2022 was yet another year of transition for the ELF. Camille DiSanza stepped down as Director of the EFL and Casey Westby was appointed replacement Director. The Board and staff alike would like to thank Camille DiSanza for her hard work and dedication as the Director of the EFL from 3/2020 – 6/2022. We would especially like to commend Camille on her leadership throughout the pandemic, a challenging time for us all. We brought on a new member of staff in July, Benga Quick. Benga has jumped right in offering new ideas and programing and quickly became a valuable member of our team. The board voted to onboard new Trustee, Kathy Wood, as well.

If you haven't already noticed, the staff continues to work hard to make updates throughout our building, both ascetically and with our rotating displays. Our entire interior was painted, new shelving & display furniture was purchased, and new LED lighting was installed throughout the entire building. Thank you to the Village of Elbridge Board for working with us to make many of our updates happen and including us in their grant awarded funding. In the new year we are again requesting the exterior of the building be painted. In the coming months we will be steam cleaning our carpets, refinishing the stone floor, and having the windows professionally cleaned.

One of our goals for the year would be to team up with the Elementary school to hopefully ignite interest in the library within the children of the community. We are saddened as library staff members and as parents that the library within EE is not fully functional at this time. In year's past we have offered meet & greet opportunities with our librarians (and our tortoise Franklin!), on-site storytelling, in-school library card sign-ups and outreach tables at school events. We'd love to see some of these events make a comeback. We are currently in communication with JEDI to make some of these things happen.

On February 23, 2022, Assemblyman John Lemondes presented Board President Kathy Long with a check for \$3000. Elbridge Free Library was one of many Libraries to receive funding secured by New York State Assemblyman William Barclay. Assemblyman Barclay recognizes how essential libraries are to their communities. Funding will go towards supplies, programming for children and adults, materials, subscriptions, classes, passes, and general improvements. The EFL prides itself on constantly reinventing how the community sees modern-day libraries, in addition to using our space as a community center, of sorts.
