The Village Hall Ash Tree

For some months the Village Hall Committee has been concerned about the safety of the Ash tree in the car park.

Some of you may remember that a few years back, it dropped a huge branch.

Fortunately, this happened early in the morning and no-one was hurt.

The Committee had planned to have the tree simply cut back but having sought advice from a number of local arboriculturists and

tree surgeons, we have learnt that not only is the tree showing early signs of Ash Dieback, but that cutting it back will increase its risk of attracting more of the disease and thus the likelihood that it will need to be completely cut down within three to five years is very high.

Reluctantly, and for the reasons of safety, we have made the decision to have the tree cut down to ground level sooner rather than later. We intend to plant new trees in its place.

Sodbury Woodland and Nature Update

As we welcome the New Year, there's a lot happening in our woodland, orchard and beyond. Here's a brief update on the exciting initiatives and projects shaping our natural spaces.

Woodland and Orchard Renewal With an eye on sustainability, we are set to replace 2 trees in the Orchard and starting woodland management by carefully removing guards from dead



trees and replacing where necessary to ensure that the vibrant life of the green haven continues.

Deer dilemma in the wood Nature comes with its challenges and Roe Deer have been nibbling our shrubs .Whilst this can encourage bushy growth, it also poses a threat to the establishment of these plants. To strike a balance we are introducing larger guards especially for species like Hazel and Spindle, offering protection and fostering their growth.

Sodbury Common Field Project Over on the Sodbury Common field we have plans to enhance the landscape further. Our focus includes tree planting, with an ambition to introduce hedgerow trees, complementing the wildflower meadow that we hope will blossom from seeds and plants planted last October. This holistic approach aims to create a harmonious blend of flora and fauna promoting biodiversity and enriching this previously un-utilised area.

Elsewhere we are supporting some tree planting in a field off Mill Lane, by a footpath, following a grant obtained from the Forest of Avon.
