

#### Sodbury Woodland and Nature

On 7<sup>th</sup> October a number of volunteers joined us to help plant nearly 4,000 native wildflower plants in the field on Sodbury Common. This followed the seeding of what will become a new wildflower meadow on the 14 acre site, supported by a grant from the West of England Combined Authority. Wildflowers are not only a visual delight but also

play a crucial role in supporting local biodiversity. The new meadow will provide essential resources for pollinators, such as bees and butterflies, which, in turn, contribute to the health of our entire ecosystem and in the years to come we can look forward to a vibrant tapestry of colour as these entirely native wildflowers bloom.

Over in the Community Orchard, another exciting development is on the horizon as we are in the process of creating an information board to help visitors identify the different areas and varieties of fruit and nuts found in the orchard, when to pick them, as well as the history of the site.

Finally, we hope to carry out some further tree planting in an area off Mill Lane early in the New Year – look out for updates on the Swan and Old Sodbury community Facebook pages. *Andy Sage-Bell*
