## The Crossing and Other Planning News

Plans for our **light controlled pedestrian crossing** are progressing and we expect the proposals to go to public consultation very soon. Yes, it's really happening! The cost of the whole project is covered by the Section 106 payment from Redcliffe Homes in respect of the 35 house development at Brooks Close so should not be vulnerable to the difficult financial position of South Gloucester Council.

Groundshore Ltd acquired and then developed the former **Crosshands Garage** site (opposite the AckAck yard on the A46) which had for many years been used as a scrapyard. Despite being within the Cotswolds Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty this was done without planning permission and the perimeter fencing and hardstanding apparently encroached onto the highway land. There followed a retrospective planning application (P23/01430/F) and much toing and frowing before a final decision in October '25. Permission was granted for a revised plan in which the roadside boundary of the site is moved back from the road, the northern access is closed, access and visibility splays are improved, lighting amended and a detailed planting scheme to mitigate the visual injury is agreed with the SGC. These steps are required to be made within 6 months of the decision so we look forward to things happening soon. *Chris Anderson*
