In September, Sarah Weaver, a holistic therapist gave us an interesting talk on Reflexology and one lucky member had a very relaxing foot massage whilst Sarah told us all about the different reflex points. She also spoke about

'Ayurveda' which is a Hindu system of health that looks at the prevention of disease through lifestyle and diet.



We had a very tasty and interesting meeting in October. Manisha shared with us some of her traditional Sri Lankan recipes, using a range of spices brought back from Sri Lanka. She delighted us with Kiri Bath, a traditional coconut milk rice dish, usually kept for special events, weddings, birthdays and the first day of the month! This was followed by a spicy tomato fry, rich with turmeric, chilli, cinnamon and served with Mallum, a warm coconut and kale 'salad', and a red lentil Dhal.

Some of our members went on a tour of Arnos Vale Cemetery. What a fascinating place! We had a guided tour about some very inspirational women who shaped the future of Bristol and we admired their fabulous memorial sculptures. I recommend a visit: 45 acres of spectacular Victorian Garden Cemetery, not to mention a very good café and a delightful shop. There was plenty of parking on site too.

Our next meeting will be our AGM, where our new committee will be elected. Also, one of our members will be telling us all about the important role she plays working for the NHS at Southmead Hospital and what that entails.

The book club this month is reading 'Birdcage Walk' by Helen Dunmore. It's an historical thriller set in Bristol at the

time of the French Revolution, reviewed as a 'captivating and thought provoking 'novel. We shall see what our book club think of it!

SWaN (Sodbury Wildlife and Nature)

As part of a South Glos initiative to develop a 'river of wildflowers', SWaN volunteers recently assisted with the creation of a pollinator superhighway. It will join the local parishes of Sodbury, Dodington and Yate, by the planting of numerous cowslips, snake's head fritillaries, aconites, wood anemones, crocuses and cyclamen at various locations in and around Sodbury.
