Class 22	Pepper - sweet	1 dish of 2. Plate provided.
Class 23	Pepper - hot	1 dish of 6. Plate provided.
Class 24	Lettuce	1 dish of 1. Plate provided.
Class 25	Courgettes	1 dish of 3. 150mm (6in) long approx. Plate provided.
Class 26	Beans - runner	1 exhibit of 6. Presented on black cloth. Cloth provided.
Class 27	Beans - French	1 exhibit of 6. Presented on black cloth. Cloth provided.
Class 28	Beans - longest	1 exhibit of 1. Presented on black cloth. Cloth provided.
Class 29	Peas	1 dish of 6. Plate provided.
Class 30	Marrow - heaviest	1 exhibit of 1.
Class 31	Rhubarb	3 sticks, leaves removed.
Class 32	Herbs	3 named varieties. Presented in a vase.
Class 33	Pumpkin - heaviest	1 exhibit of 1.
Class 34	Funny veg and caption	1 veg and caption.
Class 35	Flowers - mixed vase	Vase of mixed flowers.
Class 36	Flowers - vase of four	Vase of 4 exhibits, 3 stems of each.
Class 37	Best tray of veg - max 6 veg	One of each of up to 6 different types of vegetable allowed. Tray provided.
Class 38	Best tray of specified veg	5 potatoes, 2 leeks, 3 onions (must not exceed 250g), 4 beetroot, 5 medium tomatoes.
Class 39	Apples	Plate of 4. Plate provided.
Class 40	Pears	Plate of 4. Plate provided.
Class 41	Bowl / basket of fruit	
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Class 42	Sunflower - tallest	Measured in situ on plot.
Class 43	Best in show	-

Rules for the Vegetable Competition

- 1. Staging of entries shall take place between 10:30 am and 12:30pm.
- 2. Judging will commence at 1pm
- 3. Exhibitors must collect staging tickets from the Show Secretary's table on arrival. These are to be placed face down with each exhibit.
- 4. As far as possible, exhibits should be named: but any incorrect names, or omissions, will not disqualify the entry.
- 5. The judge's decision shall be final. Judges are empowered to withhold awards where exhibits in a class are considered to be of insufficient merit.
- 6. Whilst every precaution will be taken to safeguard exhibits, the Association cannot be held responsible for loss or damage.
- 7. Exhibitors are only allowed one entry per class.
- 8. Points towards the Show Champion will be awarded as follows: $1^{st} 4$ points: $2^{nd} 2$ points: $3^{rd} 1$ point.
- 9. Any exhibitor protesting against any exhibit, or exhibitor, must do so in writing to the Show Secretary with a deposit of £1; no later than 2 hours after the show opens for viewing. Should the protest not be admitted in the opinion of the Committee, the deposit will be forfeited.
- 10. Any matters not provided for in these rules, and any questions of interpretation, shall be referred to the Committee: whose decision will be final.
