Village Hall News from the Chair, Ian Rowland

On 9th August, for the first time since 2019, the Village Hall Committee held their AGM. The meeting was open to the public, although numbers were limited by summer holidays. The following is a summary of the main points:

Bookings are increasing, since fully re-opening. We have three new groups: a Keep Fit class on Monday evenings, the Govocal choir group on Tuesday mornings and a Kung Fu group on Thursday evenings. There are weekday slots available for afternoons and Tuesday evenings. Bookings for parties also seem to be on the rise, particularly for Children's parties.

The headline work has of course been the new kitchen, the focus of attention for most of the last 3 years. After planning approval in November 2019, we spent the next 18 months raising funds, started work in August 2021 and held our first event in February 2022. The feedback has been overwhelmingly positive and is definitely contributing to an increase in bookings. We were fortunate to secure grants for the bulk of the funds, but it would not have been possible without the many generous donations from individuals. We are enormously grateful to you all.

Other works and investments have included repairs to the main hall floor, the purchase of a contactless card reader, replacement of the hot water cylinder and updates to the website. We hope, shortly, to tidy the area behind the hall, On a longer term 'to do' list are: roof insulation, heating upgrade/replacement, solar PV, replacement front doors, replacement table tops, and possibly Wifi.

Sodbury Woodland and Nature (S.W.a.N) The hot, dry summer has taken its toll on the young trees, particularly where the subsoil has been brought to the surface and compacted by heavy machines. We estimate we have lost 10-20%. So on September 18th 9am onwards we will be going through marking the tree shelters of those which have died. We would be grateful for any help you can give us in doing this. See Sodbury Woodland and Nature Facebook page for details.

The fruit trees, planted early last winter have survived well. With the aid of considerable help from Michelle Dash, through the summer, we have been producing individual labels for the fruit. These ceramic tiles will tell you which are cider apples, how to find your favourite tasting pear, allow you to see the difference between a damson and plum, and tell you what a Medlar is. Many thanks go to Michelle for patiently guiding us volunteers through the production process. (More details of Michelle's studio are on page 2). We hope to put these labels on the trees also on September 18th



This winter we will have a lot more tree planting to do. In addition to planting up where trees have died, we have several local sites in the planning process. With the aid of residents from Chapel Lane, we hope to plant along the southern side of the approach track. In time this will help screen the Network Rail overhead gantries. The Elizabeth II Jubilee Avenue will be extended to 29 trees; it would be nice to make it 35 one tree for every 2 years of her reign. Telephone 01454 310540 for further details.
