

What is this workshop about?

This workshop was about arts-based research and how it can be inclusive. The presenters showed examples of arts-based research and explained how to do it. The workshop participants got to practice arts-based research through an art activity.





This workshop helped participants learn about inclusive arts-based research. Inclusive arts-based research allows researchers to answer research questions in creative and inclusive ways.

Workshop participants practiced their inclusive arts-based research skills by making art and discussing what they made.

How did they do the workshop at PARN?

Workshop participants used their new skills in an art activity and reflected on what they can learn from creative research activities.



Participants were given art supplies so they could draw or make collages. The presenters asked the participants three questions to think about while they made their art.

- 1. If you were to use a colour to describe your week at PARN, what colour would that be
- 2. If your experience at research camp was an animal, what would it be?
- 3. If your experience at research camp was a song or a game, what would it be?



After everyone was done making art, the presenters asked questions about what people learned. People can participate in arts-based research in many creative ways that support different forms of expression.
